County, Ohio, hereinafter referred to as the Local Public Agency (LPA).

**SECTION I - Project Description**

WHEREAS, the STATE has identified the need for the described project:

improve safety and congestion on US 42 from Monterey Drive to Watkins-California Road and Industrial Parkway by adding turn lanes, and signals.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the \_\_\_\_\_ Representative(s) of \_\_\_\_\_ Union County, Ohio.

**SECTION II - Consent Statement**

Being in the public interest, the LPA gives consent to the Director of Transportation to complete the above described project.

**SECTION III - Cooperation Statement**

The LPA shall cooperate with the Director of Transportation in the above described project as follows:

The LPA agrees to pay project costs of \$1,600,000.

The LPA further agrees to pay One Hundred Percent (100%) of the cost of those features requested by the LPA which are determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration to be unnecessary for the Project.

The LPA further agrees that change orders and extra work contracts required to fulfill the construction contracts shall be processed as needed. The State shall not approve a change order or extra work contract until it first gives notice, in writing, to the LPA. The LPA shall contribute its share of the cost of these items included as a part of the \$1.60 million in accordance with other sections herein.

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SECTION IV - Maintenance

Upon completion of the described Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the LPA shall: (1) provide adequate maintenance for the described Project in accordance with all applicable state and federal law, including, but not limited to, 23 USC 116; (2) provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the described Project; (3) maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and (4) hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

SECTION V - Authority to Sign

The president of said Representative(s) is hereby empowered on behalf of the Union County to enter into contracts with ODOT pre-qualified consultants for the preliminary engineering phase of the Project and to enter into contracts with the Director of Transportation necessary to complete the above described project.

Upon the request of ODOT, the president is also empowered to assign all rights, title, and interests of the Representative(s) to ODOT arising from any agreement with its consultant in order to allow ODOT to direct additional or corrective work, recover damages due to errors or omissions, and to exercise all other contractual rights and remedies afforded by law or equity.

The LPA agrees that if Federal Funds are used to pay the cost of any consultant contract, the LPA shall comply with 23 CFR 172 in the selection of its consultant and the administration of the consultant contract. Further the LPA agrees to incorporate ODOT's "Specifications for Consulting Services" as a contract document in all of its consultant contracts. The LPA agrees to require, as a scope of services clause, that all plans prepared by the consultant must conform to ODOT's current design standards and that the consultant shall be responsible for ongoing consultant involvement during the construction phase of the Project. The LPA agrees to include a completion schedule acceptable to ODOT and to assist ODOT in rating the consultant's performance through ODOT's Consultant Evaluation System.

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Ms. Rayl asked Mr. Stauch where the funds for this project were coming from so she could easily track them for budget purposes. Mr. Stauch stated the total project is \$1.6 million and \$250,000 of that is coming from Jerome Township. The fund this project will be paid out of is the fund Fed-Ex payments are paid in.

Variance Request – Boundary Road

- Mr. Flavell stated he believes the Engineer's Office denied his driveway variance request based on incorrect information. Roughly 30 years ago, he purchased a five-acre lot to build his current residence. The Engineer's Office approved the variance request for the property. He later purchased the vacant five-acre lot directly beside his property.
- In 2008, he filled out paperwork to start having his property taxes paid through escrow. The bank mistakenly combined the two five-acre parcels as one 10 acres parcel. He found this error when he looked at the county's GIS system because he was considering selling his home. His mortgage paperwork also stated the two parcels were combined, but they sent a letter stating there was an error. The Auditor's Office also corrected the error on their end. The Engineer's Office denied the variance request, stating the property was separated after the Access Management Regulations were put in place. He believes the denial was partly based on this, and he has provided proof this is not the case.
- He also stated the decision was based on the traffic count done on Boundary Road and State Route 37, and his property being located at a "minor collector" location. The traffic count was over 400 vehicles, and Mr. Flavell believes that number to be significantly lower than that by his residence. He conducted his own traffic count study using his personal security camera footage during various times of day and found only 103 cars.
- The county informed him he would be required to have a shared driveway, but after looking into that he found the shared driveway would not be possible either. His property has a utility pole and leach field that would prevent him extending and widening his driveway.
- He has traveled to various lots close to his home with newly built homes and measured the driveways distance from the read. He found they were not consistent with what the Engineer's Office denial reasons were.
- Mr. Stauch thanked Mr. Flavell for all his information and insight into the situation. He stated every situation is unique, and every site is a little bit different. The traffic counts are done on separate parts of the road every couple of years, and he feels the 400 is accurate. He will go back and double check those numbers.
- He stated the intersection on Boundary Road and State Route 37 has a flashing light stop sign because of bad accidents in the past, and Mr. Flavell stated there has not been an accident in front of his house.
- Mr. Stauch stated the file for Mr. Flavell's property did not originally have a permit, and the individuals who worked on this property are no longer with the county. When they looked at Mr. Flavell's property, the biggest issue was spacing and consistency. Currently, the county uses surveyors to design layouts for new developers. When Mr. Flavell originally bought his property, this was not the case.
- Commissioner McCarthy asked Mr. Stauch if he would like Mr. Flavell's driveway to match his neighbors across the street.
- Mr. Stauch stated that it is correct, and for simplicity and safety to have them line up and not be staggard.
- Commissioner McCarthy asked Mr. Flavell if he was willing to talk with the Engineer's Office and work something out using their guidelines, and Mr. Flavell stated he would do that.

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- Mr. Stauch stated he would work with Mr. Flavell to come up with a solution for this and would send an employee out to assess the property.

Jeff Stauch, Ashleigh King, and Chester Flavell left the meeting at this time.

Resident Beth Sanders asked to speak to the Commissioners about affordable home ownership in Union County.

She provided the following handout to the Commissioners:

Good morning county commissioners,

Let me share a quick story as a begin. Jeff and I first had a house just north of campus in Columbus in the Clintonville neighborhood. We sold it, made a profit, and moved to Marysville in 1998 before our second child was born. We bought this great house on Bellville Road, between Dog Leg and Raymond Road for \$149,900 for a 3 bedroom, 2 bath, 1,500 sq ft home on 5 acres. I remember that my husband, Jeff, said, "Let's stay under \$150,000." Back at that time, houses in Mill Valley sold in the \$160,000s or \$170,000s. One thing that was great about the mortgage on our home was that it was possible for us to live on one income, and that is what we did for a very long time as we started a business, LifeBio, based here in Marysville. That business now employs 20 people and most live in the local area. If we were unable to live on one income, that business would not have started.

We live in a capitalistic system in the USA. One of the most promising ways people can get ahead in America is investing in a home. Over time, that home goes up in value, and it allows a couple or small family to sell it, make a profit, and invest in a larger home. OR that family chooses to stay in that home which may suit their needs for a lifetime; they may like a smaller home and see no need for any upgrades.

The average home price in Union County according to Redfin is \$400,000 as of Jan 22, 2025. On a \$400,000 home, a buyer would need to save up \$80,000 for a 20% downpayment. They would then be paying approximately \$1700 a month as a minimum payment for a 30 year mortgage. I think the downpayment alone makes these homes out of reach for many young singles or couples.

I come to you today with a concern that Union County will need to address the growing need for home ownership to help Union County prosper and continue to be a strong community. So the question is? How do we increase home ownership in Union County, Ohio? Wouldn't we rather see people owning their homes instead of renting for stability and for the good of Union County? Homeowners pay taxes and are important for the future prosperity of Union County. What would make it possible for more people who are renting to have a chance at the American Dream of home ownership?


One important thing that would need to happen is to have a healthy inventory of affordable homes in Union County. It would mean being intentional in Union County for increasing the opportunity for affordable home ownership. When I say affordable, I believe that a home in the \$200,000 to \$250,000 range is affordable as a starter home (and it is affordable as a home purchased in the retirement years). A house or condo in this range allows people to have some flexibility in their lives to have one parent decide to stay home with the children (or possibly work part time), or it allows that couple to have some breathing room to start a business. It also gives that family more of a safety net and less worries about a mortgage payment that is really beyond their means. In addition, these types of homes or condos would allow older adults to decide to leave their "big" home and have somewhere acceptable and affordable to move into. Freeing up additional inventory of country or suburban homes for younger couples with children.

A plan from our county commissioners to increase home ownership would need to address:

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January 22, 2025

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- 1) WHERE -- Determine where there is land, most likely outside the city limits, where an affordable single-family home development could happen as land prices would be more affordable too. Consider land near Milford Center, Richwood, or Unionville Center. Is there an area that needs redeveloped that would be ideal for this project? A pocket neighborhood inside city limits which could be the right size for a small condo building?
- 2) WHAT -- Determine what a community like this should look like. Could it be a mix of single-family homes and condos to accommodate different budgets?
- 3) WHO -- Seek out the right developers for this. They may not be coming to us so Union County would need to go to them and share a vision for homes that people can afford.
- 4) HOW -- To change the zoning to accommodate this type of neighborhood? Small lot sizes -- perhaps narrow lots with access to backyard.
- 5) WHY NOT? Also consider co-housing options---people own their home in a village but share the community center and may eat together and do life together. Search for **Ecovillage Ithaca** to see a FARM/COMMUNITY.... 20 acres is developed and 180 acres is in a land trust. People who live there...farm there...and eat and sell their food. We are a farming community so this is something to wisely consider.







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Ms. Sanders stated the Commissioners need to find developers who are willing to build starter homes and condos for people to buy for \$200,000 to \$250,000, and not just apartment buildings. There has to be incentives for builders to build these homes in Union County.

Commissioner Robinson stated he appreciated her coming to them, but the county has no control on zoning. Zoning is up to the different townships, and she might want to attend township meetings to bring awareness to this topic.

Commissioner McCarthy stated apartment buildings are being built because there is a demand for them. He recommended Ms. Sanders to talk to the Engineer's Office to see what drives the costs for building properties in Union County.

Mr. Narducci stated Franklin County, and the City of Columbus have been pushing for affordable housing in their community. There has to be different types of properties for individuals because not everyone wants to own or rent their home.

Ms. Sanders suggested a design competition for developers to come to Union County and build affordable starter homes.

Commissioner McCartney suggested Ms. Sanders to contact Ashley Gaver, City Planner, for the City of Marysville.

**AON Loss Ratio Report**

- Union County had an Overall Loss Ratio of 106.7%
- There were 3 claimants that exceeded the \$125,000 pooling point, which means \$523,373 will be removed from the county's experience, which will lower the Net Loss Ratio to 97.5%.










The top 5 diagnoses represents 33.8% of the avoidable








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Mr. Grant stated that Ms. Herring is now going to be the benefit specialist for Union County.

Ms. Herring stated the high-cost claimants have started to go down in the last quarter. Commissioner McCarthy asked if the Wellness Program is helping this in the long run.

Ms. Yonak stated that Union County's Wellness enrollment is very high, but you cannot predict high-cost claimants. They can include things you cannot predict like high-risk pregnancies, cardiovascular disease, and cancer to name a few.

Mr. Grant stated Wegovy, Zepbound and Vyvance will no longer be covered for weight loss; however, Ozempic and Mounjaro will still be covered for diabetics. Ms. Yonak stated CEBCO made this change to go into effect in January 2025. The costs for these prescriptions was very high, and was very costly.
