The Project Lifesaver program is designed to work with those who are in the wandering stages of their disease. E.g. Alzheimer's, Dementia, Autism, Down syndrome

How Project Lifesaver Works

- Enroll your loved one with the Union County Sheriff's Office by Calling Sergeant Shawn Dyer at (937) 645-4110
- A Deputy will apply a personalized wristband.
- Caregiver reports Loved one missing.
- Specially trained responders report to the wanderer's area and start searching with the mobile locater tracking system.
- Bring your loved one home.



Approximately 60% of individuals with Alzheimer's will wander.



A Union County Deputy will visit every 60 days to inspect the wristband to make sure it is working properly.



The search times for certified Project Lifesaver agencies have been reduced from hours, potentially days, down to minutes. Recovery times for Project Lifesaver agencies average 30 minutes, which is 95% less time than standard operations without Project Lifesaver.
