Sheriff's Office Investigating Domestic Incident
Updated: April 5, 2019

Sheriff Jamie Patton announced today that a suspect has been charged as a result of an investigation into a serious domestic violence incident that occurred on Tuesday, April 2, 2019. Sheriff's Office Detectives have charged Tyson C. Bodey, age 44 of Marysville with one count of felonious assault (a felony of the second degree), one count of kidnapping (a felony of the first degree), and one count of aggravated burglary (a felony of the first degree). Bodey is alleged to have assaulted a female victim at a residence in the 23000 block of Woodstock Road and then allegedly forced her into a vehicle and drove her to the Columbus area. Additional assaults are alleged to have occurred in the Columbus area while the female was being kept against her will in a 2018 Ford Fusion. Bodey's vehicle was stopped near the intersection of Morse Road and Chesford Road in Columbus and he was taken into custody by Franklin County Deputies. The victim was transported to Riverside Methodist Hospital for treatment of significant injuries and she has been released.

The Franklin County Sheriff's Office, Columbus Police Department, and the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation assisted with the investigation. Bodey is being held at the Tri County Regional Jail and is scheduled for arraignment in the Marysville Municipal Court on Monday, April 8, 2019. The incident remains under investigation and the case will be presented to a future Union County Grand Jury.
