328 Marion Countians Warned By Prosecutor


MARION, OHIO, MARCH 22 .- (A) .-A total of 328 persons who have been candidates for offices in Marion county during the past two years have been notified by Prosecutor Alfred Donithen that they must comply with the law requiring the filing of campaign expense accounts.

Donithen's action followed a ruling from Attorney General Bettman setting forth that candidates who fail to file such accounts are liable to fines of from \$100 to \$500.

The 328 delinquent candidates in Marion county were virtually all defeated aspirants to township, village and school offices during the past two years. Donithen says he believes he delinquencies due to a misunderstanding on the part of the candidates, many of whom incurred no campaign expense. Regardless of this, all candidates must file a statement, he explained.

This is hard to believ after reading "Procedure in Booth" Sec. 4785-209 which without doubt covers this cliam and shows the Penalty for allowing A Balot known to be Fraudently Marked to be placed in the Balot Box , to be not less than One Hundred Dollars etc. This also holds good for permitting or sanction the Counting of Ballots contrary to Law.

Betting is known to be illegal, accordingly this Board goes on record as being opposed to any Election Official placing any Bets on any results from any Election at which they are serving as Officials.

Pains in folding the Ballot for the Voter is just as important as that the Voter use care in refolding correctly according to the Card of Instructions which should be well placed in each Booth. 
