During PELC, students are required to complete four writing assignments, six classroom presentations, read six books and twelve articles. The journal also had to include an explanation on how he or she would implement what they learned back at their agency. The class covered

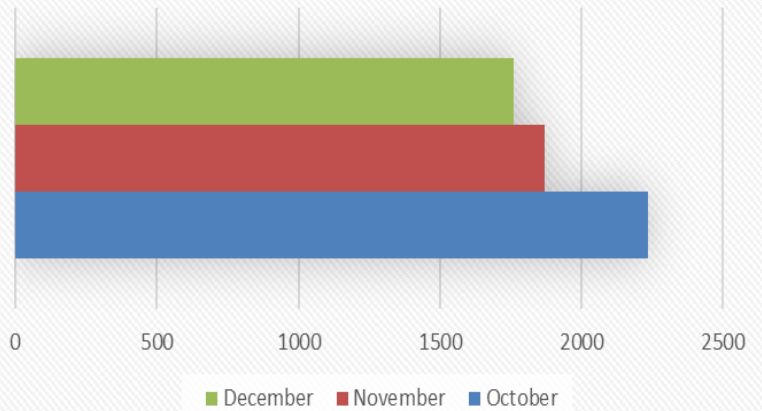

2019 Citizens Academy Class 007

On December 9, 2019, ten members of the community graduated from the Union County Citizens Academy.

The goal of Citizens Academy is to improve the understanding of the operations and the statutory requirements of the Office of the Sheriff. Throughout the ten week course, class members learn the history of the Sheriff's Office; the role of the Communications Division; the requirements to be a Deputy Sheriff, Public Safety Officer, and a K9 unit; They learned the different areas of the Support Services Division, including Community Education, Crime Prevention, Dog Warden, Special Deputies and VIPS, and Community Outreach Programs; Class members met with Investigations to learn the role of a Detective, Criminal Investigator, a Crime Scene Technician, and the responsibility of a Narcotics Detective; They learned about the specialized equipment units of UCSO; Detective Joel Thorpe and Detective Shawn Golden talked about Fraud and Domestic Violence as well as the role of a Crisis Negotiator; Completing the Academy, Dir. Betsy Spain provided information on the responsibility of Court Services Division as well as the tasks of our Deputies within the Court Services Division. The final week of class, members took a tour of the Tri-County Regional Jail

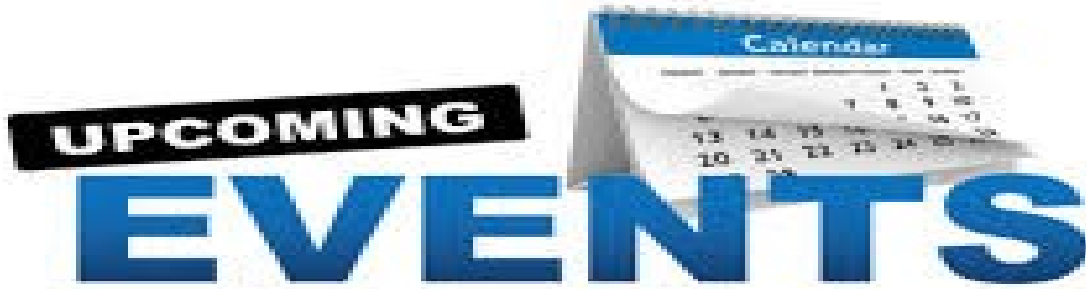
