

Bartlet G. Robinson being first duly sworn upon  
his oath deposes & says that he was pres-  
ent at the house of the said John McCawley  
at the time of the execution of his last will  
and testament - he was requested by said  
deceased to be present and sign his will  
as an attesting witness - Witness heard  
the said will was right, after it had  
been read in his hearing - He made his  
mark to said will, in his name, in the pres-  
ence of witness and another subscribing  
witness - Said will was executed at the  
residence of said John McCawley in said  
Union County, on or about the 18<sup>th</sup> day  
of April 1845, and the paper now pre-  
served is the same will. Witness,  
and Cornelius Firth, at the request of  
the testator, and in his presence &  
the presence of each other, signed  
said will as attesting witnesses.

The testator, at that time, was about  
seventy eight years of age, - he was  
at that time of sound mind and mem-  
ory, and was free from restraint of  
any kind.

Gross examined. How long had deceased been  
confined at his last sickness, and how  
long did he live after the signing of said will?

Answer. — The Testator was taken sick on Wednesday, and the will was made on Friday. I do not know what length of time elapsed between the time of signing the will and the death of the testator. Was he able to set up without help at the said signing?

Answer. — I do not know.

Question. — How did you happen there?

Answer. — Called to see the deceased.

Question. Who drew the will

Answer. — Judge Myers — he was just finishing it, when I went in.

Question. Who requested you to sign the will?

Answer. — Judge Myers asked the testator whether Bartlet Robinson and Mr. Fish should witness the will, and testator made some kind of a faint — witness thinks he said "yes." — Testator was lying in bed at the time.

Defendant further says the will had all been written except the signatures, when he went into the room where testator was lying. — Judge Myers, Cornelius Fish, and Asa Robinson were the only persons in the said room when I went in, except testator.

— Judge Myers suggested to testator that he should sign the will, & he then did so — and it was thereafter that Judge Myers suggested that the witnesses should sign the same.

— Before the witnesses signed testator had laid down upon his back <sup>as witness</sup> when the will was taken to testator to be signed, he asked where the place was at which his mark should be made. Testator's eyes were dim and dim, and witness, therefore, took hold of his hand and guided it in making the mark. The will was read in the hearing of testator before he made his mark. It

was read by Judge Myers — There are several of testator's children who are not named in the will. And further this deponent saith not.

Bartlet G. Robinson

Cornelius Fish, also being duly sworn, deposes and says: — That he was present when Judge Myers commenced writing said will of said John McLawley. Judge Myers wrote the will, at request of the testator. Witness had testator tell Judge Myers a part of what he wanted in the will. Judge Myers asked testator whether he wished for witnesses to the will. Testator said yes, and that he might take two or three persons who were in the house. At the suggestion of Judge Myers and the agent of testator Witherby and Bartlet G. Robinson then signed the will, in the presence of testator and of each other. Witherby was with testator from near 11 o'clock A.M. until ~~near~~ <sup>just before</sup> he between the hours of 12 M. & 1 P.M. — conversed with testator, who said he had told dependents father to send for Judge Myers and Asa Robinson to make his will — had considerable conversation with testator and could discover nothing to induce the belief that testator was not capable of making a will. Witherby then left for ~~about~~ <sup>when</sup> two hours, and returned <sup>just before</sup> the time the writing of the will <sup>was</sup> being commenced. Cross examined. — Said will was not out of the room from the time the writing was commenced, until it was signed by the witnesses and the testator. Witherby was present at the time when a part of the items

in the will were written. The first bequest, to the widow, and that Magalet Hill, and that to Nancy Cooney, and that to Catharine McCloud, were made in presence of witness. The first bequest was suggested by testator. Witness does not know whether the other bequests were suggested first by him, or were suggested by others to him, witness being sometimes out on the porch while the will was being written. While the bequest to Eveline McCloud was being written Judge Myers asked testator what he intended to leave to her, and he replies, "Not one cent." And further this deponent saith not.



Item - I give and devise unto my son Thomas White alias Thomas Warriner all that tract or parcel of lands whereon I now reside containing by estimation 205  $\frac{1}{2}$  acres be the same more or less and purchased by me of Anderson Watkins provided he shall and during <sup>his minority</sup> his guardian shall pay unto Mildred Bottoms each year during her natural life Fifteen Dollars in like manner that it is directed by this will that Isaac White or his


