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Last will and Testament of
John Evans deceased

At a special Court of Common Pleas held at the Court House
in the City of Chillicothe for the County of Ross and State of
Ohio on Tuesday the eleventh day of January A.D. 1842 before
the honorable John H. Keith President and James Mc Clintock & Jacob Bouser associates
Judges of said Court. The last will and testament of John Evans dec^d was this day produced
to the Court and proved by the oaths of James T. Claypool, Jacob Pinto and John Woodbridge
the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded, as follows, to wit: In the name of
God amen I John Evans of Union Township in Ross County and State of Ohio, Knowing the uncertainty
of life and being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament
here by revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by me - Item first, my will is that
my executors herein after named shall first pay all my just debts and funeral expences from
my personal estate as soon as convenient. Item second, My eldest daughter now living Minerva
Colegate Evans having been afflicted with disease is thereby less capable of providing for
herself than her sister and my grand children herein after named, I therefore give and be-
queath unto Matthew S. Cook in special trust for the sole and separate use of my said daugh-
ter Minerva C. Thirty shares of the Capital stock of the Bank of Chillicothe. The dividends as
declared thereon to be paid from time to time to my said daughter Minerva C. but in case the
dividends arising from said stock shall be insufficient to provide my said daughter with
servants to take care of her and necessary clothing, then my said friend M. S. Cook may
apply the proceeds of the sale of the whole or any part of said stock to those purposes. - If
any of said stock should remain undisposed of by said Cook at the death of my said daughter
Minerva C. and she should leave any child or children lawfully begotten then said stock
or what shall remain undisposed of by said Cook for the purposes aforesaid shall be absolutely
bequeathed to my said daughter Minerva C. at

my personal estate as soon as convenient. Item second, My eldest daughter now living Minerva Colegate Evans having been afflicted with disease is thereby less capable of providing for herself than her sister and my grand children herein after named, I therefore give and bequeath unto Matthew S Cook in special trust for the sole and separate use of my said daughter Minerva C. Thirty shares of the Capital stock of the Bank of Chillicothe. The dividends as declared thereon to be paid from time to time to my said daughter Minerva C. but in case the dividends arising from said stock shall be insufficient to provide my said daughter with ~~servants~~ to take care of her and necessary clothing, then my said friend M. S. Cook may apply the proceeds of the sale of the whole or any part of said stock to those purposes. — If any of said stock should remain undisposed of by said Cook at the death of my said daughter Minerva C. and she should leave any child or children lawfully begotten then said stock or what shall remain undisposed of by said Cook for the purposes aforesaid shall be absolutely transferred and be vested in such child or children of my said daughter Minerva C. at her death. But should my said daughter die without issue then it is my will that said stock or whatever may remain undisposed of shall be transferred and be vested in my daughter Mary Ann G. now the wife of John Boggs Sr. (and my two grand sons Edward O. and Job E. Stevenson in the following proportions, that is to say my said daughter Mary Ann G. to have one half of said stock and my two aforesaid grand sons to have the other remaining half of said stock to be equally divided between them. But if my said daughter Mary Ann G. should die before her said sister Minerva C. and the said Minerva C. should leave no issue lawfully begotten and Mary Ann G. should leave issue lawfully begotten then the said half of said stock that would have fallen to or been the share of the said Mary Ann G. shall be transferred and be vested in the children or child of the said Mary Ann G. and in case both of my said daughters Minerva C. and Mary Ann G. should die without issue then it is my will that said half of said stock or what remains undisposed of as

her death. But should my said daughter die without issue then it is my will that said
Stock or whatever may remain undisposed of shall be transferred and be vested in my daughter
Mary Ann G. now the wife of John Boggs Esq. (and my two Grand sons Edward O. and Job
E. Stevenson in the following proportions, that is to say my said daughter Mary Ann
G. to have one half of said Stock and my two aforesaid Grand sons to have the other
remaining half of said Stock to be equally divided between them. But if my said daugh-
ter Mary Ann G. should die before her said sister Minerva G. and the said Minerva
G. should leave no issue lawfully begotten and Mary Ann G. should leave issue lawfully begot-
ten then the said half of said Stock that would have fallen to or been the share of the said
Mary Ann G. shall be transferred and be vested in the Children or child of the said Mary Ann
G. and in case both of my said daughters Minerva G. and Mary Ann G. should die without
issue then it is my will that said half of said Stock or what remains undisposed of as
aforesaid shall be assigned and be vested in the heirs of my brother Daniel Evans deceased,
but if any of his heirs should be dead and should have left a Child or Children such
Child or Children shall be entitled to the share of his her or their deceased parent. But if
my said Grand sons Edward O. and Job E. Stevenson should die before my said daughter
Minerva G. and the said Minerva G. should leave no issue lawfully begotten and my said
Grand sons Edward O. and Job E. Stevenson or either of them should leave issue lawfully
begotten then said half of said Stock that would have been the share of the said Edward O.
and Job E. Stevenson had they been living at the time of the death of the said Minerva
G. shall be transferred and be vested in the Children or Child of the said
Edward O. or Job E. Stevenson or both of them as the case may be. And in case
of my said daughter Minerva G. and my Grand sons Edward O. and Job E. Stevenson
aforesaid should all die without issue then it is my will that the said half of said
Stock the share of the said Edward O. and Job E. Stevenson as aforesaid or what remains

undisposed of as aforesaid shall be by the said book assigned and be vested in the heirs of my Brother Robert Evans deceased but if any of his heirs should be dead and should have left a child or Children living such child or children shall be entitled to the share of his her or their deceased parent. Should the Charter of the Bank of Chillicothe not be renewed or Extended, then said book the trustee of said funds may and is required to reinvest the amount of stocks or money herein devised or bequeathed to him in trust as aforesaid in other good stock at his discretion which other stock or stocks shall be held on the terms & conditions of the original stock - The said book is to execute a bond to the said Minerva C. conditioned to faithfully execute his trust in such penalty and with such security as the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of said County of Ross may deem sufficient which bond when executed and approved of by said Judges shall be deposited with my executors hereinafter named for safe keeping. The said Court to appoint a trustee in default of the said book acting. - Item third - I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Minerva C. as she is at present unable to ride on horseback the sum of five hundred dollars to be paid unto her immediately after my death by my executors herein after named with this last mentioned sum it is my desire that my said daughter may purchase a small neat carriage horse and harness for her own special use, These two sums to wit the stock aforesaid and the five hundred dollars are by me intended to be in addition to and over and above the one equal third part of the rest and residue of my Estate. Item Seventh. - It is my further will that whatever of household and kitchen furniture farming utensils waggons carriages or live stock and other personally that shall remain about my house & farms (after my said daughter Minerva C. has made out her selection of articles as specified in the fourth Item of this my will) shall be sold by my executors hereinafter named and the proceeds equally divided between my two

said daughters Minerva C. and Mary Ann G. and my two Grandsons Edward O. and Job E. Stevenson my two said grandsons to have one third of said proceeds divided equally between them and my two said daughters Minerva C. and Mary Ann G. is to have the remaining two thirds of said proceeds equally divided between them. In this Item it is not my intention to include notes obligations Mortgages books accounts rents or debts of any kind or Bank Stock or stock of any kind live stock excepted. Item eighth, unto my said daughter Minerva C. and unto her heirs and assigns forever I will and devise 80 acres of land situated in Lawrence County Ohio Elizabeth Township on Hails creek Range 18 Township 2 Section 16 W. N. W. for which I have the patent and unto my daughter Mary Ann G. And unto my two grandsons Edward O. and Job E. Stevenson and unto their heirs and assigns forever I give and devise the other half of the aforesaid quarter section of land herein described and being the southwest quarter of section 20. in Township 2 in Range 20 and containing about 80 1/2 acres. Item Ninth I will and bequeath unto my said daughter Minerva C. and Mary Ann G. and unto my said grandsons Edward O. and Job E. Stevenson the sum of nine thousand dollars to be divided into three equal shares, one third of said last mentioned sum shall be paid by my executors herein after named unto my daughter Minerva C. one third unto my daughter Mary Ann G. and one third unto my two grandsons Edward O. and Job E. recorded shall be as binding and effectual for all intents and purposes as if

Stevenson or the survivor of them and the heirs lawfully begotten of their, or either of their bodies upon the same conditions of the devise already made to them; and the remaining half thereof of the portion of my said daughter that last died shall pass to and be inherited by the children and legal heirs of my deceased Brother Robert Evans, and Daniel Evans in fee simple, and to be divided in equal shares between them in compliance with the laws of the State of Ohio and they, the said children and legal heirs aforesaid and each (of) of them shall inherit their several portions of my said estate hereby given, real and personal or mixed for themselves their heirs and assigns forever. — And in the event of my said two daughters so dying, should both of my said Grandsons also die without leaving an heir or heirs lawfully begotten of their or either of their bodies, then and in that case or event the whole of my estate of which they shall in like manner pass and descend to the children and legal heirs of my two said deceased Brothers Robert Evans and Daniel Evans and to their and each of their heirs and assigns forever. — I hereby further declare it to be my will and intention that in the event of a failure of heirs lawfully begotten of the bodies of my said two daughters and also of my said two Grandsons, that after the death of my said daughters and of my said two Grandsons, the part of my estate of which they have respectively had the use of a part shall descend to and be inherited in fee simple by the children and legal heirs of my two said deceased brothers Robert Evans and Daniel Evans to themselves their heirs and assigns for ever to be divided in equal shares between them agreeable to the law of descents in the State of Ohio Item Eleventh. — And as explanatory of the tenth Item of this my will in making the division therein directed and specified of the rest and residue of my Bank and other effects, my said children or assigns at their death shall take and divide

Item thirteenth It being a primary object to secure my estate to those of my own blood, and to the end that this object may not be defeated but fully ensured, I do hereby enjoin it upon my Executors hereafter to be named to make out and furnish to each Banking or other Corporation in which I may own stock at the time of my death full and accurate lists of the real estate and stocks that shall be set apart to my aforesaid daughters and my aforesaid Grandsons. That is to say the dividends and rent that may accrue on the portion or share of lands & stocks that may be set off by my Executors hereafter named for the use and benefit of my two said Grandsons as herein before provided. But in the event of the three thousand dollars or any part thereof mentioned in this Item and provided for and bequeathed in the ninth Item of this my will being paid in Bank Stock to my said Grandsons Edward C. and Job E. Stevenson or to their lawful Guardian (or) or Guardians to be appointed by the Court of Common Pleas of Ross County then and in that case it is my will that so much of said three thousand dollars as shall be in Bank Stock remain so vested untill they, my said Grandsons arrive to the age of twenty one years old, and that the dividends or profits accruing on said stock in common with the dividends on their other stocks and rents of lands or houses shall be loaned out together with the annual interest on all loans that may be made on interest from time to time as it becomes due, on landed security as aforesaid for the use and benefit of my said Grandsons when they arrive to the age of twenty one years. 

New Method of making Cheese

We have lately seen a method of mak-
ing Cheese, which is worthy of be-
ing tested by experiment. The seat-

tried. The milk is set in the ordi-
ary way every morning, and the curd
separated from the whey, as well as
can be with the hands. The bottom of
an earthen pot ard covered over with
several folds of dry linen or cotton
cloth. By this process the remaining
whey is absorbed, and when the cloth
becomes saturated it is removed & a
dry one put in its stead. In the course
of the day and night this process re-
moves the whey as thoroughly as
it can be done by pressing.—The next
morning the milk is prepared in the
same manner, and curd packed closely
upon the top of that prepared the
day previous, and the same method
pursued in repeating the moisture.
This process is repeated till you have
a cream pot full of cheese. It is then
seem to be a convenient method where
the dairy woman has the milk of two
one or two cows. It works
is an important discovery. If it had
it need not be a very disastrous
failure. It is a very successful method
preserving the cheese from flies and
mice, as it can be perfectly enclosed
from such gentry, and from air and
light. We have seen but one experi-
ment of this kind, and this promise
to be a successful one. The cheese
appeared as free from moisture
as solid as that made by the press—
the labor is much less, and the
afterwards comparatively nothing.

CASE OF McLEOD.

The London Times closes a long ar-

of the opinion which Lord Palmerston was

ment of Justice Cowen having demonst-

the British Government degrades itself to
be guided.
