CITIZENS ACADEMY

Keep your calendars open, the Union County Sheriff's Office is planning to hold our Citizens Academy, dates will come out soon.

This is a great opportunity for members of the Sheriff's Office staff to work with our community, in hopes, to build a strong relationship with those we serve and protect. The Citizen's Academy is made up of community members that take part in a 12-week program, meeting on Monday nights. This program helps participants gain a better understanding of the day-to-day responsibilities of the Sheriff's Office.

Participants will learn about the history and our mission; the role of our Dispatchers, with a tour of our 9-1-1 Communications Center; the role and responsibilities of our Deputy Sheriffs and the Patrol Division, including crisis intervention, domestic violence, traffic stops, and accident investigations. They learn about our Support Services Division, the various services they provide to our community, such as our Project Lifesaver Program, Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) just to name a few. Participants will spend time at the UCSO Range facility to learn about the Special Response Team and how the DRONE assists the Sheriff's Office. There will be a tour of the Investigations Division while learning about the drugs in our community, crime scene investigation, interview & interrogation, photography, fingerprinting, DNA analysis, and identity theft. During the final weeks of class, participants will learn the responsibilities of our Court Services Division, court security, sex offender registry, background checks, concealed carry permits, and prisoner transports; along with a tour of the Tri-County Regional Jail. Before the end of the 12-week program our participants will have the opportunity to ride along with a patrol Deputy.

2nd Quarter Significant PATROL Events

- On April 23rd, a Jerome/Millcreek PSO and other deputies responded to a fatal vehicle crash in Jerome Township. A 2004 gold Ford Taurus was traveling northbound on US 42. The Ford Taurus struck two other vehicles that were traveling southbound, before coming to rest in the ditch line of US 42.
- On April 30th, deputies and a Jerome/Millcreek PSO responded to a fatal vehicle crash in Jerome Township. A 2021 Harley Davidson motorcycle was traveling east on Industrial Parkway when it lost control at the round-a-bout.
- On April 30th, deputies responded to the 300 block of Wesley Avenue to assist the Plain City Police Department with an active domestic violence complaint. Upon arrival of law enforcement, the male subject began shooting at the responding units. After an exchange of gunfire, the male subject received medical aide and was later arrested.
- On April 30th, deputies responded to Memorial Hospital of Union County after receiving a call regarding a stabbing victim seeking medical assistance. The investigation revealed that the stabbing took place within the Village of Richwood. Deputies, detectives and members of the Union County SRT team assisted the Richwood Police Department in the investigation and arrest of one subject.
- On May 2nd, deputies responded to a fatal vehicle crash in Allen Township. A 2017 white Ford F-250 was traveling northwest on Maple Ridge Road when it struck a pedestrian walking along the side of the roadway. The vehicle then fled the scene and was later located by deputies.
- On May 11th, deputies responded to a call in Leesburg Township involving a female subject who wanted to report that while picking up her minor child the father fired a shotgun towards her vehicle. Deputies were able to defuse the situation and arrest the male subject without incident.
- On May 17th, deputies responded to a call in Jerome Township involving a subject who reportedly wanted to commit “suicide by cop” on Warner Road. Deputies were assisted by the Union County Sheriff’s Office Crisis Negotiators who were able to get the male subject to surrender. The male subject was later transported to the Memorial Hospital of Union County for mental health treatment.

2nd Quarter Significant PATROL Events cont...

- On May 30th, deputies responded to the 1500 block of Meadowlark Lane to assist the Marysville Police Department who was dispatched to call of a man with a gun. After failing to follow verbal commands by the deputy, the subject was fatally shot by the responding deputy.
- On June 3rd, deputies responded to a residence in Allen Township on State Route 245 where a 2-year-old was found unresponsive in a pond. Deputies administered CPR prior to medics arriving on the scene. The 2-year-old survived without any lasting injuries.
- On June 20th, deputies responded to a fatal vehicle crash in Leesburg Township. A 2003 red Honda Accord was traveling west on State Route 37 when it struck a 2010 John Deere utility vehicle

On May 12th, the Union County Sheriff's Office paid tribute to the peace officers who gave their lives serving Union County.

Their loyalty, courage and sacrifice will never be forgotten.







Public Safety Officers are Deputies that are cross trained to be an emergency medical technician and firefighter. These Deputies patrol the county roads in four-wheel drive vehicles loaded with medical gear and firefighting equipment. This allows the PSO to respond to a scene of any type and be trained to handle the situation as a first responder until additional emergency help arrives. UCSO currently has six Public Safety Officers patrolling the townships of Jerome, Millcreek, Darby, Paris, and Taylor.

The PSO also makes a determined effort to get to know the people of their township. This allows residents to feel a sense of ownership of the Deputies patrolling their community. This helps break down walls and bridge gaps between citizens and Deputies.




