The indictment charges that the defendants
on the 1st day of January 1879, and from
that time up to the 10th day of January 1880
were unlawfully the keepers of a place
of public resort, where intoxicating liquors
were sold by them in violation of law.

Said intoxicating liquors being
other than wine manufactured of the
pure juice of the grape cultivated in
this State, or ale, beer, or cider.

The deft Uriah S. Alden is only
now on trial, and you are to consider
as to Alden alone.

The Statute under which this indict-
ment is found provides that -

"A Keeper, keeper of a place
where intoxicating liquors are sold in
violation of law, shall be fined &c

The provisions of this act however
does not extend to the sale of wine -

Manufacture of the pure juice of the
 grape. Cultivated in this State or
 been, all or sides

No wine - if it is intoxicating,
 liquor - is excepted from the provisions
 of the act - except wine manufactured
 from the pure juice of the grape,
 cultivated in the State of Ohio.

The giving away of intoxicating
 liquors, or other shift, or device to evade
 the provisions of the law, is to be
 held an unlawful selling.

It is a violation of the act to sell intoxicating liquors - other than the kinds excepted - to be drunk in, upon, or about the building or premises where sold, or other place of public resort connected therewith.

Or to sell intoxicating liquors - other than the kind excepted - to a minor except upon the written order of his parent, guardian or family physician, or to a person intoxicated, or in the habit of getting intoxicated.

But to violate the law for selling to a minor, the seller must know at the time of the sale that the minor was such - and that the seller knew ^{when} he sold to a person intoxicated, that the seller that the person was intoxicated at the time of the sale, - Or when he sold to a person in the habit of getting intoxicated, that the seller knew that such person had such habit.

But it is a violation of law to sell intoxicating liquors - other than the except kind - to be drunk in, upon or about the building or premises where sold - without regard to whom the sale may be made.

Before you can convict - the State must prove beyond a reasonable doubt.

1. That the defendant Uriote & Alden was the keeper of the place where the intoxicating liquors are alleged to have been sold.

2. That intoxicating liquors - other than wine manufactured from the pure juice of the grape cultivated in this State, or beer, ale, or cider - were habitually sold in violation of law.

3. That a series of sales were so made.

A single sale is not sufficient to make the place a nuisance or the seller a "keeper" within the meaning of the act.

A keeper of a place, - means the person or persons, who have the custody, control or superintendence of the alleged place. It is not necessary that he, or they should be the owners of the place; - the title may be in another; yet to be a keeper, the alleged seller must have the care, possession & control of the place.

If you find from the Evidence that Charles Spears was the Clerk of this Dept in his Establishment, during the time, or a part of the time alleged in the indictment; and was authorized by Alden to make illegal sales of intoxicating liquors, then any sales made by Spears of intoxicating liquors - other than the excepted kind - made by the authority of Alden, would make Alden liable the same as if such sales were directly made by Alden himself.

Such sales as were made by said Spears, without the authority, either general or special from Alden, would not render him liable.

You will look to and weigh all the testimony - look to and consider all the circumstances, and before you can convict the defendant, you must find him guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

If he is found guilty beyond a reasonable doubt, it is your duty to do find and return accordingly.

You have nothing to do with the consequences of your verdict.

It is not the number of witnesses that always convinces, but look to all the evidence & circumstances, what strikes you is the fact.

All the jury has to do is to find, is to find the truth - to ascertain the facts and return your verdict accordingly and your duty is at an end.

If you find the defendant guilty beyond a reasonable doubt, you will look well to the case before you, by your verdict, encourage or sanction the keeping of a place where intoxicating liquors - other than the excepted kinds - are habitually sold in violation of law, with all the results ^{+ consequences} of such violations of the Criminal law.

Habitual selling, in order to sustain the charge does not mean that the defendant must have sold to every person indiscriminately - to minors - persons intoxicated & - for he may refuse certain persons and characters for his own safety from prosecutions - but it means that it is his ordinary, and usual practice in his business to sell in violation of this provision of the Statute - it must be his rule, his ordinary practice, & habit.

If therefore you find the defendant guilty beyond a reasonable doubt, you

will convict - If you find the defendant
not proven guilty beyond a reasonable
doubt, you will acquit.

If you find the defendant guilty - you will
say, you find the defendant guilty as he
stands charged.

If you find defendant not guilty,
you will say you find the defendant not
guilty as he stands charged.

Oppose one of your number as

your verdict.
