REGULAR MEETING 6th DECEMBER 1947

Meeting was called to order and the following members answered roll call: Paris Outland, Clinton M. Croy, Milton Rausch, Wm. J. porter and Luther L. Liggett. The following bills were read by the clerk and upon motion duly seconded ordered paid:

The Clerk then read the bills of the Marysville Tribune and the Journal Bublishing Company for the printing of the ballot books and publication of the notices prior to election. It was noted that the Marysville Tribune had the State Examiner figure thier cost of publication of the legal notices of the three amendments to the State Constitution, and his figures were \$ 221.40; it was further noted that the Secy. of State had instructed the Board on what prices they were to pay for these notices, and his price was \$ 180.90. After some discussiom the Board decided that they could pay only that sum authorized by theSec. Of State, Milton Rausch then made a motion that the Board pay the Tribune the sum \$ 622.90 instead of the sum of \$ 663. 40 as was requested by the Tribune, and that the Clerk be so instructed, Paris Outland seconded the motion, and upon vote all members voted AYE. The Board then took under consid-eration the bill of the Journal Pub. Co. of \$ 1,174.40. It was noted that the Board was charged for the printing of 8 books of Leesburg-Magnetic Local School Questions, and only 7 books were required and used; charged for 6 books for Jerome Special School and only 5 were required and used; charged for 8 books Leesburg-Magnetic Local School and only 7 were required and used; charged for 5 books for Liberty Local School Rem and only 3 were required and used; charged for 7 books for Millcreek Local School and only 3 were required and used; making a total of nine books of ballots not required or used or an overcharge of \$ 49.40. Paris Outland then made a motion that the Clerk be instructed to pay the Journal Pub. Co. the sum of \$ 1,125.00 instead of the requested sum of \$ 1,174, Clinton Croy seconded the motion and upon vote all members voted AYE.

The Board then ordered the Clerk to issue certificates of election to those County, Township and Village officials elected in the Nov. 4th Election, but only after such candidates had filed their expense accounts or statement of no expense. The following candidates having filed their expense statements the same were approved by the Board and certificates of election signed and issued:
