#### ---PETITION-----

TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF UNION COUNTY, OHIO:

Petition for the grading and improving of a Public Road under the provisions of Section No. 6926 and 6956 inclusive, of the General Code of Ohio as amended.

The undersigned being a majority of the resident owners of the real estate lying and being in Union County and within one mile of either side of the public road hereinafter described, hereby present this, our petition to your honorable body, asking for the grading and improving of such road under the provisions of an Act entitled: An Act to Provide for the Improving of Public Roads, passed as aforesaid with the amendatory Acts.

The following is a description of the said public proposed to be improved: Beginning in the center of the Dover and Perkins Gravel Road and at the intersection of an unimproved road and corner to Sarah L.Black's land; thence following said unimproved road in a northeasterly course thru and along the lands of said Sarah L.Black, G.& P.Bridges, Christopher Black, Michael Cody and others to the Spring-dale Gravel Road.

We ask that said road be improved by grading, draining, culverting, graveling or stoning, etc., Section 6926 General Code: When a majority of the resident owners of real estate situated

within one mile of either side of a public read, present a petition to the Board of County Commissioners asking for the grading and improving of such read, the County Commissioners shall go along the line of the read described in such petition. If in their opinion, the public utility requires that such read to be graded and improved, they shall determinewhether the improvement shall be partly or whelly constructed of stone, gravel, brick or other materials, and what part or parts of such read improvement shall be of stone, gravel, brick or other materials, and enter this their decision on their jourmal. Section 6928 General Code: The County Commissioners shall order that a portion of the cost

and expense thereof, which shall not be less than one-half, nor more than two-thirds of the total, shall be paid out of the proceeds of any levy or levies upon the grand duplicate of the county against the taxable property of any township or townships in which such road may be in whole or in part, as authorized hereinafter. They shall alsoorder that the balance of said cost and expense be assessed upon and collected from the owners of said realestate, and from the real estate benefited thereby in proportion to the benefit to be derived therefrom by said real estate as determined by the said Commissioners.

Application has been made to the Board of Commissioners of said Union County for the improvement of a County road on the following route to-wit:Beginning in the center of the Dovernand Perkins Gravel Road and at the intersection of an unimproved road and corner to Sarah L.Black's land; thence following the unimproved road in a northeasterly course thru and along the lands of said Sarah L.Black, G.& P.Bridges, Christopher Black, Michael Cody and others to the Springdale Gravel Road.

Now if the said applicant shall pay the Treasury of the said County the amount of all costs and expenses accruing thereon, in case the prayer of said petitioners be not granted, or when the proceedings had in pursuance thereof shall be not fully confirmed and established, then this obligation to be void: otherwise to be in full force in law.

A petition under the provisions of Sections 6926-6956, inclusive of the Geheral Code of Ohio, was this day filed by W.A.Houseman and 13 freeholders, asking for the improving of a road as follows:-Begining in the center of the Dover and Perkins **End**vel Road and at the intersection of **i**n unimproved roadand corner to Sarah L.Black's land; thence following the said unimproved in a northeasterly course through and along the lands of Said Sarah L.Black, G.& P.Bridges, Christopher Black, Michael Cody and others to the Springdale Gravel Road. Also a bond of \$100.00 was this day filed with said petition to cover all costs and expenses accruing thereon, in case the said application should fail, said bond being signed by W.A.Houseman and Michael Cody as principals and E.A.Emmert and Walter C.Fullington as sureties.

A majority having been determined, it is ordered this Board meet on the line of said proposed improvement on Tuesday may the 19th, 1915 at 10:30 o'clock A.M. and make actual view of the of the route, territory etc., and determine whether public utility requires the improvement of said road as the same petitioned for.

IN THE MATTER OF THE HOUSEMAN ROAD.

In the matter of the petition of W.A.Houseman et al praying for the improving of and draining etc., of an unimproved road and located in Dover Towhship, Union County, Ohio, filed with the Auditor of Union County, Ohio on the 11th, day of May 1915, Mr Cowgill offered the following preamble and resolution and moved the adoption of the same, which was duly seconded by Mr.Deihl.

WHEREAS, on the 11th, day of May 1914, W.A. Houseman et al filed with the County Commissioners of Union County, Ohio, a petition under Sections 6926-6956 General Code of Ohio, praying for the repairing, draining etc., of a road described as follows: Commencing in the center of the Dover and Perkins Gravel Road, and at the intersection of an unimproved road and corner of Sarah L.Black's land; thence following said unimproved road in a northeasterly course thru and along the lands of saidSarah L.Black's G.& P.Bridges, Christopher Black, Michael Cody and others to the Springdale Gravel Road, a distance of about 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> miles; and

WHEREAS, on the 11th day of Mgy, 1914, W.A. Houseman et al filed a bond with the County Auditor in the sum of \$500.00 with E.A. Emmert and W.C. Fullington as sureties thereon conditioned that they pay the amount of all costs and expenses accruing thereonin case said application should fail; and

WHEREAS, on the 19th, day of May 1914, the Board of Commissioners of Union County, Ohio, Chas, Rausch and Chas. Deihl being present, did go upon line of said road as prayed for in the petition for the purpose of determining whether or not public utility and convenience require that said road be improved as prayed for; and

WHEREAS, We, the Board of Commissioners of Union County, Ohio, find that a majority of the owners of real estate who reside within one mile of any direction from either side of said read have signed said petition;

THEREFORE, be it resolved, by the Beard of Commissioners of Union County, Ohio, that it is the the opinion of this Beard that public utility and convenience require that said Heaseman readdescribed as follows: Beginning in the center of the Dover and Perkins Gravel Read and at the intersection of an unimproved read and the corner of said Sarah L.BLack's lands; thence following the said unimproved read in a northeasterly course thru and along the **kands** of Sarah L.Black, G.& P.Bridges, Christopher Black, Michael Cody and others to the Springdale Graval Read, a distance of aboutl<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> miles, and located in Dover Township, be improved by grading, draining, graveling etc., under the provisions of Sections 6926-6956, as amended in O.L.Vol.103, page 198, same to have a grade of at least 22 feet, with one track to be 9 feet in width and coated with good gravel, and built in accordance to the plans and specifications to be prepared by W.P.Beightler, County Surveyor, who is hereby appointed Engineer for the location and construction of said improvement, who is hereby directed, with the approval of said Beard, to prepare and file the necessary plans, plats, profile, specifications etc., thereef.

And it is further ordered that one-half  $(\frac{1}{2})$  the cost and expense thereof be paid out of the proceeds of the levy to be made of the grand duplicate of the county assessed against the taxable property of Dover Towhship in which said road is located, and the balance of the costs and expenses shall be assessed against and collected from the owners of real estate and real estate benefited thereby in proportion to the benefits derived therefrom by said real estate as determined by this Board. It is further directed by this Board that the estimated cost and expenses and assessments

shall be made before the improvement is commenced.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS:

Bids must be made on the blank form which is bound with these specifications. The blank places indicated in the proposal sheet, except as otherwise noted, must be filled in, and any proposal that contains any omission, alteration or addition in writing of any condition, limitation, may be rejected.

If the bid is made by a firm, the name and place of residence of each member of the firm must be given. If made by a corporation, the names of the president, secretary and treasurer shall be given. One signing for a company, or as the agent of another, may be required to present legal evidence of such authority, and that the company is an existing legal corporation.

Each sealed proposal shall specify the gross sum, written with ink in both words and figures for which the contract will be performed. The gross sum written in words takes precedent over figures.

As a guarantee that the bidder will enter into contract, and furnish bond, as hereinafter provided, each proposal must be accompanied by a draft or certified check for 10 per cent of the amount bid. Such draft or check shall be made payable on demand to the Auditor of Union County, Ohio.

## \*\*----ENGINEER'S REPORT (dontinued)-----

Permission will not be given to withdraw, modify or explain any proposal after it has been deposited with the Commissioners. The price stated in the contract shall be no more than the estimated cost, and shall cover the entire cost of all materials in place and all labor to be performed in order to complete, in a workmanlike manner, the improvement as shown on the plans and required by the specifications.

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Union County: I, the undersigned Engineer, in obedience to your order have made a survey of said road and have taken the necessary levels at each hundred feet Furthermore I have made note of the intersection of lines and boundaries, land marks, bridges and culverts, and I herewith make report of the same with plans, plats, profiles, estimate of quantities, specifications and apportionment of cost for the work.

Description:Beginning in the center of the Dover and Perkins Gravel Road and at the intersection of an unimproved road and corner to Sarah L.Black's land;thence following said unimproved road in a northeasterly course thru and along the lands of said Sarah L.Black,G.& P.Bridges,Christopher Black, Michael Cody and others to the Springdale Gravel Road.

## RESPONSIBILITY.

The contractor shall be responsible for all injuries to persons and for all damages to property, resulting from the negligence of himself , his employes or agents, during the continuance of this contract. Before the final acceptance of the work by the Commissioners, the contractor shall restore all property, public or private, which he has injured during the continuance of this contract. Until final acceptance by the Commissioners, the work shall be under the contractors charge and care, and he shall take every necessary and proper precaution against accident of injury to the improvement, or any part thereof, by the action of the elements or from any cause whatsoever, whether arining from the execution or non-execution of the work. The contractor shall rebuild, restore and make good at his own expense. all injuries of the work occasioned by accidental causes, or any causes whatsoever, before the final acceptance of the work by the Commissioners.

The contractor shall provide and maintain proper guards, suitable and sufficient lights and take all necessary precautions for the prevention of avoidable accidents.

All the work to be done by the contractor, specified or mentioned in the specifications as well as any minor details of the work not specifically mentioned, but oviously necessary for the proper completion of the work, shall be considered as incidental, and as being a part of, and included in, the contract.

The contractor will not be entitled to any extra or additional compensation.

## SPECIFICATIONS;

- LOCATION. Said Road shall be located along the line of stakes with the center line 20 feet to the left thereof and corresponding to the line of center stakes.Obstructions of every kind, including trees, stumps, stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor when necessary from the road limits.Fences must be removed with the least possible damage.All such trees brush, and roots shall be burned without damage to adjoining property.
- GRADE. The grade shall be 22 feet wide or 11 feet on each side of the center line, and have a crown of 6 inches thereto. The top of the grade shall be true and smooth and correspond in elevation to the grade line as shown by the profile and the sides shall have a slope of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 perpendicular. On each fill of over 1 foot the grade shall be widened 1 foot for each additiona; foot in height to allow for sleughing.
- SIDE DITCHES. The side ditches or gutters shall have a slope of lito 1 on the grade side, and 1 to 1 on the outside, and the bottom thereof shall be 1 foot wide in the bottom and kept in true lines as far as possible on both sides. The bottom must be true and smooth and have a grade to conduct water at all outlets. All ditches must be inside the road limits where otherwise permitted by the Engineer and Commissioners.
- OUTLETS. The contractor shall be required to cut all outlets where necessary, sufficiently far and deep to drain the side ditches thoroughly.
- LIMESTONE MACADAM.The Macadam shall consist of one cousse of limestone of approved quality and fracture faces.The stone shall be of good and uniform texture and free from rotton and inferior stone, shall be well screened and shall be free from injurious matter of all kinds.The limestone shall be broken into fragments that will pass thru a two and one-half(2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>) inch ring.The filler shall be crushed screenings,free from dirt,all of which will pass a onehalf(<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>) inch ring,together a sufficient proportion of dust of fracture.
- BOTTOM COURSE. After the sub-grade has been prepared and has been accepted by the Engineer, the limestone shall be spread evenly over it. The loose limestone shall be nine (9) inches thick in the center of the road and six (6) inches thick, four and one-half  $(4\frac{1}{2})$  feet from the side of the center. Six (6) inch boards shall be held to the line and grade nine (9) feet apart by suitable stakes. These boards shall be used to gauge the thickness of stone at the outer edge. After they are removed the stone shall be raked out about one and one-half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  feet to zero thickness. The thickness in the center shall be guaged by nine(9) inch cubical blocks. The stone shall be evenly distributed between the nine (9) inch cubical blocks and six (6) inch boards.
- TOP COURSE. The top course of limestone screenings and dust shall be spread uniformly three (3) inches thick over the bottom course, nine (9) feet wide, the thickness being guaged by three (3) inch side boards and three (3) inch cubical blocks. After the side boards are removed, the stone to be raked out same as on the bottom course. Care must be taken to preserve the

grade and crown also to prevent a wavy surface. CULVERTS. The iron pipe and headers and concrete culverts shall be furnished by the contractor, on the line of the work and must be placed by the contractor on the grade as designated by the Engineer, and according to the plans for same enclosed in the Engineer's report. Said work shall commence not later than the 15th, of April, 1915, and be completed by Sep-TIME. tember,15th,1915. SUB-CONTRACT LETTING. No sub-contracting will be allowed except by written consent of the County Commissioners. ESTIMATES.At the end of each month, providing the work is progressing satisfactorily, estimates will be made and certified to the County Commissioners by the Engineer.At least 10 % will be retained until final settlement. CONTRACT AND BOND. The succesful bidder will be required to enter into contract and bond with good and sufficient sureties, or of a surety company, of recognized standing , in amount equal to 50 per cent of the contract price, conditioned for the faithful performance of the work in accordance with the plans ans specifications, within the time prescribed.

ENGINEER'S REPORT AND APPORTIONMENT.

Surveyor's Office, Union County, Ohio.

IN THE MATTER OF THE HIGHLAND AND CROY ROAD. IMPROVEMENT.

To the Honorablr Board of County Commissioners of Union County, Ohio:-

The undersigned Engineer in obedience to your order has made a survey of said road and has taken the necessary levels at each one hundred feet, and I have made a note of the intersection of lines and boundaries, land marks, bridges and culverts; and I herewith make report of the same, with plans, plats, profiles, estimates of quantities, cost estimates and specifications for the work.

DESCRIPTION. Commencing at the intersection of the Highland and Groy Gravel Road with the Marysville-California and Franklin County Line Gravel Road in Jerome Township; thence following the line of said Highland and Croy Gravel Road thru and along the lands of Geo.C.Gordon, Jas. Sweeney, Chas.F.& Jno.E.Bishop, C?C.Freshwater, Berry P.Stewart, Martin Kuhn, Jacob, Hagenlocker and others to the intersection of the said Highland and Croy Gravel Road with the California and Franklin Gravel Road, a distance of about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

> At station 0.20-----30'of 10" Cast iron pipe. At station 39.38-----28'of 12" Cast iron pipe. At station 127.50---(stone-headers)28'of 14" Cast iron pipe. At station 162.40---(stone headers)28'of 30" Cast iron pipe. From Sta.85.50 to Sta.87.50----200'of 12" Drain tile. From Sta 11.50 to Sta.20.50-----900'of 8" Drain tile. From Station 142-----200'of 4" Drain tile. From Station 142 etc.,-----85'of 6" Drain tile.

#### County Surveyor.

RESPONSIBILITY. The contractors shall be responsible for all injuries to persons, and for all damage to property, resulting from the negligence of himself, his employes of agents, during the continuance of this contract. Before the final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners, the contractor shall restore all property, public or private, which he has injured during the continuance of this contract. Until final acceptance by the Commissioners, the work shall be under the contractors charge and care, and he shall take every necessary and proper precaution against accident or injury to the improvement, or any part thereof, by the action of the elements or from any other cause whatsoever, whether arising from the execution or non-execution of the work. The contractor shall repair, rebuild, restore and make good, at his own expense, all injuries of damages to any portion of the work occasioned by accidental causes, or any cause whatsoever, before the final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners.

The contractor shall provide and maintain proper guards, suitable and sufficient lights and take all necessary precaution for the prevention of avoidable accidents.

All work must be done by the contractor, specified or mentioned in the specifications as well as any minor details of work not specifically mentioned, but oviously necessary for the proper completion of the work, shall be considered as incidental, and as being a part of, and included in, the contract. The contractor will not be entitled to any extra or additional compensation.

## (Engineer's report Continued)

LOCATION. This road is now a double track, the old stone being on the West side. The surface as shown in the profile, is the top of the stone as now traveled. All earth on each side of the stone track shall be used to raise the side track and fills, and if this is not sufficient, dirt shall be taken from the side ditches and thoroly rolled, after which the stone shall be torn up and moved over.

Said road shall be located along the line as staked with center line 25 feet to the right thereof and corresponding to the line of center stakes.Obstructions of every kind including trees, stumps, stones and fences shall be moved by the contractor when necessary from the road limits.Fences must be moved with the least possible damage.All such trees, brush and roots shall be burned without damage to adjoining property.

GRADE.

The grade shall be 22 feet wide or 11 feet on each side of the center line and have a crown of 6 inches thereto.

The top of the grade shall be true and smooth and correspond in elevation to the grade line as shown by the profile and the sides shall have a slope of  $l_{\Sigma}^{1}$  to 1 perpindicular.

On each fill of over 1 foot, the grade shall be widened 1 foot for each additional foot in height to allow for sloughing.

After the grade has been completed, a road roller shall be run over the same until the surface is prepared to the satisfaction of the Engineer, after which the sub-grade shall be rolled with a steam roller weighing not less than ten (10) tons until the same is thoroly compacted. All hollows and depressions which develop during the rolling shall be fitted with material acceptable to the Engineer and the sub-grade shall again be rolled. This process of filling and rolling shall continue until all depression develop. The shoulders also shall be rolled in the same manner, but in places where the **cha**racter of the materials make the use of the ten ton roller impracticable, a lighter rolled shall be used. The conctractor shall keep all rute and irregularities rolled out of the sub-grade ahead of the stone.

THE LIMESTONE MACADAM. The macadam surface shall consist of two principal courses of limestone of approved quality and fracture faces. The stone shall be of good and uniform texture and free from rotten or inferior stone, shall be well screened and shall be free from injurious matter of all kinds. The bottom course shall consist of limestone broken into fragments that will pass thru a three (3) inch ring.

The top course shall consist of limestone, broken so that the fragments will pass thru a two(2) inch ring, but will not pass thru a one(1) inch ring.

BOTTOM COURSE.After the sub-grade has been prepared and has been accepted by the Engineer, the bottom course of crushed limestone shall be spread evenly over it.The loose limestone of the bottom layer shall be five(5) inches thick in the center of the road, and three(3) inches thick five(5) feet from side of the center.Three(3) inch boards shall be held to line and grade ten(10) feet apart by suitable stakes.These boards shall be used to guage the thickness of stone at the outer edge.After they are removed the stone shall be raked out about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  feet to zero thickness.The thickness at the center shall be guaged by five(5) inch cubical blocks The stone shall be evenly distibuted between the five(5) inch cubical blocks and three(3) inch boards.

The roller shall be run along the edge of the stone backward and forward several times on each side before rolling the center. Before putting on the filler the bottom course shall be rolled until they donot creep or weave ahead of the roller. After rolling the bottom course shall be covered with a coat of screenings spread on dry and rolled. This shall be continued until no more will go in dry, when the surface shall be thoroly sprinkled to more effectually fill the voids and the rolled. Only such teaming as is necessary for the distributing of the materials will be allowed on the bottom course. Any irregularities or depressions, the result of settling or rolling shall be made good with broken stone of the size used in the bottom course.

TOP COURSE. The top course of stone shall be spread uniformly three\$3)inches thick over the bottom course,ten(10)feet wide,the thickness being guaged by three(3)inch side boards and three inch cubical blocks.After the side boards are removed,the stone shall be raked out the same as the bottom course.Care must be taken to preserve the grade and crown,also to prevent a wavy surface, and all irregularities and depressions shall be made up with stone of the top course.Filler for screenings for the top course shall be dumped on the shoulders before the stone of the top course is spread, in quantity sufficient to complete said course after the first course is completed.After the surface is true to the line,grade and csosssection and rolled until the same ceases to "weave" in front of the roller, it shall be covered with a coat of screenings,spread on dry, and rolled and swept in.The spreading ,sweeping and rolling in of the screenings shall be continued until no more will go in dry, after which the road shall be sprinkled until saturated, the sprinkler being followed by the rol-

ler.More screenings shall be added if necessary, and the sprinkling, sweeping and rolling shall continue until a grout has been formed by the screenings, stone, dust and water that shall fill all voids and shall form a wave before the roller. The road shall be puddled as many times as may be necessary to secure satisfactory results.

After the wave of grout has been produced over the whole section of the road, this portaon of the road shall be left to dry, after which it shall be open to travel. Enough screenimgs shall be spread on top of the macadam to leave a wearing surface at least three-eights 3/8) of an inch thick. This process of the wearing surface shall be maintained and renewed until the road has been completed and excepted. The widths of the stone of the whole road shall be twelve and one-half $(12\frac{1}{2})$  feet.

IRON PIPE. The iron pipe and headers shall be furnished by the contractor, on the line of the work and must be placed by the contractor on the grade as directed by the Engineer.

TIME. Said work shall commence not later than the First of July 1914 and be completed by the First of December 1914.

SUB\*CONTRACTING. No sub-contracting will be allowed except by written consent of the County Commissioners.

ESTIMATES. At the end of each month, providing that the work is progressing satisfactorily, estimates will be made and certified to the County Commissioners by the Engineer. At least 10% will be retained until the final settlement.

CONTRACT AND BOND. The successful bidder will be required to enter into contract and bond with good and sufficient surcties, or with a surety company of recognized standing in amount equal to 50 per cent of the contract price, conditioned for the faithful performance of the work in accordance with the plans and specifications, and within the time prescribed.



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--INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERSº-

Bids must be made oh the blank form which is bound with these specifications. The blank places indicated in the proposal sheet, except as otherwise noted, must be filled in, and any proposal that contains any omission, alteration or addition in writing of any condition, limitation may be rejected.

If the bid is made by a firm, the name and place of residence of each member of the firm must be given. If made by a corporation, the names of the president, secretary and treasurer shall be given. One signing for a company or as the agent of another, may be required to present legal evidence of such authority, and that the company is an existing legal corporation.

Each sealed proposal shall specify the gross sum, written with ink in both words and figures, for which the contract will be performed. The gross sum written in words takes precedent over figures.

As a guarantee that the hidder will enter into contract, and furnish bond, as hereinafter provided, each proposal must be accompanied by a good and sufficient bond or certified check for 10 per cent. the amount of bid. Such draft or check shall be made payable to the Auditor of Union County, Ohio.

Permission will not be given to with-draw, modify or explain any proposal after it has been deposited with the Commissioners. The price stated in the contract shall be not more than the estimated cost of all materials in place and all labor to be performed in order to complete in a workmanlike manner, the improvement as shown on the plans and required by the specifications.

## -- RESPONSIBILITY--

The contractor shall be responsible for all injuries to persons, and for all damages to property, resulting from the negligence of himself, his employes or agents, during the continuance of this contract. Before the final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners, the contractor shall restore all property, public or private, which he has injured during the continuance of this contract. Until final acceptance by the Commissioners, the work shall be under the contractor's charge and care, and he shall take every necessary, proper precaution against accident, or injury to the improvement, or any part thereof, by the action of the elements or from any cause whatsoever, whether arising from the execution or non-execution of the work. The fontractor shall rebuild, repair and make good, at his own expense, all injuries of the work occasioned by accidental causes, or any causes whatsoever, before final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners.

The contractor shall provide and maintain proper guards, suitable and sifficient lights, and take all necessary precautions for the prevention of avoidable accidents.

All the work to be done by the contractor, specified or mentioned in the specifications as well as any minor details of work not specifically mentioned butobviously necessary for the proper completion of the work, shall be considered as incidental, and as being a part of, and included in the contract.

The contractor will not be entitled to any extra or additional compensation.

## SPECIFICATIONS. SCHMELXER ROAD.

LOCATION. Said road shall be located along the line of stakes with the center line 20 feet to the left thereof and corresponding to the line of center stakes. Obstructions of every kind, including trees, stumps, stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor when necessary from the road limits. Fences must be removed with the least possible damage. All such trees, brush and roots, shall be burned without damage to adjoining property.

The grade shall be 24 feet wide or 12 feet on each side of the center line, and have GRADE . a crown of 6 inches thereto.

The top of the grade shall be true and smooth and correspond in elevation to the grade line as shown by the profile and the sides shall have a slope of 12 to 1 perpendicular. On each fill of over 1 foot the grade shall be widened 1 foot for each additional

foot in height to allow for aloughing

Side Ditches. The side ditches or gutters shall have a slope of  $l\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 on the grade side, and 1 to 1 on the outside, and the bottom thereof shall be 1 foot wide inst he bottom and kept in true lines as far as possible on both sides. The bottom must be true and smooth and have a grade to conduct water at all outlets. All ditches must be inside the road limits where otherwise permitted by the Engineer and Commissioners.

The contractor shall be required to cut all outlets where necessary, sufficiently OUTLETS. far and deep to drain the side ditches thoroughly.

## THE LIMESTONE MACADAM.

The Macadam surface shall consist of one course of limestone of approved quality and fracture faces. The stane shall be of good and uniform texture and free from rotten or inferior stone, shall be well screened and shall be frem from all injurious matter of all kinds. The limestone shall be broken into fragments that will pass through a two inch (2) ring. The filler shall be crushed screenings, free from dirt, all of which will pass a onehalf (1) inch ring, together a sufficient proportion of dust of fracture.

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		After the sub-grade has been prepared and has been accepted by the Engineer, the limestone shall be spread evenly over it, the loose limestone shall be eight (8) inches thick in the center of the road, and six (6) inches thick four and one-half $(4\frac{1}{2})$ feet from the side of the center. Six (6) inche boards shall be held to line and grade 9 feet apart by suitable stakes. These boards shall be used to guage the thickness of the stone at the outer edge. After they are removed, the stone shall be raked about a foot to zero thickness. The thickness at the center shall be guaged by eight (8) inch cubical blocks. The stone shall be evenly distributed between the eight (8) inch cubical blocks and the six (6) inch boards.
	TOP COURSE.	The top course of limestone screenings and dust shall be spread uniformly three (3) inches thick over the bottom course ten (10) feet wide, the thickness being guaged by three (3) inch side boards and three (3) inch cubical bhocks. After the side boards are removed, the stone to be raked out same as on the bottom course. Care must be taken to preserve the grade and crown also to pregent a wavy surface.
	CULVERTS.	The iron pipe and headers and concrete culverts shall be furnished by the contractor on the line of the work and must be placed by the contractor on the grade side as designated by the Engineer and according to the plans for same, enclosed in the Engineer's Report.
	TIME.	Said work shall commence not later than, and must be completed by
	SUB-CONTRACTI	NG No stb-contracting will be allowed except by written consent of the County Commissio ers.
	ESTIMATES.	At the end of each month, providing the work is progressing satisfactorly, estimates will be made and certified to the County Commissioners by the Engineer. At least 10% will be retained until final settlement.
	CONTRACT & BOND	The successful bidder will, be required to enter into contract and bond for good and sufficient sureties, or with a surety company, of recognized standing in amount equal to 50 per cent of the contract price, conditioned for the faithful performance of the work in accordance with the plans and specifications, and within the time prescribed.
		SPECIFICATIONS FOR CONCRETE WORK ON SCHMELZER ROAD.
	ADHERENCE TO PLANS	No.1 The contractor shall, during construction, adhere strickly to the plans, as the strength of the finished structure depends upon this.
	PLACING OF FORMS	No.2. The false work and forms shall be substantial and unyielding, properly braced or tied by means of wire or rods, and shall be so designed that the concrete will conform to the proper dimensions and contours.
		No.3. As soon as the contractor has placed the forms and reinforcing bars ( which are to be wired together), he shall notify the Engineer and the latter shall make an inspection of same before any concrete is placed. In general the forms shall be simple of construction, easy of erection, maintenance and removal and they shall be frequently inspected during the progress of the work that perfect alignment may be maintained.
		No.4. All forms having been previously used shall be thoroughly cleansed before being used again.
	STEEL REº INFORCEMENT	No.5 Steel may be made either by the open hearth or Bessemer process. Bars shall be rolled from billets. Reinforcing bars shall be deformed bars of de- sign approved by the Engineer; If twisted or other square deformed bars are used when round bars are called for on the plans or wice versa, the total number of bars and net area of section must not be reduced
	FINISH	No.6 Material shall be free from injurious seams, flaws or cracks, and have a work- manlike finish.
	VARIATION IN WEIGHT	No.7. A variation of not maro than five % from the specified cross-section or weight of any materials shall be cause for rejection.
	CLEANING METAL	No.8 No metal reinforcement used in concrete shall be painted, but shall be free from rust, oil or grease. All mill scale shall be removed by hammering the metal.
RE:	PLACING OF INFORCEMENT	No.9. The metal reinforcement shall be placed and kept in the proper position during the deposition and tamping of the concrete. Whenever it is practicable, it shall be placed first. This can usually be done by supporting it on transverse wires or otherwise.
	CEMENT	No.10 The cement shall be Portland, either American or foreign, which will meet the requirements of the standard specifications, adopted by the American Society for Testing Materials.
	SAND	No.ll. The sand shall be clean, sharp, caarse and of grains varying in size, all of which will pass a screen of 3/8 inch mesh. It shall be free from sticks and other foreign matter, but it may contain loam not to exceed 5 per cent.
	STONE	No.12. The stone shall be sound, hard and durable, crushed and screened to sizes from $\frac{1}{2}$ inch to $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches in greatest diameter. For re-inforced concrete, the sizes are not to exceed $\frac{3}{4}$ inch in any direction, but may be varied to suit the character of the reinforcing material.
	GRAVEL	No.13 The gravel shall be composed of clean pebbles of hard and durable stones pf sizes not exceeding $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter, free from clay and other impurities except sand. When containing sand in any considerable quantity the amount per unit of volume of gravel shall be determined accurately to admit of the proper proportion of sand being maintained in the concrete mixer.

WATER. No.14 The water shall be clean and reasonably clear, free from supphuric acid and strong alkalies.

BEDDING No.15. Where the dimensions of the structure will permit it, large sound stones, not exceeding la cu.ft. in contents may be bedded in the cement not closer to each other or any surface to than four inches. They must be clear and wet when placed. These stones must not in any way interfere or displace any reinforcingnizetal.

## --WORKMANSHIP--

- MIXING. No.16. The cement and the stone shall be mixed in the proportion to one of cement, two of sand and four parts of crushed limestone for all concrete, measured by volume, loose.
- MIXING No.17 Tight platforms shall be provided of sufficient size to accomodate men and materials BY HAND for the progressive and rapid mixing of at least two batches of concrete at the same time Batches shall not exceed 1 cubic yard each, and smaller batches are preferable, based upon a multiple of the number of sacks to the barrel. Spread the sand evenly upon the platform the cement upon the sand and mix thoroughly intil of an even color. Add all the water necessary to make a thin mattar and spread again; add the gravel or broken stone, which if dry should first be thoroughly wet down. Turn the mass with shovels or hoes until thoroughly incorporated, and until all the gravel or stone is covered with mortar, which will probably require the mass to be turned four times; another method, which may be permitted at the option of the Engineer in charge, is to spread the sandm then the cement and mix dry; then the gravel or broken stone; add water and mix thoroughly as above.
- MIXING No.18. A machine mixer shall be used wherever the volume of work will justify the same. BY MACHINEThes mixer shall be of the type known as "batch mixers". After all the materials have been placed in the drum of the mixer, the mixer shall continue until the drum has made fifteen revolutions, at a speed between 15 and 22 revolutions per minute. The drum shall be completely empted before recharging same.
- CONSIST<sup>2</sup> No.19. The materials shall be mixed wet enough to produce a concrete of such consistency ENCY as will flow into the forms and about the metal reinforcement, and, at the same time, **man** be conveyed from the mixer to the forms without separation of the coarse aggregates from the mortar.

PLACING

THE No.20 Before placing the concrete, care shall be taken to see that the forms are thorough-CONCRETE ly wetted **and** the space to be occupied by the concrete is free from debris. No.21. Great must also be taken to insure the coating of the material with cement mortar and the thorough flushing of the bottom of the forms with same; after which the concrete must be deposited tapidly, thoroughly compacting it around the metal. No.22. Concrete after the addition of water to the mix, shall be handled as rapidly, in as small masses as is practicable, from the place of mixing to the placeof final deposit.

No.23 No concrete having an initial set shall be used, nor shall the retempering of mortar or concrete )ie.remixing with water after it has been partially set) be permitted.

No.24 Where the metal reinforcement occurs in several layers, the concrete shall be deposited in equal layers, and rammed separately. Otherwise, the concrete shall be spread in horizontal layers of such thickness as the Engineer may direct.

No.25. The concrete shall be deposited in a manner that will permit the mostthorough compacting, such as can be obtained by working with a straight shovel or slicing tool, kept moving up and down till all the ingredients have settled in their proper places by gravity and surplus water is forced to the surface.

No.26. In columns having circumferential reinforcements, the concrete shall preferably be introduced by means of a tremic or tube, in order to prevent the ingredients from sorting in layers. To prevent settlement or shrinkage in freshly made columns, a period of at least two hours shall elapse before girder or beam over them may be commenced.

DEPOSITING No.27. In depositing concrete under water, when permitted, special care shall be exercised NDER WATER to prevent the cement from flaating away and to prevent the formation of laitance; when laitance has formed it shall be removed before placing fresh cementte

JOINTING. No.28. When work is resumed, concrete previously placed shall be roughened, thoroughly cleansed of foreign material and laitance; drenched and slushed with a mortar consisting of 1 part Portland cement and two parts sand.

EXPOSED No.29. The faces of concrete exposed to premature drying should be kept wet by covering SURFACES with wet cloths or tampaulins for a period of at least 7 days after molding.

FREEZING No.30. Concrete shall not be mixed or deposited at a freezing temperature, except under WEATHER special instruction. In this case the sand, water and broken stone shall be heated but no salt shall be added except by written direction of the Engineer. Effective means shall be provided to prevent the concrete from freezing until it has thoroughly hardened.

REMOVAL OF FORMS No.31. The time for removal of forms and shores, being an extremely important consideration shall be determined in each case by the Engineer in charge after inspection. As a guide, the following important determinants are mentioned: size of structure and general dimensions of parts; methods of mixing and proportioning of mixture; whether slow or quick settleing cements are used; atmospheric conditions; importance of live loading and its ratio to the dead load; length of period between removal of forms and shores and the time when the maximum loading may be attained etc.. But in any case the supporting shores shall be left until removal is permitted by the Engineer in charge.

> No.32. The maximum time for the removal of Forms( not the supporting) shall be as follows: For side of beams and girders, 7 days For columns, 4 days For bridges, 28 days. For monolithic piers and abutments, 36 hours.

No.33. The minimum time for removal of shores shall be as follows: For bottom of beams and girders, 21 days, for spans of 10 feet or less, plus one-half  $(\frac{1}{2})$  day for each additional foot of span. The original shores must **he mo** case be taken down, replaced or disturbed, until permitted by the Engineer in charge.

FROSTY WEATHER.	No.34. When frosty weather occurs during the above periods, an extension of time shall be made equal to its duration.
	No.35. During the settling of the concrete and before the removal of forms, no extraneous loading shall be placed upon the concrete.
	No.36. The forms shall be removed with care so as not to deface the structure or to disturbe the remaining supports.
FACING.	No.37. The facing may be made by working the coarse stone back from the form by k means of a straight shovel or slicing tool, so as to bring the excess mortar of the concrete to the face. Or about one inch of mortar (not grout) of the same proportion as used in the concrete may be placed next to the form immediately in advance of the concrete, in order to secure a perfect face.
FINISHING.	No.38. After the forms are removed, which should generally be as soon as possible after the concrete is sufficiently hardened, any small cavities or openings in the surface shall be neatly filled with cement mortar. Any ridges due to cracks or joints in the lumber shall be rubbed down with a chisel.stone or wooden float. The earlier the above operations are performed, the better will be the result. The tops of bridge seats, copings, wingwalls, etc., when not finished with natural stone, shall be finished with a smooth surface composed of one part cement to two parts coarse sand applied in a layer $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 inch thick. This must be put in place with the last course of concrete.
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	CALCULATIONS OF STRESSES
SPAN.	No.39. In the calculation of stresses the span of reinforced concrete beams or slabs shall be taken as the distance between centers of supports, or as the clear openings plus the depths of beam of slab, whichever is the less.
CONTRACTOR'S RESPONSIBL- ITY	No.40. The contractor shall so conduct all his operations as not to interfere with the work of other contractors, or close any thoroughfare by land or water, except by written consent of the County Commissioners or other proper authority.
	No.41. The contractor shall assume all risks of accident to men or material prior to the acceptance of the finished structurs. The contractor must remove all false-work, piling and other obstructions or unsightly material produced by his operations.
TESTS.	No.42. Before the final acceptance the Engineer may make a thorough test by passing over each structure the specified loads or their equivalent, or by resting the maximum load upon the structure for twelve hours.
	No.43. After such tests the structure must return to its original position without showing any permanent change in any of its parts.
ERECTION.	No.44. All materials, tools, appliances, machinery and suitable labor necessary for the prection of the structure according to these plans ans specifications, shall be provided
INSPECTION.	No.45. All materials shall be subject to inspection and approval according to these plans and specifications, and the Engineer shall control as to interpretation.
COMPLETION.	No.46. The work shall be completed by 1915.
FOUNDATIONS.	No.47. The wall shall be placed with reference to bed of stream on foundations not to be carried more than six inches (6) into the rock; and notify the Engineer and Commissioners of same for examination before placing any concrete. 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SPECIFICATIONS.

Location.- Said road shall be located along the line of stakes with center line 20 feet to the right thereof and corresponding to the line of the center stakes.Obstructions of every kind including trees,stumps,stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor when necessary from the road limits.Fences must be removed with the least possible damage. the grade shall be 22 feet wide or 11 feet on each side of the center line and have a crown of six inches thereto.The top of the grade shall be true and smooth and correspond with elevation to the grade line as shown in the profile and the sides shall have a slope of  $l\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 perpendicular.

Clearing &

- Grubbing.-The contractor shall remove objectionable brush, stumps, fences, boulders, stones and other materials within 20 lineal feet of the center line of the highway as directed by the Engineer.Any trees not interfering eith the construction of the highway may, subject to the discretion of the Engineer and County Commissioners, be lefy undisturbed.

The lime stone shall be broken into fragments that will pass thru a 2 inch ring but will not pass thru a 1 inch ring. The filler shall be crushed screenings, free from dirt, all of whic will pass a  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch ring, together with a sufficient proportion of dust of fracture.
  - After sub-grade has been prepared and has been accepted by the Engineer, the crushed

limestone shall be spread evenely over it. The loose limestone shall be six and ane half  $(6\frac{1}{2})$  inches thich in the center of the road and four and one-half  $(4\frac{1}{2})$  inches thisk at four and one-half  $(4\frac{1}{2})$  feet from each side of the center; four and one-half  $(4\frac{1}{2})$  inches thisk at boards shall be held to line and grade nine (9) feet apart by suitable stakes. These boards shall be used to gauge the thickness of stone at the outer edge. After they are removed the sone shall be raked out to zero thickness. The thickness of the stone at the stone at the outer edge. After they are removed the sone shall be gauged by six and one-half  $(6\frac{1}{2})$  inch cubical blocks. The **édé**ne shall be distributed neatly between the six and one-half  $(6\frac{1}{2})$  inch cubical blocks and the four and one-half inch borads.

The stone shall be rolled by a heavy farm roller making at least six trips over the whole surface of the road as directed by the Engineer.

- Top Course. The top course of lime stone screenings and dust shall be spread uniformly three and one-half (3) inches deep over the bottom course ten and one-half (10) feet wide, the stone to be raked out same as on the bottom course. Care must be taken to preserve the grade and crown and to prevent a wavy surface.
- Iron Pipe. The iron pipe, headwalls and tile shall be furnished and completed by the contractor according to plans and specifications as designated by the Engineer.
- Time.- Said work shall commence not later than August 1st.1916 and be completed by December, 1st.1916.
- Sub-contracting. No sub-contracting will be allowed except by written consent of the County Commissioners.
- Estimates.- At the end of each month providing the work is progressing satisfactorily, estimates will be made and certified to the County Commissioners by the County Engineer.At least 10 per cent will be retained until final settlement.

To the Honorable Board of Commissioners,

#### Union County, Ohio: -

Gentlemen:

As directed by your Board, I herewith submit the specifications, estimates of quantities, and cost estimates for the imptoving and macadamizing the Kenton Road, situated in Taylor and York Townships, Union County, Ohio, Decsribed as follows: - Commencing at the intersection of the Marysville and Kenton Gravel Road with the Paris and Taylor Township Ling road and at a poin on the Paris and Township line; thence in a northerly direction thru and along the lands of Morgan Shaw, Julia Hazen, Cora Ballinger, F.O.Laird, W.C.Fulington, Wm.H.Goff, Wm.Fulton etal to the intersection with the Patrick Gravel Road.

ESTIMATE ON SECTION NO.1.

ESTIMATE ON SECTION NO.2.

The Commissioners reserve the right to furnoish the spreader on the work, the contractor to pay for same, also to vary the depth of the stone to fit the condition of the road as directed by the Engineer and County Commissioners.

## INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

Bids must be made on blanks form or proposal blanks which will be furnished by the County Auditor and County Surveyor. The blank places indicated in the proposal sheet, except as otherwise noted, must be filled in, and any proposal that contains any omission, alteration or addition in writing of any condition, limitation, may be rejected.

If the bid is made by a firm, the name and place of residence of each member of the firm must be given. If made by a corporation, the names of the President, Secretary, Treasurer shall be given. One signing for a company or as the agent for another, may be required to present legal evidence of such authority, and that the company is an existing legal corporation.

Each sealed proposal shall specify the gross sum in both figures and writing, written in ink, for which the contract will be performen. The sum written in words takes precedent over figures. The price stated in the contract shall not be more than the estimated cost, and shall cover the entire cost of all materials in place and labor to be performed in order to complete in a workmanlike manner, the improvement as shown on the plans and required by the specifications.

### RESPONSIBILITY.

The contractor shall be responsible for all injuries to persons and all damages to property resulting from negnigence of himself, his employes or agents during the continuance of this contract. Before the final acceptance of this contract by the County Commissioners, the contractor shall restore all property, public or private which hea has injured during the continuance of this contract. Until final acceptance by the Commissioners the work shall be under the contractors care and charge and he sahall take every necessary and proper precaution against accident or injury to the improvement, or any aprt thereof, by the action of the elements or from any cause whatsoever, wherter arising from the ecceution or non-execution of the work. The contractor shall rebuil, repair, restore and make good, at his own expense all injuries to any protions of the work occasioned by accidental causes or any cause whatsoever, before the final acceptance of the County Commissioners.

The contractor shall provide maintain proper guards, suitable and sufficient lights and take

all necessary precaution to prevent avoidable accidents.

All the work to be done by the contractor, specified or mentioned in the specifications as well as any minor details of work not specified or specifically mentioned, but obviously necessary for the proper completion of the work, shall be considered as incidental and as being a part thereof and included in the contract.

The contrastor shall not be entitled to any extra or additional compensation.

## SPECIFICATIONS.

This is a single tracked gravel road. The surface as shown in the profile is the top of the gravel as now traveled. The surface of the old being irregular it shall be scarified where necessary and graded to the proper elevation and width, using dirt wherever the Engineer so directs.

The contractor will bid on this work in a lump sum to be completed according to the profile ans specifications and to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

The crown of the roadway shall be made six (6) inches in a width of twenty-four (24) feet and after the grade has been completed all trees and brush shall be removed from the entire area included between the lines of ditches if so directed by the Engineer, likewise all boulders that interfere with the grade shall be removed and the holes carefully filled.

## LIMESTONEC MACADAM.

The macadam surface shall consist of one course of limestone approved quality and fracture face; the stone shall be of good and uniform texture and free from rotten or inferior stone, shall be well screened and free from injurious matter and shall consist three-fourths  $(\frac{3}{4})$  inch limestone free of dust.

## AMOUNT OF MATERIALS.

After the subgrade has been prepared and accepted by the Engineer, the crushed limestone shall be spread evenly over it. The loose limestone shall be six (6) inces thich in the center of road and five (5) inches thich, six and one-half  $(6\frac{1}{2})$  feet from the side of center. Five (5) inch boards shall be held to line and grade thirteen feet apart by suitable stakes. These boards shall be used to gauge the thickness of stone at the outer edge. The thickness at the center shall be gauged by six (6) inch cubical blocks. (Engineer's Detailed Report Continued).

## CONTRACT AND BOND.

The successful bidder will be required to enter into contract and bond with good and sufficient surety,or with a surety company of reconized standing, in an amount equal to the contract prive for the proper completion of this work at the specified time and according to these specifications. The bond is also holding for all labor and materials, etc.,

## RESERVATIONS.

The County Commissioners reserve the right to place laborers and materials on the line of the work at the expense of the contractor, whenever the work is not properly progressing. The direction and decisions of the Engineer **en** all matters pertaining to the road shall be final and conclusive unless otherwise ordered by a majority of the Board of County Commissioners.

The Engineer reserves the right to change the grade and location from station 0 to station 12, and from station 85 to station 120.

RESPONSIBILITY,

The contractor shall be responsible foe all injuries to persons, and for all damages for property resulting from negligence of hinself, his employes or agents, during the continuance of this contract. B fore the final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners, the contractor shall restore all property, public or private, which he has injured during the continuance of this Contract. Until final acceptance by the Commissioners, the work shall be under the contractors care and charge, and he shall take every necessary and proper precaution against accident or injury to the improvement, or any part thereof, by the action of the elements or from any cause whatever, whether arising from the execution or non-execution of the work. The contractor shall rebuild, repair, restore and make good, at his own expense, all injuries of any portions of the work occasioned by any accidental causes, or any cause whatsoever before the final acceptance by the Commissioners. The contractor shall provide and maintain proper guards, suitable and sufficient

lights, and take all necessary precaution for the prevention of avaidable accidnets.

All the work to be done by the contractor, specified or mentioned in the specifications as well as any minor details of work not specified or specifically mentioned, but obviously necessary for the proper completion of the work, shall be considered as incidental, and as being a part thereof, and include in the contract.

The contractor will not be entitled to and extra or additional compensation.

## SPECIFICATIONS.

Location.- Said road shall be located along the line of stakes with center line 20 feet to the right thereof and corresponding to the line of center stakes. Obstructions of every kind, including trees, stumps, stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor when necessary from the poad limits. Fences must be removed with the least possible damages. Grade.- The grade shall be 22 feet wide, or 11 feet on each side of the center line, except from station 79.50 to station 87.25 and from station 99.50 to station 101, and station 149 to station 150.50 all of which shall have a grade 25 feet wide on top and have a crown 5 inches thereto.

## (Engineer's Detailed Report Continued)

The top of the grade shall be true and smooth and corres ond in elevation to the grade line as shwon on the profile and the sides shall have a slope of  $l_2^1$  to 1 perpendicular.

Clearing and Grubbing.- The contractor shall remove all objectionable brush, stumps, fences and boulders and other materials within 20 lineal feet of the center line of the roadway as directed by the engineer. Any trees not interfering with the proper construction of the highway may, subject to the discretion of the Engineer and County Commissioners, be left undisturbed.

Side Ditches. - The side ditches of gutters shall have a slope of  $l_2^1$  to 1 on the grade side and 1 to 1 on the outside and the bottom thereof shall be one (1) foot wide and kept in true line as far as possible on both sides. The bottom must be true and smooth and have a grade to conduct the water at all outlets. All ditches must be inside the toad limits, except where otherwise permitted by the Engineer and Commissioners.

Outlets. - The contracotr shall be required to cut all outlets where necessary, sufficiently far and ddep to drain the side ditches thoroly.

Examinations. - All grading must be examined and accepted by the Engineer and County Commissioners before the stone is placed thereon, and must be kept in the same condition and well floated whicle macadamizing and until the road is finally accepted. Said grade shall be examined in sections of  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile each upon the request of the contractor.

Limestone Macadam.- The macadam surface shall consist of one course of limestone of approved quality and fracture face. The stone shall be of good and uniform texture and free from rotton and inferior stone, shall be well screened and free from any injurious matter of all kinds. The limestone shall be broken into fragments that will pass thru a two (2) inch ring, bur will not pass a (1) one inch ring. The filler shall be crushed screenings, free from dirt all of which will pass a three-quarter  $(\frac{3}{4})$  inch ring together with a sufficient quanity of dust of fracture. After the sub-grade has been accepted by the Engineer, the crused lime stone shall be spread evenly over it. The loose limestone shall be seven  $\psi$ 7) inches thick in the center of the road and five (5) inches thich five (5) feet from the center of the road. Five inch boards shall be held to line and grade ten (10) feet apart by suitable stakes. These boards shall be used to gauge the thickness of the stone at the edge. After they are removed the stone shall be raked out to zero thickness. The thichness at the center shall be gauged by Seven (7) inch cubical blocks. The stone shall be neatly distributed between the seven inch cubical blocks and the five inch boards. The stone then shall be rolled with a self propelled roller weighing not less than eight tons, making at least six trips (one way) over the road as directed by the Engineer.

Top Course. - The course of limestone screenings and dust shall be spread uniformly three (3) inches thich over the bottom course eleven (11) feet wide, the stone to be raked out the same as the bottom course. Care must be taken to presenve the grade and crown to prevent a wavy surface. The stone shall then be rolled with a self propelled roller weighing not less than eight tond, making at least two trips over the whole surface of the road as directed by the Engineer.

Iron Pipe. - The iron pipe, concrete headwalls, tile and concrete culverts shall be furnished and completed by the contractors according to the plans and specifications as designated by the Engineer. Time. - Said work shall commence not later than the lst.day of May, 1916 and completed by December lst.1916.

Su-Contracting. - No sub-contracting will be allowed except by the written consent of the County Commissioners.

Estimates. - At the end of each month, providing the work is progressing properly, estimates will be made and certified to the County Commissioners by the County Engineer. At least 10 per cent will be retained until final settlement.

Contract and Bond. - The successful bidder will be required to enter into contract and bond with good and sufficient sureties, or with a surety company, of recognized standing, in an amount equal to the contract price for the proper completion of the work, t the specified time, according to these specifications. The bond is alos holding for all labor, materials, etc.,

Reservations. - The County Commissioners reserve the right to place laborers and materials on the line of the work at the expense of the contractor, whenever the work is not properly progressing, The directions and decisions of the Engineer on all matters pertaining to the road shall be final and conclusive unless countermanded by a majority of the Board of County Commissioners.



Described as follows: - Commencing at the intersection of the brick pavement on North Chillicothe Street in Plain City, Union County, Ohio, and the New California Gravel Road; thence with said Plain City and New California **Evat**el Road and the California and Bellepoint Gravel Road thru and along the lands of Rachel T.Keiser, Laura A.Kahler, James E?Curry, New California, Henry Conklin, etal, to the Delaware and Union County line.

## INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

Bids must be made on the blank form or proposal blanks which will be furnished by the Engineer or County Additor. The blank spaces indicated on the proposal sheet, except as otherwise noted, must be filled in, and any proposal that contains any ommission or addition in writing of any condition or limitation may be rejected.

If the bid is made by a firm, the mame and place of residence of each member of the firm must be given. If made by a corporation, the names of the president, secretary and treasurer must be given. One signing for a company, or as the agent of another, may be required to present legal evidence of such authority, and the company is an existing legal corporation.

As a guarantee that the successful bidder will enter into contract and furnish bond, as hereinafter provided, each proposal must be accompanied by a draft or certified check in an amount equal to 5 per cent of the amount bid. Such draft or check shall be made payable to the Auditor of Union County.

Permission will not be given to withdraw, modify or explain any proposal after it has been deposited with the Commissioners. ## RESPONSIBILITY.

The contractor shall be responsible for all injuries to persons, and all damages to property resulting from negligence of himself, his employes or agents, during the continuance of this contract. Before the final acceptance of this contract by the County Commissioners, the contractor shall restore all property, public or private, which he has injured during the continuance of this contract. Until final acceptance by the Commissioners the work shall be under the contractors care and charge and he shall take every necessary precaution against accident ot injury to the improvement, or any part thereof, by the action of the **add**ments or from any cause whatsoever, whether arising from the execution or non-execution of the work. The contractor shall rebuild, repair and make good, at his owns expense, all injuries to any portion of the work occasioned by accidental causes, or any causes whatsoever, before the final acceptance by the County Commissioners.

The contractor shall provide and maintain proper guards, suitable and sufficiant lights, and take all necessary precautions for the prevention of avoidable accidents.

All the work to be done by the contractor, specified or mentioned in the specifications as well as any minor details of work not specified or specifically mentioned, but obviously necessary for the proper completion of the work, shall be considered as incidental and as being a part thereof, and included in the contract. ## SPECIFICATIONS.

This road is now a double track, the graveled being on the northwest side of the road. The surface as shown on the profile id the top of the gravel as now traveled; All earth on each side of the graveled track shall be used to raise the side track and fills and if this is not sufficient dirt shall be taken from the side ditches, after which the graveled track shall be torn up and moved over. The contractor shall bid on this work in the lump sum to be completed according to the profile and specifications and to the satisfation of the Engineer.

### GRADE.

The surface of the road when completed, shall conform to the grade established on the profile, and cross section for this work, and the stakes set by the Engineer, The excavated material in the road way shall be used to make the fills. The width of the base of the cut and the width od the top of fills shall be about twenty-four feet, except at those stations where a greater width is shown. The cross-section of the completed work shall conform to the indicated cross-section and according to the stakes set by the Engineer. The crown of the road way shall be made six (6) inches in a width of twenty-four (24) feet.

All trees and brush shall be removed from the entire area included between the outlinde lines of the ditches, if so directed by the Engineer, likewise all boulders that interfere with the grade shall be removed and their holes carefully filled.

Where fences are in the way of the work they shall be removed by the and at the expense of the contractor whenever the property owner fails to remove the same. This work shall be carefully done, the fence material being laid back on the premises out of the way of the work. All trees, stumps, roots, brush, except fencing materials, shall be burned without damage to adjoining property. Upon completion of the work and before final acceptance all debris shall be removed from the roadway.

## EXCAVATION.

Excavation will include the grading of the roadway, dithes and side slopes the entire length of the highway to conform to the width of the lines and grade shaown on the profile and cross-section sheets, as directed by the Engineer.

All surplus excavations and waste materials shall be used to widen embankments, flatten side slopes or shall be deposited in such other places and for such purposes as the Engineer may direct.

The macadam surface shall consist of one course of limestone of approved quality and fracture faces; the stone shall be of good and uniform texture and free from rotton or inferior stone, shall be well screened and free form injuriess matter and shall consist of three-fourths  $(\frac{3}{4})$ inch limestone free of dust.

#### AMOUNT OF MATERIAL.

After the sub-grade has been prepared and accepted by the Engineer, the cru hed limestone shall be spread evenly over it. The loose limestone shall be seven (7) inches thick in the center of the road Five (5) inches thich, Six (6) feet from the side of center. Five (5) inch boards shall be hel to lien and grade twelve (12) feet apart by suitable stakes. These boards shall be used to gauge the thickness of stone at the outer edge. The thickness at the center shall be gauges by seven (7) inch cubical blocks.

## TIME.

Said work shall commence not later than Audgust 20th.1916 and be completed by December 30.1916.

#### SUB-CONTRACTING.

No sub-contracting shall be allowed except by written consent of the County Commissioners.

#### ESTIMATES.

At the end of each month, providing the work is progressing satisfactorily, estimates will be made and certified to the County Commissioners by the County Surveyor. At least 10 per cent will be retained until final settlement.

## CONTRACT AND BOND.

The successful bidder will be required to enter into contract and bond with good and sufficient sureties, or with a surety company of recognized standing, in an amount equal to the contract price for the proper completion of the work, at the specified time and according to these specifications. The bond is also holding for all materials, labor, etc.,

## RESERVATIONS.

The County Commissioners reserve the right to place laborers and materalss on the line of the work at the expense of the contractor whenever the work is nor progressing properly. The direction and decisions of the Engineer on all maters pertaining to said work shall be final and conclusive unless countermanded by a majority of the Board of County Commissioners.

## APPORTIONMENT.

To the Commissioners of Union County:

I, the undersigned County Surveyor, in obedience to your orders of ...... 191.. do hereby return a schedule of all lots and lands and corporate and public roads and railroads that will be benefited, with an apportionment of the consturction of the improvement, in money, according to the benefited resulting to each.

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

IN THE MATTER OF ISSUING PLAIN CITY-DELAWARE ROAD BONDS AGGREGATING \$16,300.00)

Mt Coons offered the following resolution and moved its adoption which was duly seconded by Mr.Burson:-

it has been heretofore determined by this Board of County Commissioners of Union County. WHEREAS. Ohio, that 35 per cent of the cost and espense of said Plain City-Delaware Road improvement shall be paid out of the Road Repair Fund of the County; that 35 per cent shall be paid out of any levy or lrvies upon the grand duplicate of townships in which said road is situated and the banance, 30 per cent, shall be assessed against and collected from the owners of real estate whose lands are within one mile of either side of said improvement and are assessed thereon according to the benefits derived therefrom, and WHEREAS. certain real estate owners assessed thereon wave for the construction of said improvement have not paid their assessments there being at this time \$7,550.00 unpaid of the 30 per cent of the cost and expense of said road improvement to be paid by said real estate owners, and all of the 35 per cent, viz:- \$8,750.00 of the cost and expense of said road improvement as levied against Jerome and Millcreek Townships; and Section 6929, Ohio Laws, Vol. 105-6 page 603 provides that the county commissioners are WBEREAS. authorized whenever in their judgement it is desirable to sell the bonds of the county in which said road improvement is located in such an amount as is necessary to pay the respective shares of the Townships and land owners whose lands are within one mile of either side of said improvement and are benefited thereby; and

RESOLVED,	with reference to said bond issue, including the character of the meetings the number of members present and such other information from the records of his office as may be necessary to determine the regularity and validity of said bond issue and to at- tach thereto a true and correct statement, certified to by him, of the amount of the tax duplicate and of the indebtedness of said Jerome and Millcreek Townships and of Union County and such other information as will show whether or not said bond issue is within any debt or tax limitation as imposed by law as provided by Section 2295-3 General Code of Ohio; and be it further, that the County Auditor shall first offer, in writing to the Industrial Commission of Ohio, this \$16,300.00 issue of bonds, at par and accrued interest; said Auditor is further instructed, that in the event thet the Industrial Commission rejects said bonds issue, he shall advertise the same for sale in the Marysville Tribune according to law. ## INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

Bids must be made on blank forms or proposal blanks which will be furnished upon request by the County Auditor of County Surveyor. The blank spaces indicated in the proposal sheet, except as otherwise indicated, must be filled in, and any proposal that contains any omission, alteration or addition in writing of any condition, or limitation may be rejected.

If the bid is made by a firm, the name and place of residence of each member of the firm must be given. If made by a corporation, the name of the President, Sectetary and Treasurer shall be given. One signing for a company or as the agent for another, may be required to present legal evidence of such authority, and that the company is an existing legal corporation.

Each sealed proposal whall specify the gross sum written in ink in both figures and words, for which the contract will be performed. The gross sum written in words to take precedence over the figures.

#### DESCRIPTION.

Commencing at the intersection of an unimproved road with the Bechtel Gravel Road at the southwest corner of the lands of Frank Watts in York Township; thence in an easterly direction with said Bechtel Gravel Road thru and along the lands of L.H.Southard, J.L.Hornbeck, etal to its intersection with the Newton and York Center Gravel Road in the Village of York; thence with said Newton and York Center Gravel Road in a southerly direction thru and along the lands of S.W.Bulen, E.J.Brooks, etal to the stone road about 20 rods south f the Lockwood and Tobey Gravel Road, a distance of about hne and one-half miles.

#### RESPONSIBILITY.

The contractor shall be responsible for injuries to persons, and for all damages to property, resulting from the negligence of himself, his employes or agents, during the continuance f this contract. Before the final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners, the contractor shall restore all property, public or private, which he has injured dueing the continuance of this contract. Until final acceptance by the Commissioners, the work shall be under the contractor85 care, and he shall take every precaution against accident or injury to the improvement, or any part thereof, by the action of the elements or from any cause whatsoever arising from the execution or non-execution of the work. The contractor shall re-baild, repair and make good, at his own expense all infuries to the work accasioned by accidental causes whatsoever before the final acceptance by the County Commissioners.

The contractor shall provide and maintain proper guards, suitable and sufficient lights, and take all necessary precautions for the prevention of avoidable accidents.

## SPECIFICATIONS. -LOCATION.

Said road shall be located along the line of stakes with center line 20 feet to the left thereof and corresponding to the center line of center stakes. Obstructions of every kind, including trees, stumps, stones, and fences shall be removed by the contractor when

necessary, from the road limits. Fences must be moved with the least possible damage. All such trees, brush and roots shall be burned without damage to the adjoining peoperty.

## GRADE.

This is an old graveled road. The surface of the old road being irregular it shall be scarifiedryhere necessary and graded to the proper elevation and width, using dirt whereever the Engineer so directs. The contractor shall bid on this work in a lump sum to be completed according to the specifications and to the satisfaction og the Engineer.

## SIDE DITCHES.

The side ditches or gutters shall be cleaned out wherever deemed necessary by the Engineer and Commissioners and shall have a slope of  $l\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 on the grade side and 1 to 1 on the outside, and the bottom thereof shall be one foot wide and kept in true lines as far as possible on both sides. The bottom must be true and smooth and have a grade to sonduct the water at all outlets. All ditches must be inside the road limits except wherever otherwise permitted by the Engineer or Commissioners.

## OUTLETS.

The contractor shall be required to cut all outlets where necessary, sufficiently far and deep to drain the side ditches thoroly.

## EXAMINATION.

All grading must be examined and accepted by the Engineer and County Commissioners before the stone is placed thereon, and must be kept in the same condition and well floated while macadamizing and until the road is finally completed, said grade shall be examined in sections of 1 mile each upon the request of the contractor.

## LIMESTONE MACADAM.

Limestone screenings of approved quality and fracture faces. The stone shall be of good and uniform texture and free from rotton or inferior stone, shall be screened and free from injurious matter of all kinds. The limestone shall be broken into fragments that will pass

thru a two and one-half  $(2\frac{1}{2})$  inch ring and be retained in a one (1) inch ring. The filler shall be of crushed screenings, free from all dirt, all of which will pass thru a three-quarter  $(\frac{3}{4})$  inch ring, together with a sufficient proportion of dust of fracture.

#### BOTTOM COURSE.

After the sub-grade has been completed and prepared and has been accepted by the Engineer, the limestone shall be spread evenaly over it, the loose limestone shall be six (6) inches thick in the center of the road and six (6) inches thick, Five (5) feet from the side of the center except from Station 35.10 to Station 51.00 where it shall be six (6) inches thich in the center of the road six (6) feet from the side of the center. Boards of a width corresponding to the specified depth of stone, shall be held to line and grade by suitable stakes. These boards shall be used to guage the thickness of stone at the outer edge. Cubical blocks of dimensions equal to the specified depth of stone shall be used to gauge the depth of stone in the center of the road.

## ROLLING.

The stone shall then be rolled with a heavy farm roller making at least six (6) trips over the whole surface of the road as directed by the Engineer.

## TOP COURSE.

The top course of limestone screenings and dust shall be spread uniformly, four (4) inch thich over the bottom course Twelve feet wide, except from Station 35.10 to Station 51.00 where it shall be four (4) inches thich over the bottom course fourteen((14) feet wide. Care must be taken to preserve the grade and crown also to prevent a wawy surface. There is to be 1,307 cubic yards screenings placed on the road. Siad amount to be measured by volume loose.

The successful bidder will be required to enter into contract and bond with good and sufficient sureties, or with a surety company of recognized standing, in an amount equal to the contract price, conditioned for the faithful performance of this contract in accordance with the plans and specifications, and within the time prescribed.

## RESERVATIONS.

The County Commissioners reserve the right to place laborers and materials, alos a spreader, on the line of the work, at the expense of the contractor, whenever the work is nor properly progressing. The directions and decisions of the Engineer in all matters pertaingin to this road improvement shall be final and conclusive unless countermanded by a majority of the Board of County Commiss oners.

Witnesseth: That the said contractor agrees for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, to furhish at his own cost, all the materials and labof necessary in the construction of the York, K.& M.Road located in York Township, Union County, Ohio, in strict conformity with the plans and specifications hereto attached, which plans and specifications have been duly adopted in accordance with Section 6939 General Code of Ohio, and are hereby made a part of this contract. And the said Contractor further agrees as follows:

First, That he will commence said work on ot before the lst.day of August, 1917, and prosecute it so as to complete same on or before the lst.day of December, 1917.

Second, that he will dorthe whole work in a thoro and workmanlike manner according to the directions of the Engineer, and to the acceptance of the Board of County Commissioners. And the said surety agrees that no extensions, alterations, changes, deductions of additions, in or to the work or the said plans and specifications within reasonable limits, shall in any wise affect the obligation of said surety on its bond.

Third, That he will claim no extra allowance for any contingencies in doing and completing the foregoing workas specified, whether said contingencies are specifically set forth herein or not.

Fourth, That the County Engineer shall be the sole judge whether the work is progressing with sufficient rapidity to insure its completion within the time specified; and if in his opinion, the work is not thus progressing, he may employ other assistance, or declare this contract forfeited, at the option of said Commissioners, and complete the work by contract or otherwise, at the sole cost of the contractor; so also, if the work is being done in an unskillful or defective manner, said engineer may employ a foreman, at the expense of said contractor to take charge of the work, and his directions shall be fully complied with.

## INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

Bids must be made on the blanks form or proposal blank which will be furnished upon request by the County Auditor or County Surveyor. The blank spaces indicated on the proposal sheet, except as otherwise indicated, must be filled in, and any proposal that contains any omission, alteration or addition in witing of any condition or limitations may not be considered.

If the bid is made by a firm, the name and address of each member of the firm must be given. If made by a corporation the names of the President, Secretary and Treasurer shall be given. One signing for a company, or as the agent for another, may be required to present legal evidence of such authority, and that the company is a legal and existing corporation.

Each sealed proposal shall specify the gross sum, written with ink in both figures and words for which the contract will be performed. The gross sum written in words takes precedent over figures.

As a guarantee that the bidder will enter into contract and give bond, as hereinafter provided, each proposal must be accompanied by a draft or certified check for 10 per cent. of the amount bid. Such draft or check shall be made payable on demand to the Auditor of Union County.

Permission will not be given to withdraw, modify or explain any proposal after it has been deposited with the Commissioners. ## DESCRIPTION.

Located in York Township, Union County, Ohio, and being in Survey No.3468,3469 etal, and commencing at the intersection of the Patrick Gravel Road with the Marysville and Kenton Gravel Road in York Township; thence in a northerly direction with said Marysville and Kenton Gravel Road thru and along the lands of Wm.Fulton, John Mulcahy, etal and thru the Village of Somerville to its intersection with the York Center and Miller Gravel Road; thence in a southwesterly direction with said York Center and Mi ler Gravel Road thru and along the lands of C.G.Morrow and L.C.Davis etal to its intersection with the York Center and Somerville Gravel Road in the Village of York a distance of about four and one-half miles.

## RESPONSIBILITY.

The contracotr shall be responsible for all injuries ro persons and damages to property, resulting from the negligence of himself, his employes or agents, during the continuance of this contract. Before the final acceptance of the swork the County Commissioners the contractor shall restore all property, public or private, which he has injured during the continuance of this contract. Until final acceptance by the County Commissioners, the work shall be under the contractor charge and care, and he shall take every necessary and proper precaution against accident or injury to the improvement, or any part thereof, by the action of the elements or from any cause whatsoever, whether arising from the execution or non-execution of the work. The contractor shall rebuild, repair and make good, at his own expense, all injuries to the work occaisoned by accidental causes whatsoever, before the final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners.

The contractor shall provide and maintain proper guards,s itable and sufficient lights, and take all necessary precaution for the prevention of avoidable accidents.

All the work to be done by the contractor, specified or mentioned in the specifications as well as any minor details of the work not specifically mentioned, but obviously necessary for the proper completion of the work, shall be considered as incidental, and as being a part thereof, and included in the contract.

The contractor will not be entitled to any extra or additional compensation.

## LOCATION.

Said road shall be located along the line of stakes with center line 20 feet the the

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left thereof and corresponding to the line of center stakes. Obstructions of every kind, including trees, stumps, roots, stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor when necessary from the road limits. Fences must be moved with the least possible damage. All such trees, brush and roots shall be burned without damage toadjoining property.

## GRADE.

This is an old graveled road. The surface of the old road being irregular, it shall be scarified where necessary and graded to the proper grade and elevation and width, using dirt wherewer the Engineer so directs. The contractor shall bid on this work in the lump sum to be completed according to the specifications and to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

#### SIDE DITCHES.

The side ditches or gutters shall be cleaned out wherever deemed necessary by the Engineer and Commissioners and shall have a slope of  $l\frac{1}{2}$  toll on the grade side and 1 to 1 on the outside, and the bottom thereof shall be 1 foot in width and kept in a true line as far as possible on both sides. The bottom must be true and smooth and have a grade to conduct water at all outlets. All ditches must be inside the road mimits except wherever permitted by the Engineer or Commissioners.

#### OUTLETS.

The contractor shall be required to cut all outlets where necessary, sufficiently far and deep to drain the side ditches thoroly.

#### EXAMINATION.

All grading must be examined and accepted by the Engineer and County Commissioners before the stone is placed thereon, and must be kept in the same condition and well floated while macadamizing and until the road is finally completed, said grade shall be examined in sections of one-half mile each upon the request of the contractor.

## LIMESTONE MACADAM.

The macadam surface shall consist of two courses of limestone and limestone screenings of approved quality and fracture faces. The stone shall be of good and uniforn texture and free from rotton and inferior stone, and shall be well screened and shall be free from injurious substances of all kinds. The limestone shall be broken into fragments what will pass

thru a two and one-half inch ring and be retained on a one inch ring. The filler shall bbe crushed screenings, free from dirt, all of which will pass a three quarter  $(\frac{3}{4})$  inch ring, together with a sufficient portion of dust of fracture.

## BOTTOM COURSE.

After the sub-grade has been prepared and has been accepted by the Engineer, the limestone shall be spread evenly over it, Fron Sta.O to Sta.187.53 (Baileys Corners) the loose limestone shall be six (6) inches thich in the center of the road and six (6) inches, five (5) frech from the side of the side of the center . Then from Sta. 187.53 to Sta.261.50 it shall be seven (7) inches thich in the center of the road and seven (7) inches thick, four and one-half  $(4\frac{1}{2})$  feet from the side of the center. and from Sta.261.50 to Sta.279.00 it shall be six (6) inches thich in the center of the road and seven (5) feet from the side of the center. And from Sta.279.00 to Sta.284.91 it shall be six (6) inches in the center of the road and six (6) iches thick, six (6) feet from each side of the center of the road. Boards of a width corresponding to the specified depth of stone, shall be held to line and grade by suitable stakes. These boards shall be used to grage the thickness of stone at the outer edge. ## ROLLING,

The stone shall be rolled with a heavy farm roller making at least six trips (6) over the whole surface of the road as directed by the Engineer.

## TOP-COURSE.

The topr course of limestone and screenings and dust shall be spread uniformly. From Sta.O to Sta.187.53 (Bailey's corners) it shall be four (4) inches thick over the bottom course twelve (12) feet wide, then from Sta.187.53 to Sta.261.50 it shall be four (4) inches thick over the bottom course eleven (11) feet wide, then from Sta.261.50 to Sta.279.00 it shall be four (4) inches thick over the bottom course twelve (12) feet wide, then from Sta.279.00 to Sta.284.91 it shall be four (4) inches thich over the bottom course and fourteen feet wide. Care must be taken to preserve the grade and crown and also to preventea wavy surface. There is to be 4,238 cu.yds. of screenings and will be estimated by the volume loose.

#### RESERVATIONS.

The County Commissioners reserve the right to place laborers and materials, also a spreader, on the line of the work, at the expense of the contractor, whenever the work is not properly progressing. This contract made this 15th.day of March, 1917, between the County of Union, by the Commissioners of said County, and L.G.Rockhold, Contractor:

Witnesseth: That the said contractor agrees for the consideration hereinafter mentionedmto furnish, at his own cost and expense, all materials and labor necessary in the construction of the Boundary road, located in York, Claibourne and Jackson Townships, Union County, Ohio in strict conformity to the plans and specifications hereto attached, which plans and specifications have been duly adopted in accordance with Section 6939 General Code of Ohio, and are hereby made a part of this contract. And the said contractor further agrees:

lst.- That he will commence said work on or before the 30th day of M arch,1917 and prosecute it so as to complete same on or before the lst.day of December,1917.

2nd.- That he will do the whole work in a thoro and workmanlike manner, according to the diresction of the Engineer, and to the acceptance of the County Commissioners. And the said surety agrees that no changes, alterations, extensions, deductions or additions, in or to the work or the said plans and specifications within reasonable limits, shall in any wise affect the obligation of said surety on its bond.

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## RESPONSIBILITY.

The contractor shall be responsible for all injuries to persons, and all damages to property resulting from the nigligence of himself, his employes or agents, during the continuance of this contract. Before the final acceptance of this work by the County Commissioners, the contractor shall restore all property, public or private, which he has injured during the continuance of said contract. Until final acceptance by said Commissioners the work shall be under the contractors charge and care and he shall take every necessary and proper precaution against accident or injury to the improvement, or any part thereof, by the action of the & ements or form any cause whatsoever, whether arising from the execution or non-execution of the work. The contractor shall rebuild, repair and make good, at his own expense, all injuries to the work accasioned by the accidental causes, or any causes whatsoever, before the final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners.

The contractor sahll provide and maintain proper guards, suitable lights, and take all necessary precautions for the prevention of avoidable accidents.

All of the work to be done by said contractor, specified or mentioned in the specifications as well as any minor details of work no specifically mentioned, obviously necessary for the completion of the work, shall be considered as incidental, and as being a part thereof, and included therein, the contract.

The contractor shall not be entitled to any extraeor additional compensation.

## LOCATION.

Said road shall be located along the line of stakes with the center 20 feet to the right thereof and corresponding to the line of center stakes. Obstructions of every kind including, trees, stumps, stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor when necessary, from the road limits. Fences must be removed with the least possible damafe.

#### GRADE.

The grade shall be 22 feet in width or 11 feet on each side of the center line, and have a crown of 6 inches thereto. The top of the grade shall be true and smooth and correspond in elevation to the grade line as shown in the profile and the side shall have a slope of  $l_{\pm}^{4}$  to 1 per pendicular.

#### SIDE DITCHES.

The side ditches or gutters shall have a slope of  $l\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 on the grade side and 1 to 1 on the outside, and the bottom thereof shall be 1 foot in width and kept in true lines as far as possible on both sides. The bottom must be true and smooth and have a grade to conduct the water at all outlets. All ditches must be indide the road limits except where otherwise permitted by the Engineer and Commissioners.

#### OUTLETS.

The contractor shall be required to cut all outlets where necessary sufficiently far and deep to drain the side ditches thoroly.

#### EXAMINATIONS.

All grading to be examined and accpeted by the Engineer and County Commissioners before the gravel is placed thereon and kept in the same condition and well floated while gravelling and until the road is finally completed and accpeted. Said grade shall be examined in sections of  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile each upon the request of the contractor.

### GRAVEL.

The gravel shall be of good quality, free from top dirt, loam or clay, and all boulders measuring over 4 inches in diameter must be excluded and all others raked in the bottom layer. The gravel must be placed on the grade, and be spread and true and even 10 feet wide, 14 inches thick in the center, and 8 inches deep on the sides being full five and three-fifths yards to the rod.

### GRADE.

The commissioners and Engineer reserve the right to place a spreader on said work at the expense of the contractor. At the terminals and road intersections 100 yards extra shall be placed to make good approaches.

#### IRON PIPE.

The iron pipe, concrete headers, drain tile, etc., shall be furnished by the contractor on the line of the work and must be placed by the contractor on the grade as designated by the Engineer.

### TIME.

#### SUB-CONTRACTING.

No sub-contracting will be alloed except by written consent of the County Commissioners.

## ESTIMATES.

At the end of each month, providing the work is pro gressing satisfactorly, estimates will be made and certified to the County Commissioners by the Engineer. At least 10 per cent will be retained until final seitlement.

#### CONTRACT AND BOND.

The successful bidder will be required to enter into contract and bond with good and sufficient surety, or with a surety company of recognized standing, in an amount equal to the estimates contract price, conditioned for the faithful performance of his contract in accordance with the plans and specifications and within the time prescribed.

### RESERVATIONS.

(1) The County Commissioners and Engineer reserver the right to make any changes they desire in said work and a corresponding change will be made in the price paid for the same. (2) The Commissioners and Engineer reserve the right to palce laborers and materials on the line of work at the expense of the contractor if the work is not properly progressing. (3) The directions and decisions of the Engineer on all matters pertaining to said road shall be final and conclusive unless countermanded by a majority of the Board of County Commissioners.



Witnesseth: That the said contractor agrees for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, to furnish at his own cost and expense, all the labor and materials necessary in the construction of the Askins Road Improvement located in Leesburg Township, Union County, Ohio, in strict conformity with the plans and specifications hereto attached, which plans and ppecifications have been duly adopted in accordance with Section 6939, General Code of Ohio, and are hereby made a part of this contract. And the contractor further agrees as follows:-

Bids must be made on blank forms furnished by the Commissioners. The blank spaces indicated in the proposal sheet, except as otherwise noted, must be filled out, and any proposa that contains any omission, alteration or addition in writing of any condition or limitation may be rejected.

If the bid is made by a firm, the name and place of residence of each member of the firm must be given; if made by a corporation the name of the resident, secretary and treasurer shall be given. One signing for a company or as the agant of another, may be required to present leggl evidence of such authority, and that the company is a legal existing company.

Each sealed proposal shall specify the gross sum, written in ink, in both figures and words, for which the contract will be performed. The gross sum written in words takes precedent over figures.

### RESPONSIBILITY.

The contractor shall be resonsible for all injuries to persons, and for all damages to property, resulting from negligence of himself, his employes or agents, during the continuance of this contract. Before the final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners, the contractor shall restore all property, public or private, which he has injured during the continuance of this contract. Until final acceptance of the work by the Commissioners, the work shall be under the contractor's charge and care, and he shall take every necessary, proper precaution against accident or injury to the improvement, or any part thereof, by the action of the **atem**ents or from any cause whatsoever, whether arising from the execution or non-execution of the work. The contractor shall repair, rebuild and make good, at his own expense, all injuries to the work occasioned by accidental cause whatsoever, before the final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners.

The contractor shall provide and maintain proper guards, suitable and sufficient lights, and take all necessary precaution for the prevention of avoidable accidents.

All the work to be done by the contractor, specified or mentioned in the specifications as well as any minor details of work not specifically mentioned, but obviously necessary for the proper completion of the work, shall be considered incidental, and as being a part of, and included in the contract.

The contractor will not be entitled to any extra or additional compensation.

#### LOCATION.

Said road shall be located along the line of stakes with center line 20 feet to the left thereof and corresponding to the line of center stakes. Obstructions of every kind, including trees, stumps, stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor, when necessary, from the road limits. All such trees, brush and roots shall be burned without damage to the adjoining property. Fences must be removed with the least possible damage.

### GRADE.

The grade shall be 20 feet wide or 10 feet on each side of the line of center stakes, and have a crown of 6 inches thereto. The top of the grade shall be true and smooth and correspond in elevation to the grade line as shown by the profile and the side shall have a slope of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 perpendicular. On each fill of over 1 foot the grade shall be widened 1 foot for each additional foot in height to allow for sloughing.

#### SIDE DITCHES.

The side ditches or gutters shall have a slope of  $l_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$  to 1 on the grade side, and 1 to 1 on the outside, and the bottom thereof shall be 1 foot wide in the bottom and kept in true lines as far as possible on both sides. The bottom must be true and smooth and have a grade to conduct the water at all outlets. All ditches must be inside the road limits, except where otherwise permitted by the Engineers and Commissioners.

### OUTLETS.

The contractor **b**hall be required to cut all outlets where necessary, sufficient far and deep to drain the side ditches thorooly.

## (Engineer's Detailed Report Continued).

## EXAMINATION.

All grading must be examined and accepted by the Engineer and County Commissioners before the stone is placed thereon, and must be kept in the same condition and well floated while macadamizing and until the road is finall accepted. Said grade shall be examined in sections of  $\frac{1}{2}$  half mile upon the request of the contractor.

#### LIMESTONE MACADAM.

The macadam surface shall consist of two courses of limestone and limestone screenings of approved quality and fracture faces. The stone shall be of good and uniform texture and free from rotton and inferior stone, shall be well screened and free from injurious matter of all kinds. The limestone shall be broken into fragments that will pass thru a two inch ring (2). The filler shall be crushed screenings, free from dirt, all of which will pass a one-hals  $(\frac{1}{2})$  inch ring, together with a sufficient portion of dust of fracture.

#### BOTTOM COURSE.

After the sub-grade has been prepared and has been accepted by the Engineer, the limestone shall be spread evenly over it; the loose limestone shall be five (5) inches thick in the center of the road and five inches thick four and one-half feet from the side of the center. Five (5) inch boards shall be held to line by suitable stakes. These boards shall be used to gauge the thickness of the stone at the outer edge. The thickness at the center shall be guaged by five (5) inch cubical blocks. The stone shall be evenly distributed between the five (5) inch cubical blocks and the five (5) inch boards.

#### ROLLING.

The stone shall be rolled with a large farm roller making at least six (6) trips over the whole surface f the road as directed by the Engineer.

#### TOP COURSE.

The top course of limestone screenings and dust shall be spread uniformly four (4) inches thick over the bottom course fine (9( feet wide,(there being 1,270. cubic yards of screenings and the Engineer will estimate the same by freight weights estimating 2,600 pounds equal one square yard) care must be taken th preserve the grade and crowm and also to prevent a wavy surface.

#### CULVERTS.

The drain tile, pipe, culverts and headers shall be furnished by the contractor, on the line of the work and must be placed by the contractor on the grade as designed by the Engineer, and according to the plans for the same, enclosed in the Engineer's report.

Mr.Burson offered the following resolution and moved its adoption which was duly second-

ed by Mr.Coons:-

- it has been heretofore determined byathis Board of County Commissioners of Union County, WHEREAS. Ohio, that 50 per cent of the cost and expense of said road improvement shall be paid out of the proceeds of any levy or levies upon the grand duplicate of Leesburgn Township for road purposes, and the bahance, 50 per cent, to be assessed against and collected from the owners of real estate whose lands are within one mile of either side of said road improvement and are assessed thereon according to the benefits derived therefrom, and certain real estate owners assessed on said road improvement have not paid their as-WHEREAS, sessments in cash there being at this time \$2,900.00 unpaid of the 50 per cent of the cost and expense of said road as assessed against the land owners and all of the 50 per cent.viz:-\$3,800.00 as levied against Leesburg Township; and
- Section 6929, Ohio Laws, Vol. 105-6 page 603, provides that the County Commissioners are WHEREAS, authorized whenever in their judgement it is desirable to sell the bonds of the County in which said road is located and in such an amount as is necessary to pay the respective shares of the Township and of the real estate owners whose assessments remain unpaid; and in the judgement of said County Commissioners it is desirable and necessary to sell the WHEREAS, bonds of said Union County, Ohio, aggregating \$ 6,700.00 for the purpose of paying and to pay the respective sahres of Leesburg Township and of the owners of real estate whose assessments remain unpaid, of the cost and expense of the Askins Road; therefore be it by the Commissioners of Union County, Ohio, that there be issued the bonds of Union County RESOLVED. Ohio, aggregating \$6,700.00 under the aforesaid sections of Ohio Laws, for the purpose of providing funds forpay the cost and expense of constructing the Askins road. And that all bonds shall be dated October 1st.1917 and bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and be denominated as follows: - 10 bonds of \$670.00 each and to mature as follows:- \$670.00 payable on the 1st day of April and October if the years 1918,1919,1920,1921 and 1922.

That all bonds be denominated the "Askins Stone and Gravel Road Construction" bonds, and be numbered from Forty-twp (42) to Fifty-one (51), both inclusive.

ASKINS ROAD. (

(Leesburg Twp).

Said bonds shall be signed by the County Commissioners and countersigned by the County Auditor who shall affix his signature in fac-simile to the coupons thereof. Said bonds shall be sold according to law, for not less than par and accrues interest to date of delivery and the proceeds therefrom shall be applies and used to pay the cost and expense of constructing the Askins road and for no other purpose. The Auditor is directed to keep a separate account of said improvement in a book to be kept for that purpose and the proceeds form these bonds to be entered therein to the credit of the "Askins Road Construction" Fund; and be it further

RESOLVED.

that a tax shall be and hereby is levied against all the taxable property of Union County sufficient to pay the County's share of the interest on said bonds as it becomes due and to create and maintain a sinking fund for the redemption of the bonds at maturity; and thaere shall be and hereby levied against all the taxable property of said Union County sufficient to pay any deficiency in the payment or collection of special assessments hereinbefore mentioned; also there shall be and hereby is levied a tax upon all the property of Leesburg Township sufficient to pay said Township's share of the interest on said bonds as it becomes due and to create and maintain a sinking fund for the redemption of the bonds at maturity.

Said taxes shall be and hereby is levied, certified and extended upon the duplicate of Union County, Ohio and shall be collected by the same officers, at the same time and in the same manner as is taxes for general purposes, extended, cettified and collected; and be it further



This Contract, Made this fourteenth day of July, 1917 between the County of Union, State of Ohio, and Carey & Mulvaine, Contractor:

Witnesseth, That the said contractor agrees for the consideration hereinafter mentioned to furnish, at his own cost and expense, all the labor and materials necessary in the construction of the Moore and Barbour road, located in Maylor Township, Union County, Ohio, in strict conformity to the plans and specifications hereto attached, which plans and specifications have been duly adopted in accordance with Section 6939, General Code of Ohio, and are hereby made a part of this contract. And said contractor further agrees as follows:-

lst. That he will commence said work on or before the lst day of August, 1917 and prosecute it so as to complete same on or before the lst.day of December, 1917.

2nd. That he will do the whole work in a thoro and workmanlike manner, according to the directions of the Engineer, and to the acceptance of the Board of County Commissioners. 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## nRESPONSIBILITY.

The contractor shall be responsible for injuries to persons, and for all damages to property, resulting from negligence of himself, his employes or agents, during the continuance of this contract. Before the final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners, the con-tractor shall restore all property, public or private, which he has injured during the contin-uance of this contract. Until final acceptance of this by the Commissioners, the work shall be under the contractor's care and charge, and he shall take every necessary precaution against accident or injuty to the improvement, or any part thereof, by the action of the elements or from any cause whatsoever, whether arising from the execution or non-execution of the work.

The contractor shall rebuild, repair and make good , at his own expense, all injuries to the work occasioned by accidental causes whatsoever before the final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners.

The contractor shall provide and maintain proper guards, suitable lights, and take all necessary precaution for the prevention of avoinable accidents.

All the work to be done by the contractor, specified or mentioned in the specifications as well as any monor details of work not specifically mentioned, but obviously necessary for the proper completion of the work, shall be considered incidental, and as being a part of, and included in the contract.

## SPECIFICATIONS.

Location .- Said road shall be located along the line of stakes with the center line 20 feet to the right thereof and corresponding to the line of center stakes. Obstructions of every kind including trees, stumps, stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor when necessary from the road limits. Fences must be removed with the least possible damage. Grade. - The grade shall be twenty feet wide or 10 feet on each side of the center line, and have a crown of 6 inches thereto. Examinations. - All grading to be examined and accepted by the Engineer and Commissioners before the gravel is placed upon the graze and kept in the same condition and well floated while graveling and until the road is finally completed. Said grade shall be examined din sections of  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile each upon the request of the contractor. Gravel. - The gravel shall be of good quality, free from top dirt, loam or clay, and all boulders measuring over 4 inches in diameter must be excluded and all others carefully raked in the bottom layer. The gravel must be placed on the grade and spread true and even 10 feet wide, 14 inches thich in the center and 8 inches deep at the sides being full five and three-fifths yards to the rod. Grade. - The Commissioners and Engineer reserve the right to place a spreader on the work at the expense of the contractor. At the terminals and road intersections, 12 yards extra shall be placed to make good approaches. 

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## SPECIFICATIONS.

LOCATION. Said road shall be located along the line of stakes with center line 20 feet to the right thereof and corresponding to the center line of stakes. Obstructions of every kind, including trees, stumps, stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor when necessary from the road limits. Fences must be removed with the least possible damage. All such trees, brush, roots, etc., shall be burned without damage to the adjoining territory.

GRADE. The grade shall be 20 feet wide or 10 feet on each side of the benter line(except from Sta. 23 to Sta.27 and from Sta.37.to Sta341.50 and from Sta.193 to Sta 198 and in all places when the old and new fills exceed 2 feet the grade shall be 22 feet in width on the top) and have a crown of 6 inches thereto. The top of the grade shall be true and smooth and correspond in elevation to the grade line as shown by the profile and the sides shall have a slope of  $l\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 perpendicular. On each fill of over 1 feet the grade shall be widened 1 foot for each additional foot in height to allow for sloughing.

SIDE DITCHES. The side ditches shall have a slope of  $l\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 on the grade side and 1 to 1 on the outside and the bottom thereof shall be 1 foot wide and kept in true lines as far as possible on both sides. The bottom must be true and smooth and have a grade to conduct water at outlets. All ditches must be inside the road limits except where otherwise permitted by the Engineer or Commissioners.

OUTLETS. The contractor shall be required to cut all outlets where necessary, sufficiently far and deep to drain the side ditches thoroly.

EXAMINATION. All grading must be examined and accepted by the Engineer and County Commissioners before the stone is placed thereon, and must be kept in the same condition and well floated while macadamizing and untill the road is finally completed. Said grade shall be examined in sections of one-half miles each upon the request of the contractor.

LIMESTONE MACADAM. The macadam surface shall consit of two courses of limestone and limestone screenings of approved quality abd fracture faces. The stone shall be of good quality and free from injurious matter of any kind. The limestone shall be broken into fragments that will pass thru a two 92 inch ring and be retained upon one 91 inch rong. The filler shall be of screen-ings, free from dirt, all of which will pass thru a one-half  $(\frac{1}{2})$  inch ring, together with a sufficient portion of dust of fracture.

BOTTOM COURSE. After the sub-grade has been prepared and has been accepted by the Engineer, the limestone shall be spread evenly over it, the loose limestmne shall be five (5) inches thick in the center of the road and five (5) inches thick, four and one-half feet from the side of the center. Five (5) inch boards shall be held to the line and grade 9 feet apart by sutiable stakes. These boards shall be used to gauge the thickness of the stone at the outer edge. The thickmess at the center shall be gauged by five (5) inch cubical blocks. The stone shall be evenly distributed between the five inch cubical blocks and the five inch boards.

ROLLING. The stone shall then be rolled with a heavyyfarm roller making at least six (6) trips over the whole surface of the road as directed by the Engineer.

TOP COURSE. The top course of limestone screenings and dust shall be spread uniformly four (4) inches thick over the bottom course ten (10) feet wide (there is to be 3130 cubic yards of screenings and the Engineer will estimate the same by the freight weights estimating 2600 lbs to equal 1 cubic yard) care must be taken to preserve the grade and crown and to prevent a wavy surface. CULVERTS. The drain tile,culverts,pipe and headers shall be furnished by the contractor on the line of the work and placed by the contractor on the grade as designated by the Engineer and according to the plans for the same enclosed in the Engineer's report.

SUB-CONTRACTING. No sub-contracting will be allowe except by written consent of the County Commissioners.

ESTIMATES. At the end of each month, providing the work is progressing satisfactorly, estimates will be made and certified to the County Commissioners by the Engineer. At least 10 per cent will be retained until final settlement.

CONTRACT AND BOND. The successful bidder will be required to enter into contract and bond with the good and sufficient sureties, or with a surety company of recognized standing, in an amount equal to the contract dprice, conditioned for the faithful performance of his contract and in accordance with the plans and specifications, and within the time prescribed.

RESERVATIONS. The County Commissioners reserve the right to place laborers and materials (also a spreader) on the line of the work at the expense of the contractor, whenever the work is not properly progressing. The direction oand decision of the Engineer shall be final and conclusive unless otherwise ordered by a majority of the County Commissioners.

The County Commissioners and Engineer also reserve the right to change the size of the materials used. The right to change the center line of the road is reserved by the Engineer.

IN THE MATTER OF A RESOLUTION TO SELL WENGER ROAD BONDS AGGREGATING \$17,160.00

Mr. Coons offered the following resolution and moved its adoption which was duly seconded by Mr.Burson: -

it has heretofore been determined by this Board of County Commissioners of Union County WHEREAS. Ohio, that 50 per cent of the cost and expense of said road improvement shall be paid out of the proceeds of any levy or levies upon the grand duplicate of Darby and Herome Townships and the balance or 50 per cent shall be assessed against and collected from the owners of real estate whose lands are within one mile of either side of said improvement and are assessed thereon according to the benefits which result therefrom, and certain real estate owners assessed thereon have not paid theri assessments in cash. WHERAS, there being at this time \$8,500.00 unpaid of the 50 per cent of the cost and expense of said improvement as is to be paid by said real estate owners and all of the 50 per cent, viz:-\$8,660.00 of the cost and expense assessed against said Darby and Jerome Townships; and

Section 6929 of Ohio Laws, Vol. 105-6 page 603 provides that the County Commissioners WHEREAS. are authorized, whenever in their judgement it is desirable and necessary to sell the bonds of the county in which said improvement is located and in such an amount as is necessary to pay the respective shares of the Townships and the real estate owners whose assessments remain unpaid; and

in the judgement of the Commissioners of Union County, Ohio, that there be issued bonds WHEREAS. of said Union County. Ohio, aggregating \$17,160.00 for the purpose of providing funds to pay the respective shares of the Townships and real estate owners of the cost and expense of said Wenger road that remain unpaid; so therefore be it

by the Commissioners of Union County, Ohio, that there be issued bonds of Union County RESOLVED. Ohio, aggregating \$17.160.00 under the aforesiad Sections of Ohio Laws, for the purpose of providing funds torpayethencostcandnexpense of constructing the Wenger road. And that all bonds be dated October 1st.1917 and bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually and be in denominations as follows :- Thirty bonds of \$560.00 each and one bond of \$360.00; same to mature as follows: - \$1680.00 payable one the 1st.day of April and October of the years 1918,1919,1920,1921 and 1922 and \$360.00 payable on the 1st.day of April, 1923. "That all said bonds shall be denominated "The Wenger Stone and Gravel Road Construc-tion" bonds and be numbered from Eleven(11) to Forty-one (41) both inclusive. Both principal and interest payable at the office of the County Treasurer, Marysville, Ohio, Said bonds shll be signed by the County Commissioners and Counter-signed by the County Auditor who shall affix signature in fac-simile to the coupons thereof. Said bonds shall be sold according to law, for notless than par and accrued interest to date of delivery and the proceeds therefrom shall be applied and used to pay the cost and expense of constructing the Wenger road and for no other purpose. The county Auditor is directed and required to keep a separate account of said road in a back to be kept for that purpose and the proceeds from this sale tenteredpt therein to the credit of the Wenger road Construction fund; and be it further RESOLVED. that a tax shall be and hereby is levied upon all the taxable property of Union County sufficient to pay the County's share of the interest n said bonds as it becomes due and to create and maintain a sinking fund for the redemption of the bonds at maturity: also there shall be and hereby is levied a tax on all the property of Union County sufficient to cover any deficiency in the collection or payment of any special assessments as heretofore mentioned and also there shall be and hereby is levied a tax upon all the taxable property of Darby and Jerome Townships sufficient to pay the Townships share of the interest on said bonds as it becomes due and to create and maintain a inking fund for the redemption of the bonds at maturity.



The contractor rebuild, repair and make good, at his own expense, of all injuries to the work occasioned by accidental causes whatsoever, before the final acceptance of the work by the County Commissioners. . The contractor shall provide and maintain proper guards, suitable and sufficient

lights, and take all necessary precautions for the prevention of avoidable accidents.

All work to be done by the contractor, specified or mentioned in the specifications as well as any minor details of work not specifiedly mentioned, but obviously necessary for the proper completion of the work, shall be considered incidental, and as being a part of, and included in the contract.

The contractor will not be entitled to any extra or additional compensation.

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## SPECIFICATIONS.

#### LOCATION.

Said raod shall be located along the line of stakes with center line 20 feet to the left thereof and corresponding to the line of center stakes. Obstructions of every kind, including trees, stupms, stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor whenever necessary from the road lilits. Fences must be removed with the least possible damage. All such trees, brush and roots shall be burned without damage to the adjoining property. GRADE.

This is an old gravered road. The surface of the old road being irregular it shall be scarified where necessary and graded to the proper elevation and width, using dirt wherever the Engineer so directs. The contractor will bid on this work in a lump sum to be completed according to the specifications and to the satisfaction of the Engineers. SIDE DITCHES.

The side ditches shall be cleaned out whereever deemed necessary by the Engineer and Commissioners and shall have a slope of 12 to 1 on the grade side and 1 to 1 on the outside, and the bottom thereof shall be 1 foot wide and kept in true line as far as possible oj both sides. The bottom must be true and smooth and have a grade to conduct the water at all outlets. All ditches must be inside the road limits except where otherwise permitted by the Engineer and Commissioners.

OUTLETS. The contractor shall be required to cut all outlets necessary, sufficiently far and deep to drain the side ditches thoroly.

EXAMINATION. All grading must be examined and accepted by the Engineer and County Commissioners before the stone in placed thereon, and must be kept in the same condition and well floated while macadamizing and until the road is finally accepted, said grade shall be examined in sections of one-half mile each upon request of the contractor.

LIMSTONE MACADAM. The macadam surface shall consist of two courses of limestone and limestone screenings of approved quality and fracture faces. The stone shall be of good and uniform texture and free from rotton or inferior stone, shall be well screened and free from dirt and injurious matter of all kinds. The limestone shall be broken into fragments that will pass thru a two (2) inch ring. The filler shall be of crushed screenings, free from dirt, all of which will pass thru a three-quarter (3) inch ring, together with a sufficient proportion of dust of fracture.

BOTTOM COURSE. After the sub-grade has been prepared and has been accepted by the Engineer and

Commissioners, the limestone shall be spread evenly over it, the loose limestone shall be four (4) inches thich in the center of the road, four (4) inches thick four (4) feet from the side of the center; four (4) inch boards shall be held to the line of the grade 9 feet apart by suitable stakes. These boards shall be used to gauge the thickness of the limestone at the outer edge. The thickness shall be gauged at the center by 4 inch cubical blocks. The stone shall be evenly distributed between the four inch cubical blocks and the four inch boards.

ROLLING. The stone then shall be rolled with a heavy farm roller making at least six (6) trips over the whole surface of the road as directed by the Engineer.

TOP COURSE. The top course of limestone screenings and dust shall be spread uniformly four (4) inches thick over the bottom course eleven (11) feet wide (there is to be 2330 cubic yards of screenings and the engineer will estimate the same by freight weights estimating 2600 pounds to equal one cibic yard); care must be taken to preserve the grade and crown, also prevent a wavy surface.

SUB-CONTRACTING. No sub-contracting will be allowed without the written consent of the County Commissioners.

ESTIMATES. At the end of each month, providing the work is progressing satisfactorily, estimates will be made and certified to the county commissioners by the Engineer. At least 10 per cent will be retained until final settlement.

CONTRACT AND BOND. The successful bidder will be required to enter into contract and bond for good and sufficient sureties, or with a surety company, of recognized standing in an amount equal to the contract price, conditioned for the faithful performance of the contract in accordance with the plans and specifications, and within the time prescribed. time

RESERVATIONS. The county commissioners reserve the right to place laborers and tmaterials (abso a spreader) on the line of work at the expense of the contractor, whenever the work is not properly progressing. The direction and decision of the Engineer on all matters pertaining to said road shall be final and conclusive, unless otherwise ordered by a majority of the Commissioners. The County Commissioners and Engineer reserve the right to change the size of the materials used.

Hamilton Contractor: Witnesseth: That the said contractor agrees for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, to furnish at his own cost and expense, all the materials and labor necessary in the construction of the Marysville and Raymond road located in Paris Township, Union County, Ohio, and in strict conformity to the plans and specifications hereto attached, which plans and specificatiosn have been duly adopted by and in accordance with Section 6939, General Code of Ohio, and are hereby made a part of this contract. And the said contractor further agrees as follows:-First. #### LOCATION.

Said road shall be located along the line of stakes with center line about 20 feet to the left thereof and corresponding to the line of center stakes. Obstructions of every kind includung, trees, stumps, stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor when necessary, from the road

limits; fences must be removed with the least possible damage. All such trees, brush and roots shall be burned without damage to adjoining property.

#### GRADE.

This is an old graveled road. The surface of the old road being irregular it shall be scarified where necessary and graded to the proper elevation and width, using dirt wherever the Engineer so directs. The contractor shall bid on the work in a lump sum to be completed according to the specifications and to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

#### SIDE DITCHES.

The side ditches or gutters shall be cleaned out where deemed necsaary by the Engineer and Commissioners and shall have a slope of  $l_{\Xi}^{\frac{1}{2}}$  to 1 on the grade sie and 1 to 1 on the outside and the bottom thereof shall be 1 ffot wide in the bottom and to be kept in a true line as far as possible on both sides. The bottom must be true and smooth and have a regular grade so as to conduct the water at all outlets. All ditches must be indise the road limits unless permitted otherwis by the Engineer and Commissioners.

#### OUTLETS.

The contractor shall be required to cut all outlets where necessary, sufficiently far and deep to drain the side dutches thoroly.

#### EXAMINATION.

All grading must be examined and accepted by the Engineer and County Commissioners before the stone is placed thereon, and must be kept in the same condition and well floated while macadamizing until the road is finally completed, said grade shall be examined in sections of onehal mile upon request of the contractor.

#### LIMSTONE MACADAM.

The macadam shall consist of two cour ses of limestone and limestone screenings of approved quality and fracture faces. The stone shall be of good quality, unifor texture and free from rotton or inferior stone, shall be well screened and free from injurious matter of all kinds. The limestone shall be broken in fragments that will pass thru a two (2) inch ring and be retained upon a ..... ring. The screenings free from dirt all of which will pass a three-quarter  $(\frac{3}{4})$  inch ring, together with a sufficient proportion of fust of fracture.

## BOTTOM COURSE.

After the sub-grade has been prepared and has been accepted by the Engineer and Commissioners the limestone shall be spread evenly over it, the loos limestone shall be four (4) inches thick in the middle of the road and four (4) inches thich four and one-half  $(4\frac{1}{2})$  feet from the side of the center; four (4) inch hoards shall be held to the grade 9 feet apart by suitable stakes. These boards shall be used to gauge the thickness of stone at the outer edge ; the thickness of stone in the center shall be gauged by four (4) inch cubical blocks. The stone shall be evenly distributed between the four inch boards and the four inch cubical blocks.

#### ROLLING.

The stone shall be rolled with a heavy farmeroller amking at least six (6) trips over the whole surface of the road as directed by the Engineer.

#### TOP COURSE.

The top course of limestone screenings and dust shall be spread uniformly four (4) inches thick over the bottom course eleven (11) feet wide (there' is to be 2330 cubic yards of screenings and the Engineer will estimate the same by freight weights estimating 2600 pounds equal one cubic yard); care must be taken to preserve the grade and crown and also to prevent a wavy surface.

I, the undersigned Engineer, inobedience to your orders have made a survey of said road and I have made note of the intersections of lines and boundaries, land marks, bridges, and culverts, and I herwith make report of the same with plans, plats, profiles, estimates of quantities, specifications and apportionment of the cost of the same.

## DESCRIPTION.

Commencing at the intersection of the Watkins and Claifornia Gravel Road with the Watkins and Delaware Gravel Road at Watkins in Millcreek Township; thence with said Watkins and California gravel Road in a southerly direction thru and along the lands of Philemon Tossey, W.C.Henderson etal to the Jerome Township line, a distance of about two miles.

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INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

Bids must be made on blank forms which may be obtained at the office of the County Auditor or county Surveyor. 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## SPECIFICATIONS.

#### LOCATION.

Said road shall be located along the line of stakes with center line 20 feet to the right thereof and corresponding to the line of center stakes. Obstructions of every kind, including trees, stumps, stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor when necessary from the road limits. Fences must be removed with the least possible damage. All such trees, brush and toots must be burned without damage to the adjoining property.

#### GRADE.

The grade shall be about 24 feet wide or 12 feet on each side of the center stakes, and have a crwon of six inches thereto. The top of the grade shall be true and smooth and correspond in elevation to the grade line as shown by the profile and the sides shall have a slope of  $l\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 per-pendicular. On each fill of over one foot, the grade shall be widened one foot for each additional foot in height to allow for eloughing.

#### SIDE DITCHES.

The side ditches of gutters shall have a slope of  $l\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 on the grade side and 1 to 1 on the outside and the bottom thereof shall be true and smooth and one foot wide in the bottom and kept in true lines as far as possible on both sides. The bottom must be true and smooth and have a regular grade to conduct water at all outlets. All ditches must be inside the road limits except where otherwise permitted by the Engineer and Commissioners.

#### OUTLETS.

The contractor shall be required to cut all outlets where necessary, sufficiently far and deep to drain the side ditches thoroly.

#### EXAMINATION.

All grading must be examined and accepted by the Engineer and County Commissioners before the sotne as placed thereon, and must be kept in the same condition and well floated while macadamizing and until the road is finally completed. Said grade shall be examined in sections of one half mile each upon the request of the contractor.

#### LIMESTONE MACADAM.

The macadam surface shall consist of two courses of limestone and limestone screenings of approved quality and fracture faces. The stone shall be of uniform quality and free from rotton stone or inferior stone, shall be well screened and free from dirt and other injurious matter of all kinds. The limestone shall be broken into fragments that will pass thru a two (2) inch ring. The filler shall be of crushed screenings, free from dirt all of which will pass a onehalf (1) inch ring, together with a sufficient proportion of dust of fracture.

#### BOTTOM COURSE.

After the sub-grade has been prepared and has been accpeted by the Engineer, the limestone shall be spread evenly over it, the loose limestone shall be six (6) inches thick in the center of the road and six (6) inches thick four and one-half  $(4\frac{1}{2})$  feet from the side of the center Six (6) inch boards shall be held to line by suitable stakes, nine feet apart. These boards shall be used to gauge the thickness of the stone at the outer edge; the thickness at the center shall be gauged by six (6) inch cubical blocks. The stone shall be evenly distributed between the six (6) inch boards and the cubical blocks.

#### ROLLING.

The stone shall then be rolled with a heavy farm roller making at least six trips over the whole surface of the road as directed by the Engineer.

#### TOP COURSE.

The top course of limestone screenings and dust shall be spread uniformly ohree (3) inches thick over the bottom course eleven (11) feet wide; care must be taken to preserve the grade and crown and to prevent a wavy surface.

#### TIME.

Said work shall commence not later than ..... and be completed by ..... 1917.

#### SUB-CONTRACTING.

No sub-contracting shall be permitted except by written consent of the County Commissioners.

#### ESTIMATES.

At the end of each month, providing the work is staisfactorily progressing, estimates will be made and certified to the County Commissioners by the Engineer. At least 10mper cent will be retained until final settlement.

#### CONTRACT AND BOND.

And the contractor further agrees as follows:-

1st. That he will commence the work on or before the 1st day of May,1917 and prosecute so as to complete same on or before the 10th.day of December,1917.

2nd. That he will do the whole work in a workmanlike manner, according to the directions of the County Engineer, and to the accpetance of the Board of County Commissioners. And that said surety agrees that no changes, extensions, alterations, deductions or additions, in of to the work or the said plans and specifications within reasonable limits, shall in any wise affect the obligation of said surety on its bond.

## SPECIFICATIONS.

LOCATION.

Said road shall be located along the line of stakes with center line twenty feet to the right thereof and corresponding to the line of center stakes. Obstructions of every kind, including trees, stumps, stones and fences shall be removed by the contractor when necessary in from the road limits. Relices must be removed with the least possible damage. Trees, brush and roots shall be burned without damage to adjoining property.

#### GRADE.

The grade shall be about 24 feet wide or twelve feet on each side of the center line and have a grade of six inches thereto. The top of the grade shall be true and smooth and correspond in ele vation to the grade line as swown by the profile and the side shall have a slope of  $l\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 perpendicular. On each fill of over 1 foot, the grade shall be widened 1 foot for each additional foot in height to allow for sloughing.

## SIDE DITCHES.

The side ditches or gutters shall have a slope of  $l\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 on the grade side and 1 to 1 on the outside, and the bottom thereof shall be true and smooth and be 1 foot wide and kept in true lines as far as possible on both sides. The bottom must eb true and smooth and have a grade to conduct the water at all outlets. All ditches must be inside the road limits except where other wise permitted by the Engineer and Commissioners.

## OUTLETS.

The contractor shall be required to cut all outlets where necessary, sufficiently far and deep to drain the side ditches thoroly.

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#### EXAMINATION.

All grading must be examined and accepted by the Engineer and County Commissioners before the stone is placed thereon and must be kept in the same condition and well floatedw while macadamizing and until road is finally completed. Said grade shall be examined insections of  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile each upon the request of the contractor.

#### LIMESTONE MACADAM.

The macadam surface shall consist of two courses of lime stone and limestone screenings of approved quality and facture faces. The stone shall be og good and uniform texture and free from rotton and inferior stone; shall be well screened and shall be free from injurious substances of all kinds. The limestone shall be broken into fragments that will pass thru a two (2) inch ring. The filler shall be crushed screenings, free from dirt, all of which will pass thru a onehalf  $(\frac{1}{2})$  inch ring, together with a sufficient portion of dust of fracture.

#### BOTTOM COURSE.

After the sub-grade has been prepared and has been accepted by the Engineer, the limestone shall be spread evenly over it, the loose limestone shall be six (6) inches thick in the center of the road and six (6) inches thick, four and one half  $(4\frac{1}{2})$  feet from the center of said road. Six (6) inch boards shall be held to the line of the grade 9 feet apart by sutitable stakes These boards shall be used to gauge the thickness of the stone at the outer edge and the thickness at the center shall be gauged by a six (6) inch cubical block. The stone shall be evenly distributed between the six (6) inch cubical blocks and the six (6) inch boards.

#### ROLLING.

The stone shall then be rolled with a heavy farm roller making at leat six tripsover the whole sufface of the road as directed by the Engineer.

#### TOP COURSE.

The top course of limestone screenings and dust shall be spread uniformly three (3) inches thick over the bottom course, Eleven (11) feet wide; care must be taken to preserve the grade and crown also to prevent a wavy surface.

#### ESTIMATES.

At the end of each month, providing the work is progressing satisfactorily, estimates will be made and certified to the County Commissioners by the Engineer. At least 10 per cent will be retained until final settlement.

#### CONTRACT & BOND.

The successful bidder will be required to enter into contract and bond with good and sufficient sureties or with a surety company of recognized standing in an amount equal to the contract price, conditioned for the faithful performance of the work in accordance with plans and specifications and within the time specified.

#### RESERVATIONS.

Witnesseth: That the said contractor agrees for the consideration hereinafter mentiomed, to furnish at his own cost and expense, all the materials and labor necessary in the construction of the Watkins and California Road Extension located in Jerome Township, Union County, Ohio in strict conformity with the plans and specifications hereto attached, which plans and specifications have been duly approved and adopted in accordance with Section 6939, General Code of Ohio and are hereby made a part of this contract. And the said contractor further agrees as follows.

2nd. That he will do the whole work in a thoro and workmanlike manner, according to the directions of the county engineer and to the acceptence of the county commissioners. We hereby respectfully request that the compensation, damages, costs and expenses of said improvement herein petitioned for shall be apportioned and paid for in the menner herein specified in sub-division (4) of Section 6919 of the General Code of Ohio, to-wit:

Not less than 35 per cent nor more than 50 per cent thereof, shall be paid out of the proceed of any levy or levies for road purposes upon the grand duplicate of all the taxable property of the county or out of any funds available therefor. Not less than 25 per cent nor more than 40 per cent thereof shall be paid out of any levy or levies for road purposes upon the grand duplicate of the county to be levied against the township or townships in which said proposed is in whole or in part situated and the balance thereof which shall not ne less than 20 per cent nor more than 35 per cent shall be assessed against and collected from the owners of real estate whose lands are within one mile of either side of said improvement or abutting thereon according to the benefitsaccruingnto said realestate as may be determined upon by said commissioners.

In consideration of the granting of this petition, we hereby waive any and all questions as to the constitutionality of the law under which said improveent is to be made, the jusisdiction of the county commissioners to act thereunder, and any and all notices of subsequent proceedings had under and by virtue of this petition; and we further expressly waive and release any and all claims for damages on account of the construction of said improvement and on account of the acts and proceddings of the county commissioners in reference thereto, and all irregularities, errors and defects in the levying of taxes and assessments to pay the cost of this improvement; and if land be taken for this improvement as provided by law, we further agree to abide by the **u**ward of compensation and to accept as compensation such amount as may be awarded **py**rsuant to the provisions of law.

DAS, on the 26th.day of February,1917, the petition of W.H.Elliott and others was filed with the County Commissioners of Union County,Ohio,under Sections 6906 to 6948,Ohio Laws,Vol.105-6 page 597, praying for the reconstruction of said road by grading,culverting,draining and coating with crushed stone,etc., the following described road:-Commecning withe the Wolford and Maskill Gravel Road intersection on the line bet tween Taylor and Leesburg Townships with the Broadway and Pharisburg Gravel Road; themce in a westerly direction with said Broadway and Pharisburg Gravel Road and the Broadway and Marysville Gravel Road and the Broadway and Newton Gravel Road thru and along the lands of Josephine Newlove,Wm.F.Anderson,John B.McLean,R.H.Willis, and thru the Village of Broadway, and thru and along the lands of J.J.Wattes,P.V.Burson, Sarah Evans,Alonzo Titus, and others to the intersection with the Marysville and Newton Gravel Road in the Village of Raymond; and
