Sheriff's Office Update – Mike Justice:

- He inquired about funds being released from OneOhio for the Paws for Purpose grant, and Ms. Alexander said she would look into this.
- There has been a federal lawsuit filed against two deputies from 2023. He asked what account this deductible should be paid out of, and Mr. Narducci stated each department is responsible for those costs
- Sheriff Justice stated there have been unexpected expenses this year, but he has found money in other funds to move.

Luke Sutton arrived at this time.

- Sheriff Justice has met with the superintendents of Fairbanks and North Union Schools to talk about school resource officers. Currently, Marysville Schools and Dublin Schools are paying 50% of the resource officers' salary and benefits, and North Union and Fairbanks are only paying a portion of this. He does not want to pull resources officers out of the schools, but it is not fair other schools are paying more.
- Commissioner Robinson asked if the officers are in the schools every day, and Sheriff Justice stated they are. They will have to look at different options if these schools do not want to pay more.
- The office has been getting inundated with YouTube and Facebook requests for in car and body cam footage. They are going to start charging for these requests.
- Commissioner McCarthy stated there seems to be an increase in spoofing calls, and Sheriff Justice said this is a common scam.
- There are multiple events happening in the month of October. These include a drug take back event, women's firearm classes, Ridge Fest at Glacier Ridge, Walk to School Day, and a Rotary meeting.
- All dispatcher and deputy positions have been filled in the office. Posting on social media has resulted in an increase in applicants.
- He has talked to Northern Union County Fire Department and Jerome Township Fire Department about installing baby boxes. They are interested in these being installed in their buildings. He would like to do fundraising events and ask for donations to pay for these.



ARTICLE 1 AGREEMENT

Section 1.1. Agreement. This Agreement is entered into by and between the Union County Sheriff, hereinafter referred to as the "Employer," and the Fraternal Order of Police, Ohio Labor Council, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "FOP/OLC," on behalf of the employees in the bargaining unit hereinafter defined.

Section 1.2. Purpose. The purpose of this Agreement is to comply with the requirements of Chapter 4117 of the Ohio Revised Code and set forth the full and complete understandings and agreements between the parties governing the wages, hours, terms, and other conditions of employment for those employees included in the bargaining unit as defined herein.

Section 1.3. Severability. Should any part of this Agreement be held invalid by operation of law or by any tribunal of competent jurisdiction, or should compliance with or enforcement of this Agreement be restrained by any such tribunal pending a final determination as to its validity, such invalidation or temporary restraining shall not invalidate or affect the remaining portions hereof or the application of such portions or persons or circumstances other than those to whom or to which it has been held invalid or has been restrained.

In the event of invalidation of any portions of this Agreement by a court of competent jurisdiction, and upon written request by either party, the parties to this Agreement shall meet at mutually agreeable times (not to exceed thirty (30) days) in an attempt to modify the invalidated provisions by good faith negotiations.

Section 1.4. Waiver of Civil Service. In accordance with the provision of ORC Section 4117.10(a), all articles listed in the table of contents of this Agreement are intended to supersede and/or prevail over conflicting and/or additional subjects found in ORC Section 124.01 through 124.56, Section 9.44, 4111.03, and Section 325.19 or any other sections of the Ohio Revised Code in conflict with any provisions herein. It is expressly understood that the Ohio Department of Administrative Services (DAS) and the State Personnel Board of Review (SPBR) shall have no authority or jurisdiction as it relates to employees in the bargaining unit, except as prohibited by Ohio Revised Code 4117.08(B).

Section 1.5. Waiver in Case of Emergency. In cases of emergency declared by the President of the United States, the Governor of the State of Ohio, the Union County Sheriff, or the Federal or State Legislature, such as acts of God or civil disorder, the following conditions of this Agreement may be temporarily suspended by the Employer:

- A. Time limits for the processing of grievances, and
- B. All work rules and/or agreements and practices relating to the assignment of employees.

Upon the termination of the emergency, grievances filed prior to the emergency shall be processed in accordance with the provisions outlined in the grievance procedure of this Agreement and shall

proceed from the point in the grievance procedure to which the grievance(s) had properly progressed prior to the emergency.

Section 1.6. Scope of Bargaining. The parties acknowledge that during the negotiations which resulted in this Agreement, each had the unlimited right to make demands and proposals on any subject matter not removed by law from the area of collective bargaining, and that the entire understandings and agreements arrived at by the parties after the exercise of that right and opportunity are set forth in this Agreement. The provisions of the Agreement constitute the entire agreement between the Employer and the FOP/OLC and all prior agreements and policies, either oral or written, are hereby canceled. Therefore, the Employer and the FOP/OLC, for the life of this Agreement, each voluntarily and unequivocally waive the right, and each agree that the other shall not be obligated to bargain collectively or individually with respect to any subject or matter referred to or covered in the Agreement.

Section 1.7. Sanctity of Agreement. Unless otherwise specifically provided in this Agreement, no changes in this Agreement shall be negotiated during its duration unless there is written accord by and between the parties hereto to do so. Any negotiated changes, to be effective and incorporated in this Agreement, must be in writing and signed by the parties.

ARTICLE 2 RECOGNITION

Section 2.1. Recognition. The Employer recognizes the FOP/OLC as sole and exclusive representative for the purpose of negotiating wages, hours, terms, and conditions of employment for those employees of the Employer in the bargaining unit. Wherever used in this Agreement, the term "bargaining unit" shall be deemed to include those individuals employed full-time and part-time (regularly scheduled twenty [20] hours or more per week, but not more than thirty-two [32] hours per week) by the Employer in the classification of Dispatcher as certified by the Ohio State Employment Relations Board on November 4, 1999 (Case Number 99-REP-10-0235).

<u>Section 2.2. Exclusions.</u> All positions and classifications not specifically established as being in the bargaining unit shall be excluded from the bargaining unit, including part-time employees regularly scheduled less than twenty (20) hours per week.

<u>Section 2.3.</u> Representation Requirements. The FOP/OLC recognizes that an inherent responsibility exists as sole and exclusive agent to represent all bargaining unit employees, regardless of an employee's status as a member or non-member of the FOP/OLC.

Section 2.4. New Positions. In the event that a new position is created within the Sheriff's Office, the Employer shall determine whether the new position will be included in or excluded from the bargaining unit and shall so advise the FOP/OLC. If there is any dispute as to the Employer's determination of bargaining unit status, the parties will meet to attempt to resolve their disagreement. If the parties agree on the determination, it shall be implemented as agreed. If the parties still do not agree, the Employer may implement its determination, subject to challenge by the FOP/OLC, through the State Employment Relations Board.

ARTICLE 3 DUES DEDUCTION

<u>Section 3.1.</u> <u>Dues Deductions</u>. The Employer and the FOP/OLC agree that membership in the FOP/OLC is available to all employees specified as being in the bargaining unit.

The Employer agrees to deduct regular FOP/OLC membership dues and any fees or assessments implemented by the FOP/OLC from the pay of any employee eligible for membership in the FOP/OLC, and upon the individual employee voluntarily signing and submitting a written authorization for dues deduction. The employee accepting membership will sign the Payroll Deduction Authorization Form along with a duplicate to be submitted to the Payroll Officer. Upon receipt of the proper authorization form, the Auditor will deduct FOP/OLC dues from the employee's payroll check for the pay period following the pay period in which the authorization was received and in which dues are normally deducted by the Employer. Monthly dues shall be rounded up to the nearest cent and one-half (½) of the monthly dues shall be deducted from the first pay period of each month and one-half (½) the second pay period. The Payroll Deduction Authorization Form, Appendix A, shall be provided by the Employer through the Payroll Officer.

Section 3.2. Indemnification. The Employer assumes no obligation, financial or otherwise, arising out of this article. The FOP/OLC agrees to indemnify and hold the Employer harmless from any claims, actions, or proceedings by any employee arising from deductions made by the Employer hereunder. It shall be the responsibility of the employee to obtain appropriate refunds from the FOP/OLC.

Section 3.3. Termination of Deductions. The Employer shall be relieved from making such "check-off" deductions upon termination of employment, transfer to a job other than one covered by the bargaining unit, layoff from work, unpaid approved leave of absence, or revocation of the check-off authorization.

<u>Section 3.4. Limitation of Deductions.</u> The Employer shall not be obligated to make ducs, fces, or assessment deductions of any kind from any employees who, during any dues month involved, shall have failed to receive sufficient wages to equal the deductions.

Section 3.5. Error in Deductions. It is agreed that neither the employees nor the FOP/OLC shall have a claim against the Employer for errors in the processing of deductions. If a claim of error is made to the Employer, in writing within sixty (60) days after the date such error is claimed to have occurred, and it is found an error was made, the error will be corrected at the next pay period that FOP/OLC dues are normally deducted, by deducting the proper amount from the pay of the employee to correct said error. Payroll collection of dues, fees, and assessment shall be authorized for the exclusive bargaining agent only, and not for any other organization attempting to represent the employees within the bargaining unit as herein determined.

Section 3.6. Correction of Deductions. Deductions provided for in this article are subject to the review of the County Auditor as required by the statute. In the event a deduction is not made for any FOP/OLC member during a particular month, the Employer, upon written verification of the

FOP/OLC, will make the appropriate deduction from the following pay period if the deduction does not exceed the total of two (2) months' regular dues. The Employer will not deduct more than two (2) months' regular dues from the pay of any FOP/OLC member at any one (1) time.

Section 3.7. Certification of FOP/OLC. The rate at which dues are to be deducted shall be certified to the Payroll Clerk by an official of the FOP/OLC at such times during the term of this Agreement as is necessary to be accurate. A one (1) month advance notice must be given the Payroll Clerk prior to any changes in an individual's dues deduction.

Section 3.8. Remitting Deductions. The Employer agrees to furnish the FOP/OLC once each calendar month, a warrant in the aggregate amount of the dues and fees deducted for that calendar month, together with a listing of the employees for whom said deductions are made. All dues and fees collected under this article shall be paid by the Employer within thirty (30) days to the FOP/OLC at 222 East Town Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-4611. Once the funds are remitted to the FOP/OLC, their disposition thereafter shall be the sole and exclusive obligation and responsibility of the FOP/OLC.

ARTICLE 4 MANAGEMENT RIGHTS

<u>Section 4.1.</u> <u>Management Rights.</u> The Employer reserves all the customary rights, privileges, or authority of management, except as modified by the express terms of this Agreement, including but without limiting to the following:

- A. The right to manage its affairs efficiently and economically, including the determination of quantity, quality, frequency, and type of services to be rendered; the determination, purpose, and control of the types and numbers of materials, machines, tools, and equipment to be used; the selection of the location, number, and type of facilities and installations; and the additional discontinuance of any services, facilities, equipment, materials, or methods of operation;
- B. The right to determine starting and quitting times, work schedules, and the number of hours to be worked, including overtime, lunch, coffee breaks, rest periods, and clean-up time; and to determine the amount of supervision necessary;
- C. The right to determine the method or process by which work is performed; the right to contract, subcontract, and purchase any or all work, processes, or services; to adopt, revise, enforce, or delete working rules and carry out cost control and general improvement programs;
- D. The right to establish, change, combine, or discontinue job classifications and prescribe and assign job locations and relocations and job duties, content, and classification, and establish wage rates for any new or changed classifications;

All dues and fees collected under this article shall be paid by the Employer within thirty (30) days to the FOP/OLC at 222 East Town Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-4611. Once the funds are remitted to the FOP/OLC, their disposition thereafter shall be the sole and exclusive obligation and responsibility of the FOP/OLC.

ARTICLE 4 MANAGEMENT RIGHTS

<u>Section 4.1.</u> <u>Management Rights.</u> The Employer reserves all the customary rights, privileges, or authority of management, except as modified by the express terms of this Agreement, including but without limiting to the following:

- A. The right to manage its affairs efficiently and economically, including the determination of quantity, quality, frequency, and type of services to be rendered; the determination, purpose, and control of the types and numbers of materials, machines, tools, and equipment to be used; the selection of the location, number, and type of facilities and installations; and the additional discontinuance of any services, facilities, equipment, materials, or methods of operation;
- B. The right to determine starting and quitting times, work schedules, and the number of hours to be worked, including overtime, lunch, coffee breaks, rest periods, and clean-up time; and to determine the amount of supervision necessary;
- C. The right to determine the method or process by which work is performed; the right to contract, subcontract, and purchase any or all work, processes, or services; to adopt, revise, enforce, or delete working rules and carry out cost control and general improvement programs;
- D. The right to establish, change, combine, or discontinue job classifications and prescribe and assign job locations and relocations and job duties, content, and classification, and establish wage rates for any new or changed classifications;
- E. The right to establish or continue policies, practices, or procedures for the conduct of the Employer's business and its services to the citizens of Union County and, from time to time, to change or abolish such practices or procedures;

- F. The right to establish training programs and upgrade requirements for employees within the Sheriff's Office;
- G. The right to transfer, promote, lay off, or otherwise relieve employees from duty for lack of work or other reasons;
- H. The right to continue, alter, make, and enforce reasonable rules for the maintenance of discipline; to suspend, demote, discharge, or otherwise discipline employees for just cause; and to take such measures that the Employer may determine is necessary for the orderly and efficient operation of the Employer's business.

<u>Section 4.2.</u> Residual. The FOP/OLC recognizes and accepts that all rights and responsibilities of the Employer not specifically modified by this Agreement shall remain the function of the Employer.

ARTICLE 5 BULLETIN BOARD

<u>Section 5.1.</u> <u>Bulletin Boards.</u> The Employer agrees to provide space for one (1) FOP/OLC bulletin board for all bargaining units in an agreed-upon area of the Employer's facilities.

Section 5.2. Postings. All FOP/OLC notices or other items posted on the bulletin board shall be signed and dated by the FOP/OLC official or associate who is responsible for the posting. It is understood that no material may be posted on the FOP/OLC bulletin board, at any time, which contains the following:

- A. Personal attacks on any other member or any other employee;
- Scandalous, scurrilous, or derogatory attacks upon the Employer or any other governmental units or officials;
- C. Attacks on and/or favorable comments regarding a candidate for public office.

No FOP/OLC-related materials of any kind may be posted anywhere in the Employer's facilities or on the Employer's equipment except on the FOP/OLC bulletin board.

<u>Section 5.3.</u> <u>Notice Removal.</u> Upon the request of the Employer or the Employer's designee, the FOP/OLC shall cause the immediate removal of any material posted in violation of this article.

All items posted on the bulletin board shall be removed within forty-five (45) days of posting.

ARTICLE 6 FOP/OLC REPRESENTATION

Section 6.1. FOP/OLC Representation. Upon reasonable advanced notification, the Employer will grant reasonable access to non-employee and/or employee representatives of the FOP/OLC to

attend meetings or perform duties, to the extent the meetings or duties are specifically allowed by this Agreement.

The Employer shall recognize one (1) employee to act as an associate and two (2) employees as alternates, for the purpose of representation as specifically outlined in this Agreement.

The FOP/OLC agrees that no representative of the FOP/OLC, either employee or non-employee, shall unduly interfere, interrupt, or disrupt the normal work duties of employees. Further, the FOP/OLC agrees not to conduct meetings (bargaining unit, grievance, or committee meetings) involving on-duty employees except to the extent specifically authorized by the Employer.

<u>Section 6.2. FOP/OLC Roster.</u> The FOP/OLC shall provide the Employer a written official roster of its local officers and associate, including the alternates, which is to be kept current at all times by the FOP/OLC and shall include the following:

- A. Name;
- B. Address;
- C. Home telephone number; and
- D. FOP/OLC position held.

No employee shall be recognized as an FOP/OLC representative until the FOP/OLC has presented the Employer with written certification of that person's selection.

<u>Section 6.3. FOP/OLC Release Time.</u> The investigation and writing of grievances shall normally be on non-work time.

The FOP/OLC associate or designee shall be allowed to use sixteen (16) hours of paid time off to attend the Annual FOP/OLC State Training Seminars. Such time off shall be requested in writing at least fourteen (14) days in advance. The Employer shall not withhold permission for the utilization of this time hereunder except in the event of an emergency.

ARTICLE 1 AGREEMENT

<u>Section 1.1. Agreement.</u> This Agreement is entered into by and between the Union County Sheriff, hereinafter referred to as the "Employer," and the Fraternal Order of Police, Ohio Labor Council, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "FOP/OLC," on behalf of the employees in the bargaining unit hereinafter defined.

<u>Section 1.2.</u> <u>Purpose.</u> The purpose of this Agreement is to comply with the requirements of Chapter 4117 of the Ohio Revised Code and set forth the full and complete understandings, and agreements between the parties governing the wages, hours, terms, and other conditions of employment for those employees included in the bargaining unit as defined herein.

<u>Section 1.3.</u> <u>Severability.</u> Should any part of this Agreement be held invalid by operation of law or by any tribunal of competent jurisdiction, or should compliance with or enforcement of this Agreement be restrained by any such tribunal pending a final determination as to its validity, such invalidation or temporary restraining shall not invalidate or affect the remaining portions hereof or the application of such portions or persons or circumstances other than those to whom or to which it has been held invalid or has been restrained.

In the event of invalidation of any portions of this Agreement by a court of competent jurisdiction, and upon written request by either party, the parties to this Agreement shall meet at mutually agreeable times (not to exceed thirty (30) days) in an attempt to modify the invalidated provisions by good faith negotiations.

Section 1.4. Waiver of Civil Service. In accordance with the provision of ORC Section 4117.10(a), all articles listed in the table of contents of this Agreement are intended to supersede and/or prevail over conflicting and/or additional subjects found in ORC Section 124.01 through 124.56, Section 9.44, 4111.03, and Section 325.19 or any other sections of the Ohio Revised Code in conflict with any provisions herein. It is expressly understood that the Ohio Department of Administrative Services (DAS) and the State Personnel Board of Review (SPBR) shall have no authority or jurisdiction as it relates to employees in the bargaining unit, except as prohibited by Ohio Revised Code 4117.08(B).

Section 1.5. Waiver in Case of Emergency. In cases of emergency declared by the President of the United States, the Governor of the State of Ohio, the Union County Sheriff, or the Federal or State Legislature, such as acts of God or civil disorder, the following conditions of this Agreement may be temporarily suspended by the Employer:

- A. Time limits for the processing of grievances, and
- B. All work rules, and/or agreements and practices relating to the assignment of employees.

Upon the termination of the emergency, grievances filed prior to the emergency shall be processed in accordance with the provisions outlined in the grievance procedure of this Agreement and shall

proceed from the point in the grievance procedure to which the grievance(s) had properly progressed prior to the emergency.

Section 1.6. Scope of Bargaining. The parties acknowledge that during the negotiations which resulted in this Agreement, each had the unlimited right to make demands and proposals on any subject matter not removed by law from the area of collective bargaining, and that the entire understandings and agreements arrived at by the parties after the exercise of that right and opportunity are set forth in this Agreement. The provisions of the Agreement constitute the entire agreement between the Employer and the FOP/OLC and all prior agreements and policies, either oral or written, are hereby canceled. Therefore, the Employer and the FOP/OLC, for the life of this Agreement, each voluntarily and unequivocally waive the right, and each agree that the other shall not be obligated to bargain collectively or individually with respect to any subject or matter referred to or covered in the Agreement.

Section 1.7. Sanctity of Agreement. Unless otherwise specifically provided in this Agreement, no changes in this Agreement shall be negotiated during its duration unless there is written accord by and between the parties hereto to do so. Any negotiated changes, to be effective and incorporated in this Agreement, must be in writing and signed by the parties.

ARTICLE 2 RECOGNITION

Section 2.1. Recognition. The Employer recognizes the FOP/OLC as sole and exclusive representative for the purpose of negotiating wages, hours, terms, and conditions of employment for those employees of the Employer in the bargaining unit. Wherever used in this Agreement, the term "bargaining unit" shall be deemed to include those individuals employed full-time by the Employer in the classification of Road Patrol Sergeant as certified by the Ohio State Employment Relations Board on April 30, 1998 (Case Number 98-REP-02-0043), Community Relations Service Sergeants, Detective and Investigation Sergeants, and Corporals as certified by the Ohio State Employment Relations Board on April 30, 1998 (Case Number 98-REP-01-0043).



Section 2.2. Exclusions. All positions and classifications not specifically established as being in the bargaining unit shall be excluded from the bargaining unit.

Section 2.3. Representation Requirements. The FOP/OLC recognizes that an inherent responsibility exists as sole and exclusive agent to represent all bargaining unit employees, regardless of an employee's status as a member or non-member of the FOP/OLC.

Section 2.4. New Positions. In the event that a new position is created within the Sheriff's Office, the Employer shall determine whether the new position will be included in or excluded from the bargaining unit and shall so advise the FOP/OLC. If there is any dispute as to the Employer's determination of bargaining unit status, the parties will meet to attempt to resolve their disagreement. If the parties agree on the determination, it shall be implemented as agreed. If the parties still do not agree, the Employer may implement its determination, subject to challenge by the FOP/OLC, through the State Employment Relations Board.



Transition to Next Generation MyCare

With the passage of the 2024 State of Ohio biennial budget, AAAs in Ohio were mandated to provide LTSS through the Ohio Department of Medicaid (ODM) Fully Integrated Dual Eligible Special Needs Plans (FIDE SNPs) to dual eligible individuals starting in 2026 (Next Generation MyCare). FIDE SNPs will cover Medicare and Medicaid benefits for those individuals who qualify in the current 29 MyCare demonstration counties, and statewide expansion will follow with the expectation to serve over 25,000 older Ohioans.

Optimizing Organizational Structure and Governance


What is a Regional Council of Governments ("RCOG")?

- A RCOG is a public entity created by agreement of 2 or more Ohio political subdivisions under Chapter 167 of the Ohio Revised Code ("R.C.") for the purposes of promoting cooperative arrangements and agreements among its members and between its members and government agencies or private persons or entities, performing functions and duties which its members can perform and addressing problems of mutual concerns.
 - This means RCOGs are public entities generally subject to Ohio's Sunshine and other laws governing public entities, including:
 - The Open Meeting laws under R.C. 121.22; and
 - The Public Record laws under R.C. 149.43.
 - Required to be audited bi-annually by the Auditor of State pursuant to R.C. 117 11
 - Required to annually post its financial statements with the Auditor of State pursuant to R.C. 117.38(B).

- Participation in the Regional Council of Governments will not have a cost to the County

Commissioner McCarthy asked how Union County Senior Services would tie into this COG, and Ms. Ware stated Senior Services currently has a relationship with COAAA. They have received four grants totaling over \$40,000. She feels Union County should join the COG to advocate for Union County needs. If the time comes that there will be dues, they can reevaluate at that time.

Mr. Narducci stated that having a seat at the table in the COG would give Union County a voice. Especially if the conversation for dues would arise.

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UNION COUNTY COMMISSIONERS JOURNAL 2025 October 8, 2025

Commissioner McCarthy asked who the representatives in the COG would be, and Ms. Ware stated she would be on the Board of Directors, and the County Administrator or a Commissioner would be on the council.

Ms. James stated the COG will help strengthen the eight counites COAAA serves.

Commissioner McCarthy asked the frequency of meetings, and Ms. White stated the Council meets once a year and the Board meets monthly.

Ms. James stated the annual meeting will be in November and the Board will be approving new members.

Mr. Narducci stated the Commissioners will need to take action by November if they would like Union County to join the COG because of the annual meeting.

Commissioner McCarthy asked if government shutdown is affecting COAAA, and Mr. Ames stated there have been no cuts to services to qualifying individuals right now. Older adults and individuals with disabilities will not be seeing changes in their eligibility to services.

Ms. Ware stated she has talked with Mr. Phillips about joining the COG, and she feels it is best to join. There is the option to step back at any time.

CDBG Update – Thomas Perry, CDC of Ohio, Inc:

- There have been some concerns with the Milford Center slum/blight grant that was previously talked about in September. The business owner was not comfortable with some of the requirements for the grant, and Mr. Perry felt it best not to move forward.
- Commissioner McCarthy asked if the owner was moving forward on their own, and Mr. Perry stated they are.
- Commissioner McCarthy asked if there are other opportunities for Milford Center to receive grant funds, and Mr. Perry stated the slum/blight grants are easier to receive with downtown buildings, but not private businesses.
- Mr. Narducci stated these grant dollars are specifically for businesses or non-profits to fix code violations in downtown buildings, and Mr. Perry stated there have been talks about liquidating the downtown building grant program into the critical infrastructure grant.
- Commissioner McCarthy encouraged Mr. Perry to reach out to the Hope Center because they recently purchased a building in Richwood that will need some rehab.
- Mr. Perry stated he will reach out, but he will stress the grant process takes time. The Hope Center will also need to do their due diligence regarding the rules and regulations with these grants.
- Mr. Narducci stated the Commissioners are liable for these grant funds, so applicants need to be mindful.
- Mr. Perry stated he is excited about the Magnetic Springs sewer project. This is a huge project for the community and will benefit the residents for years to come. He is hopeful there will be multiple bids for the bid opening next week.
- He also drove to Unionville Center and that pavement project looks great. Residents are very pleased with the results.

The Board of County Commissioners hereby approves the PY 2024 CDBG Residential Public Infrastructure Program – Village of Magnetic Springs.

CDBG PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT VILLAGE OF MAGNETIC SPRINGS UNION COUNTY PY 2024 CDBG RESIDENTIAL PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM

I. COUNTY PAYMENTS TOWARD VILLAGE CDBG PROJECTS

The Board of County Commissioners of Union County, Ohio shall make payments of up to \$1,720,000 (\$720,000 Residential Public Infrastructure Grant and \$1,000,000 from the Union County General Fund) towards the cost of construction for the following project, as selected by the Village for PY 2024 CDBG Program funding, or as such budget is revised with the approval of the Ohio Department of Development:

ACTIVITY DESCRIPTION – MAGNETIC SPRINGS SANITARY SEWER: Installation of 40,000 Linear Feet of New Sanitary Sewer Line, 35 Manholes, and 1 Items of Equip. Installed/Repaired (installation of 1 lift station) throughout the Village of Magnetic Springs.

The source of such County payments shall include a \$720,000 PY 2024 grant to the County from the Ohio Department of Development through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program, Grant Number B-W-24-1CU-1, and County payments are therefore conditioned upon actually receiving such CDBG funds. County payments will also include \$1,000,000 from the Union County General Fund.

The disbursement and expenditure of County CDBG funds shall be made only in compliance with the requirements of the County's GRANT AGREEMENT with the State of Ohio. All work must be completed by February 28, 2027, unless such time period is extended by the Ohio Department of Development. Disbursements are limited by the approved "Project Costs and Use of Funds" to costs directly associated with the GRANT AGREEMENT.

II. COUNTY COOPERATION

The County Commissioners pledge their full cooperation, support and assistance to administer and disburse the CDBG funds in such a manner as to expedite and complete the project in the best interests of the Village, as well as in compliance with the requirements of the CDBG program and all other applicable state and federal laws and regulations.

III. OTHER COUNTY RESPONSIBILITIES

The County Commissioners shall assume the responsibilities for the administration of the CDBG program not otherwise set forth as being assumed by the Village in this Participation Agreement, it being further understood that even those responsibilities being assumed by the Village insofar as the State of Ohio is concerned are first and foremost the responsibility of the County.

IV. COUNTY'S CLAIMS ON OWNERSHIP OF PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

The County Commissioners will not have any claims on the ownership or use of any of the public improvements constructed or installed through the expenditure of County CDBG funds except as otherwise set forth in this Participation Agreement. Likewise the County will be free of any and all liabilities with regard to the public improvements except as regards its responsibilities to the State of Ohio for the proper administration of the CDBG funds.

V. <u>VILLAGE'S RESPONSIBILITIES</u>

The Village shall designate a Project Representative who will be responsible for coordinating with the County and County's Grant Consultant on project activities, and shall give the Project Representative the authority to work with the Village Project Engineer. Such activities may include delineating the project location, locating any utilities, which may be affected by the project, and other items requested by the Engineer which will enable the Contractor to properly construct the project. In addition, the Village shall give the Project Representative the authority to approve the project plans and specifications, any necessary project change orders and all contractor payments on behalf of the Village. All such approvals will be given along with those of the County and the Engineer. The Village will be responsible for (through the direction of the County) securing any required easements, waivers, appraisals, etc. in accordance with the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, as amended. The Project Representative shall attend the Pre-Construction Conference and assist with local needs (i.e., provision of a place to store materials near the site, site inspections in addition to those conducted by the Engineer, etc.)

VI. BIDDING

The County shall be responsible for bidding, contracting and CDBG management for all work elements outlined in the Grant Agreement with the Ohio Department of Development and for compliance with state and federal bidding and contracting regulations.

VII. OWNERSHIP AND USE OF PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

Upon commencement of a substantial portion of the project public improvements, the Village shall have and assume all ownership of such improvements, materials, etc. which are associated with the project not otherwise remaining under ownership of a contractor or vendor and the Village shall have and assume all such ownership and liability upon completion of the project. The Village agrees to retain ownership of and to operate and provide reasonable maintenance of the project improvements for the purposes they were intended for a period of 10 years or more following completion of project activities funded in whole or in part with CDBG funds.

The Village agrees to prohibit discrimination in the use of or benefits from the project improvements on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or handicap in accord with State and Federal laws and regulations. The Village further agrees to operate the facilities in such a manner as to assure maximum feasible benefit to persons of low and moderate income households.

During such 10-year period if for any reason the Village is no longer able to maintain or operate the Village-owned project improvements for the purposes they were intended or in compliance with the terms of this Participation Agreement, the Village shall inform the County in writing of such actions or circumstances and shall fully cooperate with the County to make the most appropriate changes to comply as nearly as possible with the CDBG program intent and regulations.

VIII. FINANCING

The Village has committed \$2,252,000 towards the "Residential Public Infrastructure" grant in local funding towards this project. These funds are being used to pay for Engineering and construction of the project. The Village shall obtain and provide all additional financing needed to complete all project public improvements. In the event the Village becomes aware of any problems in providing and/or obtaining all additional financing needed, the Village shall immediately inform the County in writing and shall fully cooperate with the County in writing. The County will not approve any change orders above the amount of funds budgeted for this activity without prior Village approval.

IX. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

No member, official or employee of the Village shall have any personal interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement or in the GRANT AGREEMENT conveying the CDBG funds to the County, nor shall any such member, official or employee participate in any decision relating to this Agreement or to the GRANT AGREEMENT which affects his/her personal interests or the interests of any corporation, partnership or association in which he/she is, directly or indirectly, interested.

X. ACCESS TO RECORDS

The Board of County Commissioners, the Ohio Department of Development, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Comptroller General of the United States, or any of their duly authorized representatives, shall have access to any books, documents, papers and records of the Village which are directly pertinent to the CDBG program and the use of its funds or any other funds on this project, for the purpose of making audit, examination, excerpts, and transcriptions. Records must be retained by the Village for a minimum of three (3) years after grant closeout by the Ohio Department of Development.

XI. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

This Participation Agreement may be terminated by either party if there is substantial evidence that the other party failed to fulfill its responsibilities under the terms of this Participation Agreement. Any such termination must be accomplished in writing. In the event of termination by either party, the Village shall not enter into any new or additional obligation of CDBG funds or any contracts which are in any other way dependent on the expenditure of CDBG funds. In the event of termination by either party, the County shall continue to be responsible for the expenditure of CDBG funds to fulfill Village obligations or contracts which were entered into prior to such termination, such responsibility being dependent on cooperative negotiation between both parties as to the least objectionable arrangements for closing out all such obligations and being dependent on the advice and approval of the Ohio Department of Development.

XII. AMENDMENT OF AGREEMENT

This Participation Agreement may be amended by the parties upon their mutual written agreement.
