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I William Cratty having through the great mercy of God and his kind providence arrived at a good old age in the use of my reason and memory for which I trust by the grace of God I am enabled to be thankful do make and ordain and Publish this my last will and Testament

1<sup>st</sup> I will that my Body be decently interred and all necessary expenses paid and as soon there after as possible all my just debts be fully discharged

2<sup>nd</sup> I will to my Beloved wife Sarah all my household and kitchen furniture and personal property (except choses in action) which may be mine at my decease and I further bequeath to her the Sum of three hundred dollars from said debts.

3<sup>rd</sup> To each of My living children I bequeath two hundred dollars except My son Robert and his I have paid as by his receipt will appear

5<sup>th</sup> I bequeath to the American Bible Society for the Spread of the gospel one hundred dollars and to the Board of domestic Missions under the care of General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church one hundred dollars to be expended in the Marion Presbytery now distinguished by the name of the old school Presbytery. To be by them applied to the benevolent objects under their care

6 I devise and bequeath to my wife Sarah our farm south west of Mansville during her natural life its possession and rents and profits and no longer

7<sup>th</sup> Any balance that may remain on hand after paying the above legacies I direct to be paid over to the same persons and in the same proportions as above named including my said wife and excluding the Bible Society and Board of Domestic Missions

8<sup>th</sup> And I further direct and require that if the above sums allowed to my beloved wife should prove insufficient for her full comfort and necessary support she shall be fully maintained to her ease and comfort even at the expense of the proportion of the said legacies above mentioned

9<sup>th</sup> And I direct that any thing which is hereby willed my daughter Jane shall be paid into her own hands and her receipt shall be sufficient therefor

And lastly I authorize and require my executors or such of them as may qualify to complete all real contracts by the making of all necessary deeds as fully and perfectly as I might or could do were I still in life and to sell any lands of which I may die seized and convey the same by the necessary deeds without the expense and delay of an application to court either for power to sell or convey. 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In the matter of the Estate of W<sup>m</sup> Cratty, s<sup>r</sup> Dec<sup>d</sup> } To the Honorable the Court of Common Pleas  
of the County of Union, State of Ohio.

The undersigned to whom was referred the papers and vouchers in the matter of the Estate of W<sup>m</sup> Cratty, s<sup>r</sup> deceased, having examined the papers and vouchers and also taking the annexed testimony respectfully reports, that as to the matter of the Guardianship of said William Cratty, s<sup>r</sup>, there appears to be but very little to be arrived at, there being no papers or vouchers exhibited, in this matter all is mere hearsay. John Cratty states that William Cratty, <sup>(who is now in California)</sup> was the acting Guardian and transacted all matters of business as Guardian and that the papers and vouchers (if there were any) are in his hands, and disclaims all knowledge in what manner the Guardianship was conducted, that as to the matter of the Executorship.

The Inventory and Sale Bill Charges said John Cratty as follows

There appears to be a misunderstanding on the part of the appraisers as to their duty, in appraising the debts due the Estate not easily gotten over, I learn that the indebtedness of E. W. Inskeep, amounting to \$304.00. and the note of N. Wheeler and E. W. Inskeep for \$58.82 were notes given for Lands sold to them, by the deceased in his life time and therefore were liens upon the Lands until paid, It appears by the admission of John Cratty however that E. W. Inskeep has paid the full amount of his individual indebtedness including the interest thereon.

At the time of the appraisement <sup>of these</sup> ~~these~~ notes ~~were~~ there were endorsements thereon amounting in all to \$92.70. Leaving a balance of \$211.30 including the interest that had accrued. It appears also by two receipts and an affidavit in the hands of said John Cratty, that W. C. Lawrence as attorney for W<sup>m</sup> Cratty in his life time and previous to his becoming insane had rec<sup>d</sup> payments to the amt of \$95.00, Receipts dated May 27 & 28, 1845, these would stop the interest accruing up to that time. By a statement of Mr J<sup>r</sup> Cratty said notes were settled in full. Sept 12, 1849, The interest that accrued upon saier notes

would amount to the sum of \$96.03 1/2, making the whole

Depositions of Witnesses taken in the Examination of the accounts of William & John Cratty as Guardians of William Cratty sen. and the accounts of John Cratty as Executor of the Estate of said William Cratty sen deceased in pursuance of an order of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Union, Ohio

William M. Shanagan of the County of Union, Ohio, of lawful age, being first duly sworn by me as hereafter certified, deposes and says

Question, by J<sup>d</sup> Cratty, State what you know in relation to the matter of keeping William Cratty sen deceased, & what was it worth <sup>per week</sup> to keep him and how long he was kept,

Answer, I lived a close neighbor to John Cratty during the time of his keeping said William Cratty sen who was insane. It was a great deal of trouble to take care of him, he not only required constant <sup>watching</sup> during the day but at night also. I watched with him several nights or parts of nights. he would not lay in bed more than an hour or hour and a half. when he would get up. he smoked a great deal, and when he got up would have to smoke, very frequently in a second <sup>or</sup> go after he had his pipe lit. he would let the fire fall out of his pipe and would scatter it over the floor, he was in the habit when he got up he would get all the wood he could and have it all piled on the fire no odds whether there was any need of it or not. He was also in the habit in day light of wanting to go. and Mr Cratty had to go with him or if it was so that John Cratty could not go with him he would start off alone, and he had then to be followed. A part of the time he was able to go on horse back. I knew frequently of his taking a horse and going off, and Mr John Cratty would have to start after him and hunt him up, being gone a day or so at a time. The time that he was kept by John Cratty I think <sup>was</sup> something like two years and a half that is from the time that he first came to his house until his death, however she was not there all the time, ~~I think~~ I can not say what portion of the time he was absent. It was only a small portion of his time that he was absent. It is a difficult matter for me to say what it

was worth to keep him. Had it been an ordinary case it would not have been so difficult. I should not have been willing to have kept him for less than a dollar a day the year round, I think it was worth that amount, If I was to undertake to state the real value of keeping him I would not put it under that amount,

Question by Master. Was Mrs Cratty also kept by John Cratty, if so. what length of time was it, and what was the keeping of her worth or do you include her keeping with that of The Old Gentleman,

Answer. She was kept by John Cratty some time, she came there with the Old Gentleman, and staid until her death. I think she lived just about a year. I did not include the keeping of her with that of the Old Gentleman, She was old and enfeebled and was not able to do much more than what she done for herself & was of no service to the family she was subject to brashes of sickness from which she would be unable to do any thing for several days at a time. I think her boarding washing &c included would be worth a dollar and a half a week,

Question by Mr Cratty, Did you include funeral Expenses in the above statements,

Answer I did not. I was not thinking of the funeral expenses, I had no reference to the funeral expenses of either,

Question by same, Do you know the amount of the funeral Expenses

Answer I do not, I think that about twenty five dollars would cover the funeral expenses of both, W<sup>m</sup>. M. Flanagan

Also Rosanna Lawrence of Union County aforesaid of Lawful age, being first duly sworn as hereafter certified, deposes as follows:

Question. by John Cratty. State what you know in relation to the matter of keeping William Cratty sen<sup>r</sup> deceased. How long was he kept by John Cratty, and what was it worth per week to keep him

Answer, I could not say from my personal knowledge how long he was kept by his son, from my own knowledge and from Information derived from others. I think it was worth a dollar a day to keep ~~and~~ take care of him from the time of <sup>his</sup> being taken insane

until the day of his death, He was sometime at my house, and was very troublesome whilst there, by being up at nights building large fires in the house and carrying about brands of fire in his hands, and in a number of other ways. He was at my house I would think as much as four months. I believe that John Cratty had the care and keeping of him two years and seven months, inclusive of the four months above stated. I think that Mrs Cratty was at the house of John Cratty about one year, during the time above stated, and until her death, I suppose it would be worth in the neighborhood of a dollar and a half a week to board her including washing &c.

Rosannah Lawrence

Also William Porter of Union County, aforesaid, and of Lawful age, being first duly sworn, as hereafter certified, deposes as follows.

Question, by John Cratty, State what you know in relation to the matter of keeping William Cratty, sw. How long did John Cratty have the care and keeping of him and what was it worth per week or day?

Answer, As to the length of time I am not certain. It might have been three years probably not so much, it was between two and three years. My impression is that he was in sane all the time that he was in the care of John Cratty until his death, sometimes worse than others, at times rather furious and violent, at others he would have very little to say, ~~at~~ would appear rather crabbed, had an inclination to run away or go off. I considered him a great deal of trouble, I have been there when he appeared inclined to be up as much at night as in day light putting on great fires &c, I never have seen him so furiously insane as to consider him dangerous, I think a dollar a day would not have been too much to pay for his care & keeping. Mrs Cratty went to her sons at the same time with the Old Settlers. Boarding and washing &c for her was worth I suppose a dollar and a half per week.




