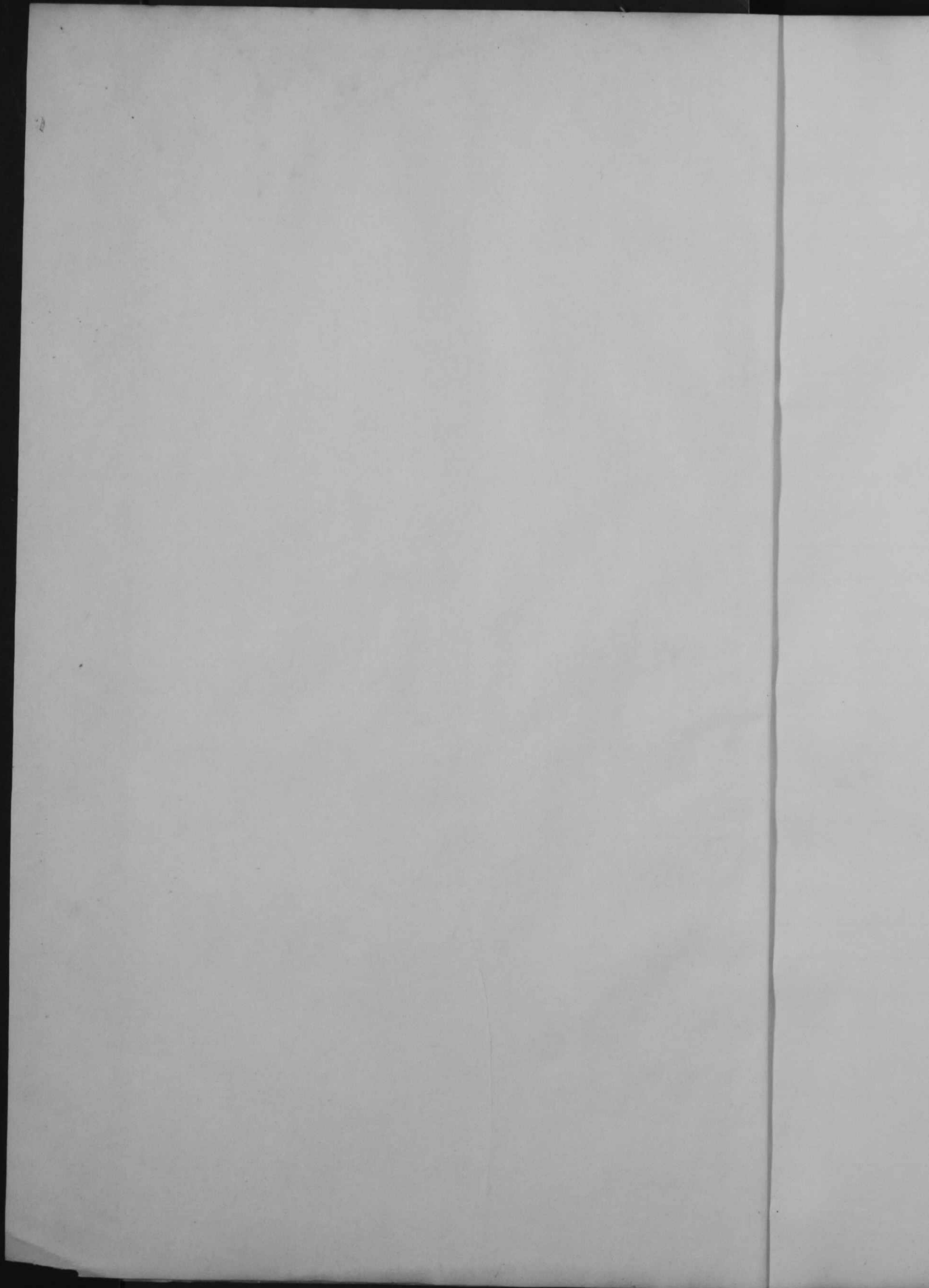

First I knew of it one month after occurrence. Threatened that I ever got money in bank she would get it if she had to forge my name. Was not administrator. ^{at time} She came back from Tenn 28 ~~Feb~~ ^{March} 1895. Collected \$300 from estate of Jane estate. Gave receipt of \$300 for board etc. Saw check she gave at bank. Imitation of my hand write. Put \$300 in bank for credit of Jane estate on Mch 29th gave receipt which gave me claim to money. ~~She~~ ^{She} never gave a check in my name. Never authorized her to sign my name. Money collected was of Fruit for rent. She had drawn \$69 on Tenn. coming to me.

C. S. David

Commenced business with us 1891. Carried individual ac, never an administrator or guardian money deposited. Both had separate ac. Notes payable to Jane estate left ~~to collect~~. She was appointed administratrix. Sent the money to her. Didnt order notes sent to her. He came back from Tenn. first. Wanted notes. Knew she had been appointed. Gave up one of the notes. Notes were given to Mr. Yount as admin. Didnt know of any family trouble. Came to bank 29 of Apr. 1895. Had a sachel. Presented a check. Check was drawn to Nancy J. Yount with S. M. Yount's name signed. Knew nothing of this until 25th day of May 1895. Used her own name.

when she did business alone.

Over drew his account \$82. owed the bank \$219.07 at time of settlement May 25. Would not have overdrawn if had not been for the \$300 check. Went out to see Mrs Yount. Asked to have a private conversation with her, Miss Lemon in room. Apr. 29th 1895. Asked if Mr Yount had that much in bank. Came down next day and paid \$82. Thought it was to settle up. Followed by Mrs Yount asked if Mr Yount had fixed it up. She said she thought had given a good check for it. She does not deny signing the check. She said I argued not to have given up the note to Mr Yount. She had never given me orders to not give notes to Mr Yount, I did not know that \$300 was for note collected. Gave him note in March or Apr not in first deposit. She told me that she had no doubt but that myself & Mr Yount was together to beat her. She said that bank would not pay money if I had not signed Mr Yount's name.

Richwood at present. Know Nancy Yount. Heard signing of check talked of for Mrs Yount's presence. Have talked with her on subject. Don't know what was said.
