This twentyfourth Day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight Hundred and twentyone I Joshua Ewing of the Township of Lerome in the County of Union and State of Ohio Esq being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be Almighty God for the same do make and publish this as my last Will and Testament in manner and form following Viz I Give and Bequeath to my beloved Wife Margaret Ewing all my wearing Apparel and my best riding Horse ^{best Bed and Bedding} Bridle and saddle without being Inventaried or Appraised, together with one third part of all my Estate Item, I Give and Devise unto my Eight Children Viz Polly Chapman Eliza Mitchell, George Jameson, Joshua Green, Peggy Jameson, Cynthia Annas, Martha Ramsey, Harriet Newel, all that Messuage Tenement and Lot of Land that I Bought of Lucas Sulivant lying on the North side of Darby Creek to be divided between them by my surviving widow, and my Brother James Ewing as soon as conveniently may be after my decease equal in quantity and quality which Division so made under their Hands and seals or under the Hand and seal of either of them shall be good and valid as if I myself had made such Division & specified the same in this my Will and I do hereby give the parts which shall be therein assigned to each of them unto them their Heirs and assigns forever Item, I Give and Bequeath unto my Eight Children ^{two} before mentioned, ~~third~~ parts of my Moveable Estate to be equally to be equally Divided between them Item, my further will is that if my wife Margaret should bear a child or Children at one birth in a reasonable time after my decease that Child or Children shall ^{have} an equal proportion with the rest Item my Will is that my said Children shall Inherit

The several shares of the Land and receive their Legacies my
Sons as they severally Attain to the age of twentyone years and my
Daughters as they severally Attain to the age of Eighteen years or
on the Day of their Marriage and if any one or more of them
Die before they attain to the ages aforesaid and that without
Lawfull Issue then what share given them shall be equally
divided amongst the survivors Provided always and my Will
is that my Wife aforesaid shall have the use of my Whole

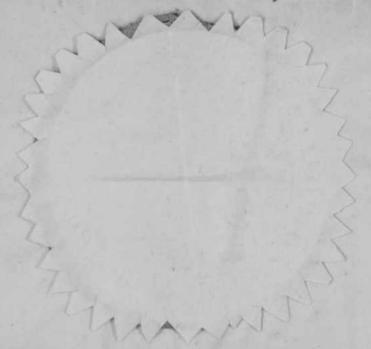


