

any circumstances I admonish my children in all their watter
in life to stand steady and true in all their actions to the true interests

of their country unmoved by power, unswayed by foreign influence or domestic
 faction, and finally upon this solemn occasion I hereby appoint my said son and
 Justin Guaradian of all my four Infants to his care, desiring at the same time that any
