

3^d I. Give devise and bequeath to my son Adam Bear five hundred dollars, he having already received three hundred and Sixty six dollars, to be taken out of the above, which will leave a balance due of one hundred and thirty four dollars, and to his heirs and assigns forever

4th I. Give devise and bequeath to the heirs of my daughter Catharine Sams five hundred dollars. Catharine having already received eighty dollars to be taken out of the above which will leave a balance of four hundred and twenty dollars to be divided equal among Washington Sams, John Sams, Peter Sams ^{Phillip Sams} and Matilda Sams, Washington Sams having already received fifty dollars to be taken out of ^{her} portion, and John Sams having already received forty dollars to be taken ^{out} of his share, and to their heirs and assigns forever

5th I. Give devise and bequeath to the heirs of my daughter Sally Cherry five hundred dollars to be divided equal among her children, Elisa Taylor having already received forty dollars to be taken out of her share Rachel McDonald having also received fifty dollars to be taken out of her share, and to their heirs and assigns forever

6th I. Give devise and bequeath to my daughter Polly Steadman five hundred dollars, she having already received four hundred and seventy five dollars of the above which is to be taken out of her share which will leave a balance of twenty five dollars due her and to her heirs and assigns forever

7th I. Give devise and bequeath to the heirs of my daughter Anna Mason one hundred dollars to be divided equal among them, Anna having already received four hundred dollars, which will make in all five hundred dollars, and to their heirs and assigns forever

8th I. Give devise and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Miller five hundred dollars, she having already received three hundred and forty dollars

hundred and sixty dollars, and to her heirs and assigns forever



After the foregoing sums of money are paid as required and
