Dr. White, having been notified, appeared before the Board and accepted the Clerkship and proceeded to the office of the Clerk of Courts where he was duly sworn in.

The Board then proceeded to the election of a chief chief for the ensuing year and upon the first ballot resulted as follows:

Resolves by the Board of Education of Jackson Township Rural School District Union County Ohio that it is necessary for the proper accommodation of the schools of said district that a new Central High School Building be erected in said district; that it will require \$20,000 to make said improvement; that the funds at disposal of said Board or that can be raised under the provisions of sections 5649-1-2-3 and 7591-7592, 7629 and 7630 and other cognate sections of the General Code of Ohio are not sufficient to accomplish said purpose and that a bond issue is necessary; it is therefore further resolved that a special election be held on the 16 day of February 1915 in said school district on the question of the issuing of bonds in the sum of \$20,000 for the purpose herein specified and that the Clerk of the Board be directed to forward a certified copy of these resolutions to the Deputy State Supervisors of Elections and request said supervisors to provide election supplies and conduct said election and that the Clerk be also directed to publish the notices of said election as provided by law.

Sealed bids were opened for the furnishing ballots for the Centralization election in Paris Township and the Tribune Publishing Co. being the lowest bidder was awarded the contract in accordance with the provisions of the law.
