



Banks, if the trustee thinks it may be done without inconvenience to my estate he may give up the interest of the one so dying to be divided as above directed, or if the estate cannot be divided, then one half the profits to be paid over to those who would be entitled on a final division. 11th Having some years past purchased from Lucian Minor & others trustees of my sisters F. G. Trueheart her title to one thousand acres of land in Harrison Va for about 150 dollars. now in the sale of the said thousand acres of land after reimbursing my estate the cost of said land with interest and all expenses attending the same. The ballance if any I wish to go to my sister F. G. Trueheart if living, if not to her children as above directed. 12th On a division of my negroes or if it should be necessary to sell them I wish Cuty and Rosetta with two of the youngest children of each, and Ned and Matt to have the privilege of choosing their masters and in order to facilitate the object 10 p<sup>ts</sup> on their value may be deducted, and the same added to the amount paid for either that may become chargeable, and in the division of the other I wish their comfort and happiness to be consulted as far as possible without

or sale of the others I wish their comfort and happiness to be consulted as far as possible without serious detriment to my estate. 13<sup>th</sup> I appoint my brother William Overton Executor of this will and trustee for all the trusts herein above made with a request that he shall not be required by the Court to give security - and wishing that there shall be no appraisement of my Estate, an inventory being sufficient. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighteenth day of January 1845 Elizabeth Overton <sup>decd.</sup> Codicil to the above will. I wish my niece Elizabeth to be entirely excluded from any participation in the distribution of my estate and the part designed for her given to my niece Susan Burnley her sister. Elizabeth Overton. A paper writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Elizabeth Overton decd. with a Codicil thereto was this day exhibited to the Court in order to be proved, and there being no subscribing witness to the said paper writing or Codicil, George Waldrop & James H. Jennings were sworn and stated on oath that they were well acquainted with the hand writing of the said Elizabeth Overton that they have seen her write and that they believed the said paper writing and Codicil thereto as well the body thereof as the signatures to the said paper writing & Codicil to be written by the hand of the said Elizabeth Overton decd., which the Court received as due proof of the proper execution of the said paper writing & Codicil thereto, and doth order the said paper writing & Codicil to be recorded as the true last will and testament thereto of the said Elizabeth Overton deceased. And on the motion of William Overton the Executor named in the last will and testament of Elizabeth Overton decd., who made oath according to law, and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of thirty thousand dollars conditioned as the law requires, a certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat of said will with the Codicil thereto in due form, he being permitted to qualify without giving security according to the terms or request of said will Teste, John Hunter C.
