SCHOOL SAFETY

With summer quickly coming to an end, it's time to start thinking about kids returning to school. "For several months now, drivers have been traveling the roads and passing schools without the thought of yellow flashing lights or school buses. But now it's time to start thinking about school zones, kids walking, and buses picking up and dropping off kids," says Sheriff Patton.

It's our goal to prevent injuries and deaths of our children in Union County. Here are a few driving tips to help keep kids safe:

- ⇒ Slow down before you enter the school zone.
- ⇒ Wait to accelerate as you leave the school zone. Kids are still walking to and from school and could be outside the school zone.
- ⇒ Always stop for crossing guards holding up stop signs. Sometimes crossing guards can be students, so if they signal for you to stop, do not get upset and honk your horn or try to scare them.
- ⇒ Never pass a vehicle that is stopped in a school zone.

The National Association of State Directors of Pupil Transportation Services (NASDPTS) launched a national study in 2019 with a total of 131,345 school bus drivers in 39 states participating. The one-day tally for school bus violations was 95,494. Unfortunately, between 2011 and 2020, there were 1,009 fatal crashes nationwide involving school buses. Here are a few things to think about when it comes to sharing the road with school buses:

- ⇒ Ohio has laws making it illegal to pass a school bus that is stopped for loading and unloading students. If red lights are flashing and the stop sign is extended on a bus, **YOU MUST STOP.**
- ⇒ School buses use yellow lights to alert motorist that they are slowing down and preparing to stop for the loading and unloading of students.
- ⇒ It is not safe to pass a bus that is flashing yellow lights. Children are unpredictable.
- ⇒ The area 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children. Stop far enough back to allow them space to load and unload the bus safely.
- ⇒ Never pass a bus or another vehicle on the right; it is illegal and could have tragic consequences.

The MCCIT is a group of deputies, detectives, and sergeants from the Union County Sheriff's Office, Hardin County Sheriff's Office, Logan County Sheriff's Office, and Champaign County Sheriff's Office. The purpose of the MCCIT is to provide mutual aid to the counties in our group to investigate serious injury vehicle crashes, fatal vehicle crashes, and airplane crashes.

Upon the MCCIT being activated by dispatch, a typical crash scene requires four deputies to respond to the scene of the requesting county. The purpose of the team is to attempt to determine how a crash unfolded. Through specialized training, equipment, and resources the investigators use scientific techniques and mathematical equations to better understand how a crash happened. Deputies on the crash team other trainings receive among following: Basic Crash Investigations (40 hours), Intermediate Crash Investigation (40 hours), Technical Crash Investigation (80 hours), Crash Reconstruction (80 hours), Crash Data Recorder Technician (32 hours), Crash Data Recorder Analyst (40 hours). Heavu Vehicle and Semi Reconstruction (40 hours), Pedestrian and Bicycle Reconstruction (40 hours), among many other possibilities.

Among the tools used by the MCCIT is a Trimble S3 Total Station. Trimble SX10 Scanner/Total Station, Drones, and Event Data Recorders (EDR). The Trimble S3, Trimble SX10, and Drones are used to create scale diagrams to aid in crash reconstruction. The Event Data Recorder is used to download information from the vehicle involved. The information contained in an EDR includes Vehicle Speed, Throttle Percentage, Breaking Percentage, Steering Input, Engine RPM, Seat Belt Usage, etc.

In 2022, MCCIT investigated 29 crashes within the four participating counties. As a result of the 29 crashes, there were 22 fatalities. 10 of the crashes, and 6 of the fatalities occurred inside of Union County.







The Support Services Division is responsible for community education and all of its activities, including school resource officers (SRO)/ Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE), crime prevention programs, project lifesaver, drug take back, community events and festivals, and UCSO fundraisers.





In May, the Union County Sheriff's Office, Ohio State Highway Patrol, Union Township Fire Department, Union County Health Department, Safe and Sound Coalition, Kirby's Towing, MedFlight, and the Fairbanks High School Administrations presented a mock crash to demonstrate the extreme dangers of distracted driving and driving under the influence of drugs/alcohol. Student actors were staged in a car accident which resulted in a fatality due to a drunk driver with multiple first responders working the scene.

Lieutenant Bob Roberts graduated from the Police Executive Leadership College (PELC) Class #85. PELC students attend class one week each month for three months. During PELC, students are required to complete four writing assignments, six classroom presentations, read six books and twelve articles. A two-page journal is required after each class detailing what the student learned from that day. The journal also includes an explanation of how what they learned would be implemented at their agency. The class covers topics such as Executive Role and Excellence in Management; Risk Management; Community; Leadership and Policing; Effective Written Communication; Ethics and Principles Based Leadership; Legal Leadership; Media Management; and Conflict Management.



Captain Mike Justice graduated from the 10th Public Safety Leadership Academy alongside 30 fellow law enforcement leaders from various agencies throughout Ohio. After 11 weeks of accredited, college-level training through the Ohio State University John Glenn College of Public Affairs, the graduates learned skills necessary to manage any division within a law enforcement agency and demonstrate preparedness to take on additional leadership responsibilities.

The graduates had the opportunity to meet with executive law enforcement officials to learn from their experiences and discuss how to build positive relations with the communities they serve. They also attended classes on dealing with future challenges in the field, overcoming the unique mental stressors of possible violence on the job, and ensuring best practices for law enforcement managers to recruit and retain the next generation of law enforcement professionals.


