Sir I would inform you that I have just returned from your brother James. They are all in usual health excepting his son Thomas who is considerably afflicted with pains I think he is the most pitiable object I ever beheld. I expect from the letter I received from you that you are beginning to think there is not much dependence to be put in me I will not trouble you reading excuses as they are so common that they are ~~known as~~ not credited; recollecting the proverb that those who are good at forming apologies are scarcely ever good at any thing else I did not go altogether according to your orders but I have not neglected the business; <sup>altogether</sup> and now the money must come in September not perhaps before the latter end of the month. I expect you thought strange that I did not write to you before this time I wrote two letters to send you and was disappointed in sending them the way I intended and then I did not send them at all I think it is safe now if there is nothing happens that we cannot foresee. This has been the first business of this nature I ever undertook to do and while I keep my senses I think it will be the last I would not take one half the sum and undertake the same thing again. you can if you please call on my father for the money which you gave me and return my obligation to him. Give my respects to your family. I am still permitted to enjoy good health although in the midst of sickness the dysentery has raged here for two or three weeks many have been called ~~off~~ into eternity and many to the verge of the grave one of our students fell a victim to this disease and we had the solemn and melancholy duty to perform on last wednesday of following his mortal remains to the house appointed for all living. Give my respects to all friends and ever believe me yours &c
